IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 1st November, 1919.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Intermediate Examination as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application, may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Saturday, the 22nd November, 1919, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.).

Fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must on the first day of the examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £80, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any Victorian returned sailor or soldier. Provided their certificate of discharge is furnished with their application, they may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £156 a year.

SHIRE OF DONCASTER.

MEDICAL ACT 1915, PART II, AND THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Medical Act 1915, Part II*, hereby make the following Regulations, viz.:—

- I. In lieu of the preliminary examination referred to in Regulations II. and III. of the Regulations made by the Dental Board of Victoria on the twenty-first day of September, 1917, and approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-third day of April, 1918, the Dental Board of Victoria may accept from any person who has served abroad with His Majesty's Forces during the war or has been absent from Australia upon war services undertaken on behalf of His Majesty's Government, a certificate of his having matriculated in the University of Melbourne.
- II. Generally the Dental Board of Victoria may on the advice of the Faculty of Dentistry of the University of Melbourne, in the case of students who have been engaged on military duties or other duties arising directly out of the war, make provision concerning compulsory subjects of preliminary examinations and concerning courses and examinations at its discretion.

These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of March, 1919.

## REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

*Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ years (\_\_\_\_\_ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

*Engineering Surveys.*

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of Instruments.*

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the

other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2630) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2931).

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality shire of Cranbourne doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2630) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2931), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of the *Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.



(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

- (1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—
  - (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
  - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
  - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
  - (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
  - (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
  - (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole shire the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

**REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.**

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the shire of Cranbourne of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

 The ballot-paper so marked by or for the voter must be dropped by you into the ballot-box.  
 You must not take this ballot-paper out of the polling booth.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.  
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender.

3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.

4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1919, and the second payment covering all bark stripped by 31st December, 1920, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.

5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.

9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

**BOROUGH OF GEELONG WEST.**  
By-Law No. 33.

A By-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for regulating and restraining the storage of petroleum or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids, inflammable cinematograph films, and carbide, and the erection and construction of buildings connected therewith.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. Every person who shall erect, construct, alter or use any building for the storage of more than two hundred and fifty gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine or other volatile or inflammable fluids, shall comply with the following requirements:—

1. The site of all such buildings shall be first approved of by the Council for that purpose or by some officer authorized in that behalf by the Council.
2. The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick or stone set in cement mortar or of cement concrete or reinforced concrete not more than sixteen feet in height.
3. The lower floor of such building shall be at least four feet below the grade of the adjoining street, and shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible materials.
4. The interior capacity of any such buildings shall exceed by at least twenty-five per centum the total capacity of the tanks or other receptacles placed therein.
5. All rooms used for the storage of petroleum or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other similar volatile or inflammable fluids, or for the storage of inflammable cinematograph films or carbide shall have walls, floors and ceilings constructed of fire-resisting materials, and be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Council. Doors unless opening directly to the outer air shall be tin clad or iron cased.

2. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than two hundred and fifty gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum (including kerosene) turpentine or other volatile or inflammable fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks, other than in underground tanks not exceeding five hundred and thirty-five gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose or by some officer authorized in that behalf by the Council.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding five hundred and thirty-five gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge and be placed not less than two feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over tank to the level of the ground or floor, as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the surveyor. Filling pipes may be placed where the surveyor approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.

(3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground, shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than two feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank, but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door, either sliding or opening inward made of incombustible material and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall, and complete plans and specifications for the construction of such tanks shall be submitted to and approved by the Council or by some officer authorized in that behalf by the Council before permission for their uses shall be granted.

3. All such buildings when erected, constructed, altered, or used shall conform to the provisions of the Council's Building By-laws and Regulations in so far as they apply.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of the Borough of Geelong West. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## BY-LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND DUTIES OF OFFICIALS AND STAFF OF GIPPSLAND HOSPITAL.

### BY-LAWS OF THE GIPPSLAND HOSPITAL.

1. All By-laws made prior to the date of making these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The objects of the Hospital are to afford medical and surgical aid gratuitously to sick persons in destitute circumstances, and to others upon such terms of payment as shall from time to time be determined by the Board of Management.

