The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Intermediate Examination as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application, may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Saturday, the 22nd November, 1919, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.).

Fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must on the first day of the examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any Victorian returned sailor or soldier. Provided their certificate of discharge is furnished with their application, they may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £156 a year.

HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

Notice to Boatmen, Etc.

[No. 1 of 1919.]

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with their Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley course on the Upper Yarra on the 25th October, 1919, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats to be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, 423 Flinders-lane, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 34 feet from stem to stern, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the Port Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 12 feet.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1915*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

Principal Regulations, Meaning of.

1. In these Regulations "Principal Regulations" means the Regulations made by the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of January, 1917.

Regulations, How Construed.

2. These Regulations shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be construed with the Principal Regulations and as part thereof.

Partial Repeal of Principal Regulations.

3. Regulations 109, 118, 119, 141, 143, 144, 217, 272, 297, 299, 300, and 302 of the Principal Regulations are hereby repealed.

Conditions of Licence.

4. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 109 of the Principal Regulations:—

109. Licences granted to act as a wharfinger shall be subject to the Regulations of the Commissioners and (*inter alia*) to the following conditions:—

(1) The licensed wharfinger shall take delivery of the goods of owners as and when the same are discharged from the vessel and shall deal with the goods as the Regulations of the Commissioners prescribe, either by making delivery to the person entitled to delivery or by stacking same as and where the Harbor Master shall allow, or by storing same in the shed at the berth where the vessel is discharging or by delivering same to the Commissioners for removal to a warehouse.

(2) All goods taken delivery of by the licensed wharfinger shall be deemed to have been received by him in good order and condition unless the receipt given by him to the vessel for same and/or the Bill of Lading shows that they were in a damaged or bad condition. If the licensed wharfinger has signed for the goods to the ship in a damaged or bad condition and produces to the owner proof to that effect then the owner's remedy if any for such damage shall be against the master or owner of the vessel in accordance with the Bill of Lading and not against the licensed wharfinger.

(3) The licensed wharfinger shall be liable for loss of or injury to goods received by him as in good order and condition damage from fire or causes arising therefrom and other exceptions in the Bill of Lading excepted. The licensed wharfinger shall not be liable for loss of or injury to such goods occurring after the expiry of twenty-four hours after notice to remove the goods has been received by the Commissioners from him provided—

- That such notice shall not be given until six days after the vessel from which the goods were unshipped ceased to discharge at the berth.
- That the quantity of goods to be removed does not exceed 200 tons in weight or measurement.
- That a notice in form approved by the Commissioners stating when the licensed wharfinger's liability will cease has been given to consignees by advertisement in at least one Melbourne daily paper and by posting in a conspicuous place in the shed containing the goods.

(4) The licensed wharfinger shall place all packages unshipped in apparent bad order in the cage provided in the shed at which the vessel is discharging, and shall post a list of such goods in a conspicuous place in the shed so as to be available for inspection by owners. He shall be liable for the number of packages received by him.

(5) Should a person entitled to their delivery desire to repair or open for Customs inspection or sampling any packages landed in apparent good order and condition he must first sign a clean receipt for same and such packages shall be thereafter at his risk and expense. After such repairing inspection or sampling such packages must be removed from the shed the same day but if this is found impracticable removal may be held over until the next working day and pending such removal the packages shall be placed in the cage.

(6) The charges to be made by licensed wharfingers for work done by them shall not exceed the amount specified hereunder but the Commissioners may be resolution from time to time vary the amount of all or any of such charges:—

(7) A licensed wharfinger shall not use any wharf or shed for the storage of outward cargo unless with the consent of the Commissioners who may from time to time determine the charges that may be made by the licensed wharfinger for the storage and handling of such goods.

(8) The licensed wharfinger shall not deliver any goods unless the Commissioner's authority to deliver is presented as provided in Regulation 113 and in the case of goods liable to storage fees under Regulation 143, unless the Commissioners' receipt for such fees as well as their authority to deliver is presented.

