TOBACCO EXPERT (TEMPORARY), DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

Duties.—To advise the Government on all matters relating to the Tobacco industry, and the means to be adopted for its development. To undertake the tuition of growers by means of demonstrations, lectures, and tutorial farm-to-farm visits. To superintend the construction of curing sheds, fermentation rooms, and to carry out or supervise the processes necessary for the growth, harvesting, curing, fermentation, and manufacture of the different varieties of tobacco.

Qualifications.—Knowledge of soils, climatic conditions, manures, and cultivation treatment suitable for the growth of various kinds of tobacco; of seed selection, the raising of

seedlings, and the treatment of crop during growth; of preparation of soil for seed beds and crops; experience in the cultivation and curing (including flue-curing) of varieties for the production of bright, cigar, and plug leaf tobacco, including fermentation of cigar leaf, also knowledge of cross-breeding of the tobacco plant and of the marketing of tobacco leaf.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WANGARATTA, KNOWN AS THE "MERRIWA GARDENS."

THE Council of the borough of Wangaratta the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the twenty-seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and one, in the municipal district of Wangaratta, as a site for Public Gardens, known as the "Merriwa Gardens," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees shrubs or flowers in the Reserve nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fence or gates in or around the Reserve stick bills thereon or on any building in the Reserve or cut names on or otherwise injure or deface the fences trees buildings or seats or roll or throw stones in the Reserve nor leave or deposit any glass paper or rubbish nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses cattle sheep goats pigs or other animals or being the owner or having the possession care custody control or supervision thereof shall suffer or allow such horses cattle sheep goats pigs or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall take or drive any carriage cart or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage cart or other vehicle shall whilst in the Reserve be detached or unharnessed therefrom or left without a person being in charge thereof.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained and no person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any article or thing without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management or by a police constable or Crown lands bailiff.

10. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days not exceeding twelve in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for sports fêtes entertainments or holidays amusements shall be as follows:—For admission of every person over the age of thirteen years such sum exclusive of entertainment tax as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling and for the admission of every person not over the age of thirteen years such sum exclusive of entertainment tax as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Sixpence Provided that the net amount received by the Committee of Management after providing for any necessary prizes and disbursements in connexion therewith shall be used and appropriated towards the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and an account thereof shall be made annually to the Board of Land and Works.

12. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce and if required surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and every person who wilfully and knowingly offends against any such Regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

WE, W. Hoy, H. J. Martin, T. Somerville, J. Hargreaves, the majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Gardens in the parish of Sandhurst (Kennington), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipts of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for the entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
 10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and reserves.
 11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
 13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF NEWHAM, KNOWN AS THE HANGING ROCK WATER AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* it is enacted that in the case of any land which, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council, either before or after the commencement of this Act, has reserved from sale permanently for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, or the corresponding section of any repealed Act, and has vested in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes specified in sub-section 1 of the first-mentioned section: And whereas a Crown grant has been issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Newham (now designated the shire of Newham and Woodend) in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation and for affording access to water in the parish of Newham, known as the "Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve":

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Newham and Woodend do hereby make in respect of the said Reserve the following Regulation, in lieu of the Regulation approved by the Governor in Council on 22nd April, 1913:—

REGULATION.

The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on every New Year's Day and every Easter Monday, or any day substituted for either of them, on any of which occasions a fee of One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every person not under the age of sixteen (16) years to the Reserve.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