#### *Life Governors and Nominated Life Governors:*

3. Every personal contributor of not less than Twenty pounds (£20) in one sum shall be entitled to be a Life Governor. Every person nominated for that purpose by any formally constituted and organized company, society, or club, subscribing at the same time from its funds a sum of not less than Twenty pounds to the funds of the Hospital, and promoters of special efforts in aid of the Hospital's funds may nominate one Life Governor, provided that the sum raised shall not be less than £25, and every person who shall collect on behalf of the Hospital for two successive years a sum of not less than Twenty-five pounds (£25) each year shall be entitled to be a Nominated Life Governor, and to exercise the privileges granted by law to a contributor of not less than Twenty pounds (£20). Life Governors and Hon. Life Governors previous to incorporation shall be considered Life Governors and Hon. Life Governors of the incorporated institution.

#### *Executors to be Entitled to Vote.*

The executor, or first-named executor, in any will under which the sum of not less than Ten pounds (£10) shall have been paid to the Hospital, shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors held during the twelve months succeeding such payment.

#### *Privileges of Contributors.*

4. Every Life Governor and Nominated Life Governor shall be entitled to two patients' tickets annually; every executor, as named in By-law 3, shall be entitled to two patients' tickets for one year, and every contributor of One pound (£1) shall be entitled in the year in which such One pound has been contributed by him to two patients' tickets, and two additional tickets for each additional pound contributed by him in that year. All such tickets to be available for one year only from date of issue. Every member of the Committee of Management shall during his continuance in office be entitled to as many patients' tickets as he may require.

#### *Privileges of Association.*

5. Corporations, joint-stock companies, banks, and other associations and co-operative bodies, subscribing in their corporate capacity a sum of not less than £3 3s. in any one year, may nominate one of their members as a representative, who shall be entitled to the privileges of an annual contributor.

#### *Committee of Management.*

6. The Hospital shall be governed by a Committee of Management to consist of twelve (12) contributors (inclusive of the president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer hereinafter mentioned) elected in accordance with the Act. The Committee shall elect from among themselves a President, two Vice-Presidents, and Honorary Treasurer annually. Life Governors, Nominated Life Governors, and annual contributors of not less than One pound (£1) shall be eligible for election as members of Committee upon being nominated seven (7) clear days prior to the time fixed for the election. The nomination paper must be signed by the proposer and seconder, and by the candidate, and a list of such nominations shall be advertised in the local newspapers, and also open for inspection at the Secretary's office to all persons qualified to vote at such elections.

#### *Retirement of Committeemen.*

7. On the last Thursday in July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the Committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

#### *Vacancies.*

8. If any member of the Committee or of the Honorary Medical Staff or any auditor dies or resigns by letter under his hand addressed to the President of the Hospital, or becomes insolvent or compounds with his creditors, or is convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or is absent without permission of the Committee for four consecutive meetings from the Committee, and from four consecutive meetings from the Visiting Committee, his office shall become vacant.

9. Where any vacancy shall occur in the office of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, or Auditor, or in the Honorary Medical Staff or in the Committee of Management, the Committee of Management or the remaining members thereof shall temporarily appoint thereto some qualified person until the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* are required to go out of office.

#### *Duties of Committee of Management.*

10. The Committee of Management shall direct the business of the Hospital, shall frame regulations (subject to these By-laws) for its control, shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on its behalf, and to appoint and discharge all paid officials. The Committee shall meet every month on such days as they shall appoint, seven members to form a quorum. In the event of a quorum not being present within half-an-hour of the appointed time of such meeting, it shall be in the power of the members present, or if there be no members present, of the Secretary, to adjourn such meeting to any day not exceeding seven days from the date of such adjournment. Provided always in cases of necessity the President may alter the date of meeting.

#### *Who shall Preside.*

11. The President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall preside at all meetings of the Committee of Management. In the absence of the President and Vice-Presidents the members present shall elect a chairman from among themselves.

#### *Contracts for Supplies or Works.*

12. No member of the Committee of Management or official of the Hospital shall be a contractor for any supplies or works to or for the Hospital, or become a security for any such contractor directly or indirectly.

#### *Treasurer.*

13. All moneys received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer thereof, who shall, with all reasonable despatch, pay in same to the Hospital banking account. Payments shall be made by the Treasurer only upon the orders of the Committee of Management, under the hand of the chairman of the meeting at which such orders shall have been made; such payments to be made by cheque upon the banking account, signed by the Treasurer and chairman of the meeting at which such payments shall have been authorized, and countersigned by the Secretary.

#### *Auditors.*

14. One or more Auditors shall be elected at the annual general meeting of contributors in each year.

#### *Finance Committee.*

15. The Committee shall annually appoint out of their members a sub-committee consisting of the President, Treasurer, three members of the General Committee, and the Visiting Committee for the month, as a Finance Committee, whose duty it will be to supervise all accounts, wages sheets, and examine payments due to trainees, and matters referring to the financial position of the Hospital, prior to the monthly meeting, and to present a report of their recommendations to the Committee.