(9) Each licensed wharfinger shall use the wharf and shed accommodation allotted to the vessel for which he is acting to the satisfaction of the Harbor Master, and shall keep and leave the wharf shed and offices thoroughly cleared of all rubbish and litter and swept clean. He shall in all matters obey the orders of the Harbor Master.

(10) Every licensed wharfinger shall give to the Commissioners an undertaking in writing to hold the Commissioners indemnified against all claims of the Department of Trade and Customs in respect of the goods taken delivery of by him.

(11) The Commissioners may appoint a licensed wharfinger to act in regard to any vessel or at any berth, provided that when a licensed wharfinger being the agent of a vessel undertakes to act as such for every vessel of

which he is either the agent or consignee the Commissioners will not require him to act as the wharfinger in regard to any vessel of which he is not the agent or consignee.

(12) Every person licensed by the Commissioners to act as a wharfinger immediately after the granting of such licence and before he shall be capable of acting as such wharfinger shall give to the Commissioners a bond, to be approved of by them for the sum of £100 for the due fulfilment of the above conditions and that he will act whenever called upon by the Commissioners.

5. The following Regulations are made in place of Regulation 118 of the principal Regulations:—

118. *Transshipment, Meaning of.*—Transshipment in these Regulations when used in relation to goods means transshipment within the port of goods to be sea-borne without the port, and the word "transhipped" and the word "transshipping" respectively have a meaning corresponding with that of "transshipment."

118A. *Transshipment, Notice of.*—Any person transshipping goods shall within forty-eight hours after such goods have been finally discharged in the port and before transshipment give notice to the Commissioners in writing of the intention to transship such goods; and shall specify therein the description of the goods and the name of the vessel or place from which the goods are to be taken and the name of the vessel into which same are to be placed.

118B. *Transshipment, Exemption on.*—Goods transhipped within the port not later than ten days after such goods have been discharged shall in addition to the exemption provided by section 110 sub-section (3) of the Act be exempt from tolls and rates if notice of intention to transship the same shall have been duly given in manner hereinbefore required. Provided that in case notice of intention to transship goods shall not have been given within the time hereinbefore required the wharfage rate shall be 1s. per ton if the goods have not been removed from the wharf or vessel upon or into which they have been discharged and if before the actual transshipment of such goods takes place notice in writing of the intention to transship such goods be given to the Commissioners.

118C. *Goods for Transshipment when Tonnage not Available.*—The following provisions shall apply in the case of goods manifested as through cargo for transshipment at Melbourne if notice of intention to transship has been duly given as provided by Regulation No. 118 (A) and if shipping space is not available for the purposes of transshipment within the period allowed under the Act or these Regulations for transshipment free of tolls and rates:—If within thirty days after such goods have been discharged the same are transhipped or are forwarded by rail to the port for which they were to be transhipped a refund may be allowed of any amount paid as wharfage rates on the goods in excess of 1s. per ton. Provided that no such refund shall be allowed if the goods have been removed from the Trust's property (other than in the course of their immediate transshipment) or have not been forwarded directly from the Trust's property to the custody of the Victorian Railways Commissioners. The cost of any re-stacking of the goods considered necessary by the Commissioners and the cost of removing the goods shall in every case be borne by the owner. The Commissioners may in any case refuse to allow any refund unless the owner of the goods furnishes the Commissioners with a statutory declaration verifying the facts of the case as the Commissioners may require.

6. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 141 of the principal Regulations:—

141. *Goods on Wharfs and in Sheds, Time allowed.*—Subject to the provisions of these Regulations all goods (other than ales wines spirits or other fermented or spirituous liquors) landed and placed upon a wharf or in a shed shall be removed therefrom within three days after the vessel from which they have been landed has ceased discharging cargo at the berth where such goods were landed.

If in the opinion of the Commissioners the exigencies of trade permit such goods may be allowed to remain upon the wharf or in the shed for such further time as they may specify but in no case for more than six days after the vessel has ceased discharging cargo as aforesaid.

7. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 143 of the principal Regulations:—

143. *Storage Fees.*—Should any goods be not removed within the time limited by Regulation 141 there shall be payable by the owner as and by way of storage fees in respect thereof the sum of 1s. per ton of such goods for the first week and for every subsequent week the sum of 3d. per ton additional to the amount per ton payable for each immediately preceding week, i.e., 1s. 3d. per ton

for the second week, 1s. 6d. for the third week and so on. For the purpose of this Regulation a fraction of a ton shall be deemed a ton. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Harbor Master without notice removing or ordering the removal to some warehouse of any such goods at any time after the expiry of the time limited for their removal and the owner of the goods shall pay all charges and expenses connected with such removal including the warehouse rent and charges in addition to the said storage fees. If in the opinion of the Commissioners the non-removal of goods within the time limited has been due to some cause beyond the control of the owner of the goods then the Commissioners may if they think fit on the application of the owner grant a refund of such part of the said storage fees paid under this Regulation as exceeds the rate of 1s. per ton per week. The Commissioners may require a statutory declaration verifying the facts of the case by such person or persons as they shall think proper.

8. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 144 of the principal Regulations:—

144. *Calculation of Time.*—In the computation of time for the purposes of Regulations Nos. 109, 141, 161, 163, and 164, no Sunday and no other day which the Commissioners may declare or appoint to be considered a holiday on any specified wharf whereon goods are lying, will be included.

9. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 217 of the principal Regulations:—

217. *Statutory Declaration by Licensee.*—Every person licensed to supply or remove ballast to or from any vessel shall from time to time furnish to the Commissioners a statutory declaration showing the quantity of ballast supplied or removed by him.

10. The following Regulation is made and inserted between Regulations 217 and 218:—

217A. *Charge for taking Ballast over Wharf.*—Where any ballast supplied to or removed from any vessel is placed upon or is taken along or over any wharf the property of the Commissioners within the port the master owner or agent of the vessel shall pay to the Commissioners the following charge for the use of the wharf, viz.:—

For every ton or fraction of a ton of such ballast—6d.

Provided that when the payment required by this Regulation has been made the ballast in respect of which such payment has been made shall be exempt from any wharfage rate which would otherwise have been payable thereon.

11. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 272 of the principal Regulations:—

272. *License-fees.*—The following fees shall be payable in respect of the several licences specified in these Regulations, viz.:—

Ballast—For each person licensed to supply or remove ballast, per annum, 5s.; for dredging or raising or taking any ballast within the port, per annum, £5.

Boats—Including every boat (howsoever propelled) licensed to carry passengers, per annum, 1s. per passenger licensed to be carried, with a minimum fee of 5s. per annum.

Tugs, launches, lighters, hulks, barges not exceeding 300 tons gross register, per annum, £5; exceeding 300 tons gross register, per annum, £10.

For the weighing in or out or measuring of vessels licensed or sought to be licensed, 1s. per ton gross register, with a minimum fee of 20s. per vessel.

Steam hoist—Fees for every yearly examination, each £1; persons in charge thereof, for each licence, 5s.; for every licence to place a steam hoist on wharf road or other property of the Trust, £2 2s.

Boatmen and watermen—For each licence, per annum, 5s.

Ferryman—For each person employed on a ferry boat, per annum, 5s.

Itinerant vendors with basket or barrow, per annum, £1.

Itinerant vendors of fruit, &c., with dray, for each dray, per annum, £3.

Carters and carriers—For every licence, per annum, 5s.

Carriers' employees—For every licence, per annum, 5s.

Coopers—For every licence, per annum, 5s.; do., per week, 1s.

Coopers' boxes—To place a tool-box or locker on any wharf or to use any tool-box or locker of the Commissioners, per annum, £5.

Porters—For every licence, per annum, 5s.

12. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 297 of the principal Regulations:—

297. The charge for the use by any vessel of any wharf dock pier jetty landing-stage or part thereof the property of the Commissioners appropriated by the Commissioners under or by virtue of any power in the Act contained shall unless otherwise provided or agreed upon be at the rate of 3s. per 100 feet in length of the berth for each quarter of a day during the time a vessel is berthed thereat, with a minimum charge equal to the charge for one day for each berthing. The charge shall be paid by the master owner or agent of the vessel and shall be in addition to any toll rate or charge which may be or may become due or payable under the Act or Regulation.

13. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 299 of the principal Regulations:—

299. *Rent—where Shed on Wharf.*—The master owner or agent of a vessel occupying any berth at a wharf or part of a wharf on which a shed is erected shall unless otherwise agreed upon pay to the Commissioners the sum of £14 for the first day when cargo is unshipped and £2 for the first day when cargo is shipped and 10s. for each subsequent quarter of a day during which the vessel is berthed thereat irrespective of whether cargo is shipped or unshipped. Should the charges paid under this Regulation exceed 6d. per ton on the cargo unshipped from and/or shipped into the vessel the Commissioners shall on application being made to them refund the amount paid in excess of such 6d. per ton.

14. The following Regulation is made and inserted between Regulations 299 and 300 of the principal Regulations:—

299A. *Rent for Use of Wharf, &c., Prior to Arrival of Vessel.*—The master owner or agent of a vessel requiring any wharf or part of a wharf or shed for the storage of outward cargo prior to the arrival of the vessel at such wharf by which it is to be shipped shall pay the sum of £2 per day for the first day and 10s. for each subsequent quarter of a day from the time the wharf or shed is set apart for the storage of outward cargo until arrival of the vessel. If the whole of the cargo deposited be not shipped by the vessel, such master owner or agent shall pay the said charges until all the cargo deposited has been removed from the wharf or shed. The granting of any wharf or shed for the storage of outward cargo shall be in the discretion of the Commissioners.

15. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 300 of the principal Regulations:—

300. *Telephone, Charge for.*—The master owner or agent of a vessel occupying any berth at a wharf or part of a wharf at which a telephone is installed shall unless the Commissioners have appropriated the berth as a special berth pay to the Commissioners the sum of 20s. for the use of the telephone while the vessel occupies the berth.

16. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 302:—

302. *Cargo Lights.*—Whenever the Commissioners shall supply light for working cargo in the hold of a vessel, the master owner or agent shall pay to the Commissioners the sum of £1 5s. per night or part of a night for the use of such light.

17. Regulation 310 of the principal Regulations is amended by omitting from the Schedule thereto the figure "3d." where it first occurs and inserting the figure "6d." in its stead, and by inserting the words "ammonia liquor, 2s. per ton" immediately after the words "sand (carried as cargo) and shell, 1s. per ton."

Provided in case this lease is assigned to any person by such assignee or trustee in insolvency or the executors or administrators of the lessee such lessee not having personally resided on the allotment pursuant to the conditions of these presents in that behalf or no proof satisfactory to the Board being given of such residence the Governor in Council may date such assigned lease so as to enable the new lessee to comply with the said condition of residence and may make such adjustments of the purchase money as are necessary and these presents shall be read and construed accordingly. And Thirdly that if within twelve months from the date of the insolvency or death of the lessee or within such further period as aforesaid the assignee or trustee in such insolvency or executor or administrator shall have failed to re-assign or transfer this lease to some person who is qualified for becoming a lessee of the said allotment then notwithstanding anything contained in the Closer Settlement Acts or in these presents the Governor in Council may thereupon in his discretion and upon such terms and conditions as he thinks fit assign this lease or permit the same to be assigned to some person who is qualified to hold the same and who proves to the satisfaction of the Board that he ought to become the transferee or assignee of this lease.

5. That he or they after the expiration of the six years in the last preceding clause mentioned will not transfer assign mortgage or sublet any part of the land hereby demised without the written consent of the Board first had and obtained it being a condition of these presents that if at any time after the expiration of the first six years hereof the Board is satisfied that all the covenants and conditions hereof have been complied with that the lessee may with the written consent of the Board transfer assign mortgage sublet or part with the possession of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised.