16. All accounts passed for payment by the General Committee will be paid at the Secretary's office on the day following the monthly meeting, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

#### *Building Committee.*

17. The Committee shall annually appoint out of their members a sub-committee whose duty will be to report upon the condition of the Hospital, buildings, &c., and to recommend what in their opinion is essential for the proper upkeep of the property of the institution.

18. The President shall be an *ex-officio* member of all sub-committees.

#### *Annual Report.*

19. The Committee of Management shall present at the annual meeting of contributors an annual report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with a detailed statement of accounts duly audited, and a schedule of the attendances of each member of Committee at the meetings of the General and Visiting Committees respectively.

#### *Special Meeting.*

20. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management at any properly constituted meeting, or for twelve or more Life Governors, Nominated Life Governors, or annual contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the Secretary to summon a special general meeting of contributors, of which meeting seven clear days' notice shall be given by advertisement in some newspaper published in Sale; the occasion for calling such meeting to be stated in the requisition and in such notice, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting other than that so stated.

#### *Visiting Committee.*

21. The Committee of Management shall be divided into a Visiting Committee, who shall visit the Hospital not less than twice in each week, in such number as may be arranged for the purpose of dealing with the admission and discharge of patients. And such Visiting Committee shall have power to examine and check the Hospital books and records; to engage and discharge servants; and to regulate the internal management of the house under the direction of the Committee of Management; and shall report at each monthly meeting of the said Committee of Management on the general condition of the Hospital, and on such other matters as they think of importance; and subject to their confirmation the Matron shall have power to discharge all household servants of the Hospital.

*Honorary Medical Officers.*

22. The Honorary Medical Officers shall be legally qualified medical practitioners of the State of Victoria, residing at Sale, and shall be elected by the contributors at the annual meeting. They shall have admittance to the Hospital at all times, and shall attend there daily, the rotation of their duty to be regulated by themselves collectively.

23. Any Honorary Medical Officer who, in the opinion of the Committee of Management, has neglected his duty shall be suspended and reported to a special general meeting of contributors convened for the purpose, who shall have power to remove the name of such practitioner from the list of Honorary Medical Officers, or remove such suspension.

*Admission of Patients.*

24. Any applicant for relief producing a patient's admission ticket, then current, indorsed by the recommending contributor, and certificate of fitness for admission by one of the Honorary Medical Officers, shall upon his or her signing the declaration of inability to pay the ordinary charges made by medical practitioners, be received into the Hospital, pending the advent of the Visiting Committee, and the Visiting Committee shall, on their next day of attendance, deal with all such applicants, upon such conditions as they may deem proper, and they shall indorse their decision on each such patient's ticket. Provided that if any applicant seeking relief by virtue of a patient's ticket be under the age of ten years, the declaration on the ticket may be made by his or her parent or guardian. Accidents and other cases of emergency may be received by the Matron at any time without any recommendation or patient's ticket. It shall rest with the Honorary Medical Officer to decide whether an applicant be made an in-patient or an out-patient. Out-patients shall attend at the Hospital for treatment at such times as may be directed. Out-patients must bring their own bottles. A minimum charge of 1s. will be made for all prescriptions.

*Annual Meetings.*

25. The annual general meeting of contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in July in each year. The President for the time being shall be the returning officer, but in the event of him being unable to act the Committee of Management shall appoint one of their number to so act. The returning officer shall ascertain the number of votes recorded for each candidate at such election in the usual manner, and shall in declaring the poll give the number of "postal votes" recorded for each candidate respectively. In the event of there being an equality of votes for any two or more candidates the returning officer shall have a casting vote. The returning officer shall have power to rectify any errors or omissions, and any person claiming to vote whose name does not appear on the certified list, who shall satisfy the returning officer that his name has been left off such certified list in error shall be entitled to receive a ballot-paper.

*Voting Life Governors.*

26. At all general and special meetings of contributors, Life Governors and Nominated Life Governors shall each be entitled to one vote, and if they are also yearly contributors of not less than One pound they shall be entitled to two votes, of Three pounds or over three votes.

*Annual Subscribers.*

27. Annual contributors of One pound shall be entitled to one vote, of Three pounds to two votes, of Five pounds or over to three votes at all general and special meetings held within twelve months of date of payment of such subscription.

*Manner of Voting.*

28. At all general or special meetings votes must be given personally, save and except in the case of elections of the Committee of Management, when votes may be recorded by post as hereinafter mentioned.

*Voting by Post.*

29. Contributors qualified to vote at any election of members of Committee who through ill-health, infirmity, or unavoidable detention have reason to believe that they shall be unable to vote personally at such election, or who shall reside more than three miles from the place appointed for such election, shall be permitted to vote by post in the manner following:—

Each contributor shall make timely application to the Secretary of the Hospital for a ballot-paper, when making such application shall state upon which of the above grounds he makes such claims, and shall at the same time forward a stamped envelope addressed to himself for the transmission of the ballot-paper.

If the said requirements be complied with the Hospital Secretary shall place a number on the addressed envelope corresponding to the contributor's number on the official list of voters, and shall enclose in such envelope one or more ballot-papers as according to such voters' list he is entitled to, together with an addressed envelope indorsed "Postal Ballot-paper," and addressed to the Secretary of the Gippsland Hospital, Sale.

The Secretary shall hand to the Returning Officer unopened all such envelopes indorsed "Postal Ballot-paper" received by him before 6 p.m. on the date of the election, together with a list of names and addresses of persons to whom he sent ballot-papers, showing the number forwarded to each contributor and stating the dates upon which such ballot-papers were posted.

He shall write opposite each name on such list of votes by post a number corresponding to the number appearing in the special list of contributors.

No contributor to whom a ballot-paper shall have been posted shall be permitted to vote personally at such election, unless he first delivers to the Returning Officer the ballot-paper or papers posted to him.

At the close of the poll the Returning Officer shall without opening same compare the numbers on the addressed envelopes marked "Postal Ballot-paper" with the number appearing on the list of voters by post handed to him by the Secretary.

The Returning Officer shall then open each envelope marked "Postal Ballot-paper," and, without counting the votes, shall see that the number of ballot-papers enclosed in such envelopes correspond with the number of ballot-papers to which the contributor is entitled, according to the Secretary's list.

The Returning Officer shall place such postal ballot-papers in a separate box and attach all the envelopes marked "Postal Ballot-papers" together.

*Seal.*

30. The corporate seal of the institution shall be kept in the safe of the Hospital in the custody of the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the General Committee at a meeting at which a quorum shall have been present, and shall be affixed by the President or Chairman for the time being.

*Standing Orders.*

31. The order of business of an Ordinary Meeting of Committee shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Committee at any particular meeting hereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect. In cases not provided for herein, recourse shall be had to the Standing Orders of Municipal Council of Sale, in so far as they are applicable:—

1. Minutes.
2. Outward correspondence, and dealing therewith by resolution.
3. Inward correspondence, and considering and ordering thereon.
4. Presentation of reports and dealing therewith.
5. Requisitions.
6. Finance Committee's report.
7. Orders of the day.
8. Ordinary business.
9. Notices of motion.

1. Urgent business introduced by a member may be taken at any stage of the proceedings upon the rising of the members present in support thereof.

*Order of Debate.*

2. A member shall rise and address the chairman in making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion, and shall not be interrupted unless on a point of order.

*Nature of Motion to be Stated.*

3. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Committee thereon.

*Mover of Motion.*

4. A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

*Questions how Declared.*

5. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Committee, put question—first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes. At all meetings of the Committee the Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and also a casting vote, whenever numbers are equal.

*Second or Subsequent Amendment.*

6. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

*Right of Mover of Motion to Reply.*

7. The mover of every original proposition, but not of an amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.***Discipline.*

1. The Rules and Regulations of the Hospital shall be strictly observed, and all orders of the Honorary Medical Officers, Visiting Committee, or Matron, are to be promptly obeyed by all inmates.

*Admission and Supervision.*

2. Each patient, at time of admission, shall be placed under the care of one of the Honorary Medical Officers, and shall while in the Hospital continue under the care of such Medical Officer; the distribution of patients to be by rotation, at such intervals as the majority of the Honorary Medical Officers shall decide. An out-patient, however, becoming an in-patient shall continue under the care of the Honorary Medical Officer by

whom he was treated when an out-patient. In the event of a Medical Officer being unable to his patient and not having made an arrangement with one of the other Medical Officers for the necessary professional attendance of such patient, the matron shall call the attention of the other Medical Officers to the case. The Medical Officer for the week may, if he so desire, allow any of the Medical Officers the use of a bed, if required.