6. That he or they will forthwith after the granting of this lease and to the satisfaction of the Board commence and continue to destroy and will within three years after the issue of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board the animals and birds by the *Land Act 1915* included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare or have declared to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act or of any Act thereby repealed upon the land hereby demised and will keep the same free of such animals and birds and of Bathurst burr wild briar and gorse to the satisfaction of the Board.

7. That he or they will within twelve months from the issue of this lease if not sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1915* enclose the land described herein with a fence and keep the same in repair. Provided nevertheless that where any lessee proves to the satisfaction of the Board that owing to the physical conditions or the nature of the land demised the enclosing thereof with a fence would be impracticable or where in the opinion of the Board the fencing of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised is not required the Board may in writing accept as a compliance with this covenant the expenditure by the lessee on such land for substantial and permanent improvements previously approved by the Board of an amount equivalent in the Board's opinion to the cost of fencing.

That these presents are upon this further condition that the lessee or purchaser of the land hereby demised for the time being will keep open all canals ditches drains cuts channels water-courses sewers and works on the said land to the satisfaction of the Board and will keep open and free from obstruction and to the satisfaction of the Board portions of any drains adjacent to the land demised and upon any road or reservation abutting or bounding the same or any part thereof and within a distance of not more than one hundred and thirty-two feet from such part.

12. That these presents are upon this condition that the lessee will at all times during the term of the lease keep in good order and repair all buildings fences and other permanent improvements situated on the demised land reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire alone excepted and will not destroy pull down or remove them or any part thereof without the previous permission of the Board in writing.

13. That he or they not being the holder of a mining or mineral lease him or them permitting will not open up any mine on the land comprised in this lease without the previous permission of the Board in writing.

14. That neither he nor they will cut down or remove any of the trees growing on the land hereby demised without the consent of the Board in writing first obtained.

15. That he or they will permit the Board or any person appointed in that behalf by the Board to at any time enter upon the premises hereby demised to ascertain if the conditions and covenants of this lease are being performed by the lessee.

16. That he or they shall and will observe perform fulfil and be bound by the stipulations conditions covenants and provisos contained in the Schedule hereto.

17. That he or they will on or before the 31st day of July in each year forward to the Board a statement in the form for the time being prescribed or if none such there be a statement showing how the land hereby demised has been utilized during the twelve months ending the 30th day of June next preceding the date of such statement.

18. That these presents are upon this further condition that if it be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that for the effective drainage of any closer settlement allotment it is necessary to provide a drainage course through the land hereby demised the lessee of such allotment shall have the right to cut a drain of such dimensions and along such a course as may be authorized by the Board.

Such cost or amount to be fixed by the Board and to be payable to such person or persons as it determines. Provided that no compensation for severance or for any person's interest in the unexpired term of the lease shall be given or allowed.

20. That these presents are upon this condition that the demand for or acceptance of any instalment of purchase money or interest by or on behalf of the Board subsequently to a breach of any covenant or condition of this lease (whether such instalment shall have become due before or after such breach) shall not be deemed a waiver of such breach notwithstanding that the Board or the person receiving such instalment had knowledge of such breach.

21. That these presents are upon this further condition that if and whenever any instalment covenanted to be paid hereunder shall be in arrear whether the same shall have been legally demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants conditions and agreements positive or negative by the lessee hereinbefore contained and this lease be avoided either by operation of law or by a determination of the Governor in Council hereinafter provided then these presents and the term hereby created shall be void and of no effect and immediately upon these presents and the term hereby created becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiff of Crown lands or for any other agent or officer authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors administrators and assigns and all persons claiming from under or through him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case His Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law. And that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceeding taken for or on account of the same by any person whomsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and licence in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming from under or through him or them to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceedings. Provided nevertheless that a forfeiture for non-payment of any half-yearly instalment may be prevented at the discretion of the Board by the payment of a fine at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum. Provided further that no forfeiture shall operate to extinguish any debt to the Crown in respect of such instalment. If the lessee is unable at the end of any half-year to pay his instalments the Board may if the lessee has complied with the conditions of these presents suspend payment of such instalments as will not exceed One hundred per centum of the value of the improvements effected on the land over and above any incumbrance thereon and allow him to pay the arrears of instalments and interest thereon in one amount or spread over a definite time or may extend the lease for a corresponding time.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK IN THE PARISH OF NARREE WORRAN, KNOWN AS THE "LOCKWOOD PARK."