3. Patients shall be discharged on the certificate of the Honorary Medical Officer attending each respectively, but patients guilty of gross misconduct may be summarily dismissed by any Honorary Medical Officer or by the Visiting Committee, the cause of such dismissal to be entered in the Visiting Committee's reports, and all patients before leaving shall be required to sign a "Discharge Book" to be kept for the purpose, stating their satisfaction or otherwise with the treatment they have received. If any such patients are not able to write their names their mark shall be witnessed by two inmates or officers of the Hospital. Provided that if any patient shall have been an inmate of the Hospital for a period of six continuous months it shall be competent for the Committee of Management to direct that a consultation of all the Honorary Medical Officers of the Hospital be called in reference to such patient's case, and if the majority of such Medical Officers present at such consultation shall be of opinion that such patient ought to be discharged, the Committee of Management may direct that such patient be discharged accordingly.

#### *Discharges Complaints.*

4. Patients having a complaint to make may communicate it to one of the Honorary Medical Officers or to the Visiting Committee, who shall thereupon record the same in writing. The Visiting Committee shall have power to inquire into and take action in the matter of the said complaint, or to refer the same to the next meeting of the Committee of Management.

#### *Ineligible and Restricted Cases.*

5. No female for the purpose of confinement, and no insane or alcoholic person, shall be admitted. No person suffering from any contagious disease shall be admitted to the main building, but cases of diphtheria and erysipelas may be admitted on the premises at the discretion of the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case, provided that such cases can be properly isolated.

#### *Visitors.*

6. Visitors will be permitted to see patients on Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m.; and on special occasions on the written order of the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the patient to be visited, or at the discretion of the Matron.

7. Visitors will not be allowed to enter any ward, or give to or leave with any patient food, medicine, fruit, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, without the permission of the Matron; or to interfere with any servant of the Hospital, or disturb the patients, and every visitor shall retire when requested by any officer of the institution.

#### *Gratuities.*

8. No paid official of the Hospital shall accept a gratuity from any patient under pain of dismissal.

#### *Matron.*

9. (i) The Matron shall have charge of the medicines, surgical instruments, and all stores belonging to the Hospital, and she shall make up and dispense, with due attention, all medicines for the sick as prescribed by the Medical Officers. (Providing, however, if she has the necessary qualifications.)

(ii) She shall take care that every medicine dispensed shall have the name of the patient and the time and manner of using it written in a clear and legible hand affixed to the paper, box, phial, &c., into which it is put, and that the label be renewed when so far defaced as not to be easily read.

(iii) She shall from time to time commit to paper the particulars of such medicines and other articles as may be required for the use of the Hospital, and have the names examined and signed by one or more of the Medical Officers before ordering the required supplies. She shall prepare such quantities of the compound medicines as may be necessary for the practice of the Hospital, and insert in the "Consumption Account" the precise quantity of spirits used in making tinctures, and also the quantities of spirits used under the direction of the Medical Officers for patients' use.

(iv) She shall have the superintendence of the sick wards and see the meals of the patients are properly served according to the prescribed dietary, and that all the orders of the Medical Officers are duly carried into effect; the nurses, wardsmen, yardsman, boiler attendant, and other servants being under her, subject also to the directions of the Medical Officers.

(v) She shall live in the Hospital and shall not leave it except on necessary occasions. She shall not be absent for more than two hours in any day between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m., nor more than three hours at any other time, and shall never be absent after 11 o'clock at night without the previous sanction of the President or the Visiting Committee.

(vi) She shall keep a register of the cases treated in the Hospital and also for out-door patients a periodical abstract of which she shall prepare, to be laid before the Committee yearly, embracing the numbers, diseases, and results.

On the admission of patients into the Hospital she shall write the name, age, date of admission, &c., on a card to be suspended over the beds. She shall keep a book in which she shall insert the name of every patient for whom the Medical Officer shall prescribe either wine, spirits, ale, or stout, the name of the Medical Officer who has ordered same, and precise quantity used every day, which book shall be laid before the Committee at their stated meetings, together with a health report of the House.

(vii) She shall keep also such other medical books and papers as the Medical Officer may require for their department, and have charge of the mortuary.

(viii) She shall visit the patients morning and evening to ascertain that the treatment prescribed has been properly carried out, and especially to examine the condition of the wards in respect to their cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation, carefully observing if the nurses or wardsmen have done their duty. And should any complaint be made, or any cause for such exist, in regard to the conduct of the nurses, wardsmen or servants, or the patients themselves, it shall be her duty to report the same at the earliest opportunity to the Visiting Committee.

(ix) She shall keep an exact inventory in duplicate of all the goods belonging to and in the Hospital, and shall examine both as to quantity and quality all supplies received, and enter an account thereof, and also post daily the "Provision Consumption Account" according to the dietary scales of the Committee of Management and the orders of Medical Officers to sick inmates, so as to exhibit the individual and aggregate consumption of provisions and medical comforts, and also apportion the general expenditure under the different heads, as required by the Government, in the quarterly and yearly returns.

(x) She shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of patients, stating the cause of their discharge from the Hospital. She shall, when requested by the patients, procure the attendance of any required clergyman.

(xi) She shall be the head of the Nursing and Training Staff, and shall be responsible for the efficiency of the entire Nursing, Training, and Female Domestic Staff of the Institution, as well as its domestic management, and shall report any neglect or disobedience of orders on their part to the Visiting Committee.

(xii) She shall visit each ward daily and see that the beds, linen, and clothes of the patients are in good order, and shall cause such bedding, &c., as require it to be replaced by others and thoroughly cleaned and replaced when necessary, and furnish an inventory of all stores to the Committee of Management.

(xiii) She shall superintend the laundry and cooking of all food required, and shall generally discharge the duties of Matron as shall be directed by the Committee.

(xiv) She shall interview all applicants for appointment as probationary nurses and report to the Committee the names of those best suited for the position. She shall have power to exercise disciplinary control of nurses, probationers, and female servants to the extent of suspension if necessary.

(xv) She shall give such practical and theoretical instructions as shall be required for the education of the probationary nurses under her charge, shall arrange for practical instruction in all branches of cooking for the sick, and see that probationers attend lectures by Medical Officers.

(xvi) She shall notify the secretary of the Returned Soldiers League and the secretary of the Parents Association on the admittance of any returned soldier to the institution.

(xvii) She shall, for the purpose of obtaining payment from the Defence Department, keep a careful record of all cases of returned soldiers whose illness or incapacity is the result of war disabilities.

(xviii) She shall hand over to the Secretary weekly the cash she has received from patients and other sources.

#### *Nurses.*

10. (i) The Nurses shall live in the Hospital, and shall be under the control of the Matron. They shall faithfully obey her instructions and look to her for direction.

(ii) They shall be regular in attendance, behave with kindness and tenderness to all patients, and with courtesy and respect to strangers and visitors.

(iii) They shall wear such distinguishing dress on duty as the Committee may appoint.

(iv) They shall not be absent from their wards during hours of duty, except for necessary duties or upon leave obtained.

(v) They shall not leave the Hospital or be visited by friends during hours of duty without having first obtained permission from the Matron.

(vi) They shall pay great attention to cleanliness personally and in their respective wards, and in all things intrusted to their charge, particularly to the bedding of the patients, and have it changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

(vii) They shall administer to the patients the prescribed medicines and diet at the time and in the manner directed by the Matron, and not permit them to take any which have not been prescribed; they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the Medical Officer, and watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients and report same to the Matron.

(viii) They shall not permit patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, fruit, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicine or diet, or anything to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors, without an order from the Matron.

(ix) They shall be careful to collect and carry all empty phials, gallipots, and bandages, &c., to the dispensary, at which they shall attend at time appointed to receive instructions and medicine to be given to the patients.

(x) They shall not admit any stranger without permission from the Matron, except during the hours appointed for that purpose.

(xi) They shall be obedient to the Regulations of the Hospital, and report immediately to the Matron any impropriety of conduct or infringement of the Rules by any patient, visitor, or other person, and if such complaint is not properly attended to, report same to the Committee at its next meeting.

(xii) They shall receive no fee or gratuity from any patient or visitor, and shall hand over any article of value found on patients to the Matron.

(xiii) They shall see that every patient (unless an order to the contrary be given) has, on admission, a bath before being put to bed, and thereafter see to the personal cleanliness of the patients.

(xiv) The hours of the Nursing Staff shall be arranged by the Matron after consultation with the Committee.

#### *Treasurer.*

The Treasurer shall have a general supervision over the financial affairs of the institution.

He shall see that all moneys due to the institution are paid with promptitude.

He shall report to the General Committee at each monthly meeting on the financial position of the Institution.

He shall bank all moneys received from the Secretary within two days of receipt of same. He shall include in such deposit all moneys which have been paid direct to himself, and shall hand to the Secretary a list showing payments direct to Treasurer.