WE, Hannah Mary Elvery, William Joseph Murrells, Henry Edmond Percy, Alfred John Charles Roddick, and Ernest Davies Thorpe, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 26th January, 1916, as a site for a Public Park, in the parish of Narree Worrان, known as the "Lockwood Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall remove or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, ferns, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except in the places provided for same, and after being used all fires must be properly extinguished.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, tables, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave

or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, except in the receptacles provided for same; nor roll or throw stones, bottles, or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit, or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game of sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any vehicle, goods, or chattels of any description.

13. No person shall enter or leave the Reserve except through the roadway provided for the purpose.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such

occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

15. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

16. No person shall carry or discharge firearms of any sort within the Reserve.

BY-LAW No. 17.

A By-law of the shire of Borung, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 17, for the purpose of adding to, altering and repealing certain clauses in By-law No. 8 of the said shire of Borung.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Borung order as follows:—

1. That clause 31 of By-law No. 8 is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be in lieu thereof:—

(31) "Any building in the second class of any subdivision of this class shall have its walls, generally speaking, built in brick, stone, or a combination of both, or reinforced concrete, or any other approved incombustible material, laid or set in lime or cement mortar in such a manner as to produce solid work and as generally hereinafter, more particularly described, excepting only in such portions of the town as are not included in the following area. All allotments facing Scott-street, both sides, and a distance extending back therefrom of one hundred feet, and extending from Lyle-street on the one hand, to Kelsall-street on the other, such area for the purposes of these Regulations to be termed the 'brick area,' provided, however, that the front parapet of every building may, where it is considered advisable by the Building Surveyor, be built of wood or other approved material, and shall be covered with approved fire-resisting materials."

2. That the following words be added to clause 33 of said By-law No. 8:—

"Provided such alterations tend to the improvement and increased stability of the building, and in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, tend to reduce the fire risk."

3. Plate-glass windows may be substituted in all existing buildings within the brick area, provided that in the opinion of the Building Surveyor the fire risk is not increased, and that the footings are in brick, and the surrounding wood-work and the front parapets of the buildings are covered with some approved fire-resisting material.

4. That the area set out in clause 58 of said By-law No. 8 be extended to include that portion of the parish of Werrigar in the shire of Borung commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1, thence south along the east boundary of the township of Warracknabeal, to a point due east of the continuation of the northern boundary of the east and west road between allotments 90a and 90c, thence west to the western boundary of the Yarriambiack Creek reserve, thence northerly by the said western boundary to the angle 12 chains south of the southern boundary of the main Dimboola-road, thence northerly to a point on the north boundary of Dimboola-road, 8 chains from the Yarriambiack Creek reserve, thence northerly and north-easterly on a line 8 chains parallel with the western boundary of the Yarriambiack Creek reserve to a point 20 chains south of the north-east corner of allotment 2, thence east to the eastern boundary of the Yarriambiack Creek reserve, thence southerly along the boundary to a point nine and one-third chains north of the continuation of the northern boundary of Bowman-street, Warracknabeal, thence east by a line parallel with Bowman-street to the western boundary of the Hopetoun Railway reserve, thence southerly by such western boundary to the north boundary of Bowman-street, thence east by such north boundary to the west boundary of the Hopetoun-road, thence southerly by the west boundary of the Hopetoun-road, to the north boundary of the Birchip-road, thence east by such northern boundary to the point of commencement.