#### *Secretary and Collector.*

The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of the Hospital.

He shall attend general meetings, committee meetings, sub-committee meetings, giving all the information and assistance in his power to the members of these bodies, and shall keep minutes of their proceedings.

He shall give each member of Committee notice by card of the monthly, special, or any meeting, not less than three days before such meeting.

He shall have all the accounts prepared and written up in the Finance Committee's Report Book prior to their meeting.

He shall make all payments on behalf of the Hospital by cheque drawn to order only, such cheques to be signed by the President and Honorary Treasurer, and countersigned by himself.

He shall give receipts on printed and numbered forms for all money received on account of the institution.

He shall hand over to the Treasurer all moneys received on account of the institution within three days of receipt of same, and shall submit the cash and bank books, written up to date, at every meeting of the Finance Committee.

He shall carefully examine all accounts submitted for payment and place same before Finance Committee for approval.

He shall not permit any books or papers belonging to the Hospital to be inspected or removed without the express consent of the Committee of Management.

He shall see that insurances are maintained covering all buildings and furniture against the risk of fire.

He shall prepare all returns required by Government, and an alphabetical list of contributors for the annual meeting for the use of the Returning Officer, and also a list of contributors to enable the Honorary Treasurer to make application for the quarterly payments of the Government grant. He shall also keep a record of the periods on which each member of Committee retires.

He shall, for the purposes of the annual elections for the Committee of Management prepare a list of contributors of not less than £1, whose subscriptions shall have been paid for any period of twelve months covering the date of the elections. The names appearing on such list shall be numbered consecutively. He shall submit the list so prepared to the President and Treasurer, who shall certify to same, such list shall be the official list of contributors for the elections. The Returning Officer shall have power to rectify any errors or omissions, and any person claiming to vote whose name does not appear on the certified list, who shall satisfy the Returning Officer that his name has been left off such certified list in error, shall be entitled to receive a ballot-paper.

He shall see to the collection of all payments of interest and revenue derivable from investments belonging to the Hospital.

He shall visit every inhabited locality in the Hospital district once at least in each financial year for the purpose of canvassing the residents thereof for subscriptions.

For each subscription received he shall give a receipt in the prescribed form, and shall keep a counterfoil of such receipt.

With each such receipt he shall issue to each subscriber entitled thereto under section 4 of By-law, tickets duly indorsed for admission of patients, and shall each month furnish a return of all tickets so issued.

He shall, every fourteen days, pay to the Treasurer all moneys received by him on account of the Hospital—but if at any time such moneys shall amount to £25 they shall be paid or forwarded to the Treasurer forthwith.

He shall, when making such payments or remittances to the Treasurer, furnish him with the following details in respect thereof, viz.:—Name and residence of each contributor, number and date of receipt, and amount of contribution. Payments to the Treasurer shall correspond with the total amount shown in detailed statement.

He shall furnish security for his integrity by means of a guarantee policy for £200 in an approved insurance company, the premium to be paid by the Hospital.

He shall not engage in any other business or employment without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

He shall hold office during the pleasure of the Committee of Management for the time being—one month's notice in writing on either side to terminate this agreement, or he may be removed from office on payment to him of one month's salary in lieu of notice.

He shall be entitled to two weeks' leave of absence each year on full salary.

He shall provide office accommodation at his own expense.

He must attend at his office every Friday and Saturday. The office shall be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Friday, and 10 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday.

For the satisfactory discharge of the duties herein scheduled, he shall be paid a salary of £156 per annum, payable monthly, together with a commission of 10 per cent. on all moneys collected by him, and on all entertainments and special efforts organized by him. No commission shall be paid on Government and municipal grants, legacies, bequests, proceeds of entertainments and special efforts not organized by him, church collections, patients' contributions.

#### *Yardsman.*

Rise at quarter to 5 a.m. Bring in and milk cows. Milk to be up in kitchen by quarter to 7. Breakfast 7 a.m. Feed pigs and clean sty. Feed fowls, clean yards, and whitewash houses twice a week. Empty all refuse boxes once a day. Scald out once a week with soda water in laundry. Sweep yards and drains daily, and whitewash drains every week. Milk cows at 4 p.m. Feed pigs.

Help to carry stretcher cases when required, and any other special duties as arranged by Matron.

He shall supervise the fodder, and shall advise the Matron from time to time as to the requirements.

After milking in the morning the cows are to be taken to the reserve and brought back in the afternoon in sufficient time for milking.

The Yardsman shall lock all gates (other than the main entrance gate) at 6 p.m. in winter and 8 p.m. in summer.

He shall see that the windmills are in proper order and kept oiled, and that all troughs are kept supplied with water and regularly cleansed.

He shall have every Wednesday afternoon off, and every other Sunday off.

#### *Ward Cleaner.*

Called daily at a quarter to 5 a.m. After lighting kitchen fire and polishing wards, thoroughly clean up fireplaces in all wards. Sweep men's medical and surgical wards. Shake mats and sweep verandah surgical side. Thoroughly clean lavatories, scrub and wipe dry, also bath rooms, &c., on both sides. Wipe floors dry. Scrub ward pantries twice a week. Other special duties as arranged by Matron.

#### *Care of Ambulance.*

The Committee shall from time to time appoint a suitable person to take charge of the ambulance vehicle, and persons requiring same shall notify the Matron, who shall immediately inform the person in charge of same. The man in charge of the ambulance shall be entitled to receive a minimum fee of Five shillings for his services, but persons whose circumstances are such they are unable to pay for the ambulance service will not be expected to do so. In such case the Hospital authorities will make payment as they may determine.

#### *Servants.*

(i) The servants, male and female, shall be subject to all the conditions generally set forth in the rules governing the work and conduct of other employees. They shall be cleanly in person, obedient and respectful in demeanour, regular in attendance and attention to duty, and shall be ready to render special services, whenever circumstances may render such service necessary.

(ii) The male servants shall be under the control and direction of the Matron.

(iii) They shall not admit any stranger to any part of the premises without the knowledge of the Matron, and shall not, except by such sanction, convey messages or articles of any sort from or to any patient.

#### *General.*

(i) No employee of the Hospital shall be absent from the institution after 10 o'clock p.m. unless with the permission of the Matron.

(ii) Any servant becoming ill or unfit for duty may be removed to a ward and treated as an ordinary patient receiving full pay for seven days and half pay for another seven days if still under treatment. Should the illness be prolonged, payment of salary to cease after fourteen days, unless otherwise directed by the Committee.

*Boiler Attendant.*

Monday morning start at 6 a.m., finishing at 4 p.m.  
All other days of the week (except Sundays) to commence duty at 7.30 a.m., finishing at 4 p.m.

In cases of special emergency he shall, if required, be in attendance, and for which overtime will be allowed. For purposes of computation it shall be understood that eight hours shall constitute a day's work.

He shall attend to the steam boiler and the hot water service and exercise a careful supervision over all the appliances, and see that all are kept in good order.

To see that a sufficient supply of steam is provided for the sterilizer during operations and on all occasions when required.

To see that the hot-water service in laundry and for use of baths is sufficient and working satisfactorily.

To assist as far as practicable in the work of the laundry.

To examine and measure all firewood.

To keep the Matron regularly informed as to the requirements in wood and coke, giving sufficient time so that supplies can be procured.

He shall require to have the necessary certificates required by the Government in the carrying out of his duties.

He shall have two weeks' holiday in the year, to be taken at such periods as may mutually be decided upon by the Committee and himself.

He shall take all his instructions from the Matron or Visiting Committee, and submit direct to the Matron a list of his requirements.

*Gardener.*

He shall provide all vegetables for the use of the Hospital, and shall keep the garden and grounds in a thorough state of repair.

He shall give all orders for requirements to the Matron, and generally undertake the customary work attached to his position.

*Laundress.*

The laundress shall have charge of the laundry and be under the direction of the Matron. She shall be responsible that the clothes are washed and dried in a proper manner and returned to the Matron or wards.

She shall draw the attention of the Matron to any damage to the Hospital linen which she may observe.

She shall report any repairs needed or want of proper utensils to the Matron.

She shall give the Matron once a week a list of all stores required for the use of the laundry.

*Domestic.*

While on duty they shall perform their work quietly, and noise shall be avoided as far as possible.

Conversation in a loud tone of voice is strictly prohibited, and singing and joking must be avoided.

Matron shall make such domestic rules for the proper work of the wards and other parts of the institution, and for the observance of discipline and good order under the authority of the Committee as she may from time to time think fit.

*Wardman's Duties.*

Charge of MacLachlan wards and men's day room.

Wax each ward in Hospital once a week.

Polish each ward and vestibule every morning.

Clean outside all ward windows and nurses' quarters and ventilators once a week.

Carry patients' beds in and out of wards.

She shall use every endeavour to prevent waste of food.