THE President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac by virtue of the provisions of sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915* hereby make the following By-law number 80 of the said shire for regulating and prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisement upon any footpath street or road or upon any building fence or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the said Council; for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections and hoardings and of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road in the said shire; for regulating restricting or preventing the exhibition of advertisements affecting injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or disfiguring the natural beauty of a landscape; for regulating and controlling all advertisements on any hoardings on any building or on any fence, rock, cliff or tree; for appointing fees chargeable under such Regulations, and authorizing the Council of the said shire to pull down and remove and sell the materials of buildings, erections, hoardings or fences erected or constructed contrary to such By-law and for other purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and of every other power thereto enabling it the Council of the Shire of Colac doth order as follows:—

1. By-law number 76 of the shire of Colac, so far as the same is inconsistent herewith, is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the shire of Colac.

3. No person shall erect or construct a hoarding on any land within the shire of Colac except in accordance with the specifications contained in the Schedule to this By-law.

4. No person shall erect or construct a hoarding or cause or permit a hoarding to be erected or constructed in front of any dwelling-house nearer than the height of such hoarding to such dwelling-house or exceeding twenty feet in height.

5. No person shall exhibit any advertisement in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously

the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.

6. No person shall attach or fix to or paint any advertisement on any hoarding or on any building or on any fence rock cliff or tree which in the opinion of the said Council is unsightly or objectionable and any such advertisement may be obliterated abolished or removed by the said Council.

7. No person shall write paint print stencil place or affix any letter figure device poster sign or advertisement which, in the opinion of the said Council, is unsightly or objectionable upon any footpath street or road or upon any building fence or other property vested in the said shire or under the control and management of the said Council.

8. Every person shall prior to the erection or construction by him of any hoarding give notice in writing of his intention so to do to the Council's Engineer, together with a proper plan and specification setting forth the design, material, dimensions and position thereof and shall at the same time lodge with the said Engineer the written consent of the owner of the land on which the hoarding is to be erected to such erection being made subject to the conditions of this By-law. He shall also pay to the Engineer the sum of One guinea which fee is prescribed by the Council for the inspection of such hoarding by the Engineer.

9. No person shall erect or construct any hoarding without the consent in writing of the Council having been first had and obtained.

10. The owner of every hoarding whether the same has been constructed before or after the passing of this By-law shall keep the same in good and substantial repair and to the satisfaction of the Engineer and every owner who neglects or refuses to effect repairs for more than seven days after notice to repair from the Engineer shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day which he neglects or fails to effect the same but not exceeding a total sum of Twenty pounds.

11. In the case of erections or hoardings hereafter erected or constructed (a) without the consent of the Council or (b) otherwise than in conformity with such plan and specification, the Council or its officer authorized for the purpose may serve upon the owner of the premises upon which any such erection or hoarding is erected or constructed a notice in writing requiring such owner to pull down and remove any such erection or hoarding, and if such owner shall not comply with such notice the Council is hereby authorized to pull down and remove such erection or hoarding and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such erection or hoarding, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

12. If the Engineer shall certify in writing that any building erection or hoarding or fence whether constructed before or after the passing of this By-law is in such a state of disrepair as to be dangerous to the public the Council may by order direct the removal of the said building erection hoarding or fence or the making of such alteration thereto as the Council may think necessary a copy of such order may be served on the owner of the building erection or hoarding or fence and on the owner for the time being of the land on which the same is erected either personally or by affixing the same to some conspicuous part of the building erection or hoarding or fence and if within the time prescribed in the said order the building erection hoarding or fence has not been removed or altered as directed the Council may authorize the Engineer to enter on the land on which such building erection or hoarding or fence stands and to pull down and remove or cause the same to be pulled down and removed at the costs and expense of the owner thereof; and the Council may sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expense of such pulling down and removal and pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof; and in addition to such cost and expense such owner and the owner for the time being of the land shall each forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every day during which such building erection or hoarding or fence is not removed or altered as directed but not exceeding a total sum of Twenty pounds.

13. Any person for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
