#### SHIRE OF WALPEUP.

#### BY-LAW No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1915 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Walpeup, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Walpeup, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, being By-law No. 9 of the Shire of Walpeup, that is to say:—

- (1) All former by-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- (2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- (3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the townships of Ouyen, Murrayville, Underbool and Walpeup and such other areas as the Council may from time to time by resolution declare.
- (4) The occupier of any premises shall cause a closet or privy to be erected on such premises and shall cause the space under the seat of such closet or privy to be prepared and shall permit same to be used for the double-pan system hereinafter provided for and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
- (5) The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit same and shall cause one or the other of such pans to be kept under the seat as aforesaid.
- (6) The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereunto, a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pans.
- (7) The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time and the other pan to be left in its place.
- (8) Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.
- (9) The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
- (10) The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
- (11) If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for the passing of this By-law agreed to on the 4th day of June, 1919, and confirmed and sealed on the 3rd day of July, 1919.

WE, the Council of the borough of Oakleigh, David Wright Nicoll. Henry R. Bastow, John E. Thomas, Thomas G. Newton, and W. A. Trenwith, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order, in Council of 7th May, 1884, as a site for Public Recreation in the town of Oakleigh, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entraine fees or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915. Act 1915.

#### REQUILATIONS.

REQUIATIONS.

(1) The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 24 days in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, tennis, or bowling matches, shows, sports, fêtes or other amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission to the reserve of every person.

(2) The Committee of Management shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in any portion of the reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto.

(3) The Committee of Management shall have power to let any portion of the reserve to any club, association, committee

any portion of the reserve to any club, association, committee or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, perform-

or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances or sports, and to authorize such club, association, committee or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

(4) No person except the members of the Committee of Management and the Town Clerk shall enter, any part of the reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Committee of Management.

(5) No person shall remove or damage any huilding or the

(5) No person shall remove or damage any building or the furniture or fittings thereof in the reserve.

(6) No person shall climb any tree, or interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump or get upon, over, under or through any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures, or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatever, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures in the reserve.

(7) No person shall carry firearms in or through the reserve, by suthority of the Committee of Management.

(8) No person shall sell or offer for sale within the reserve any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate

(8) No person shall sell or offer for sale within the reserve any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement. without the written permission of the Committee of Management.

(9) No person shall light a fire in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

(10) No person except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or laid out for plantations of trees, plants or shrubs.

(11) No person shall engage in the reserve in any game, sports or training on Sunday.

(12) No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation shall exercise in, play upon, occupy or use the reserve or any part thereof without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

(13) No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, hockey, tennis or any other like game in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the reserve.

(14) No person or persons other than markets of the re-

(14) No person or persons other than members of the respective clubs, or those engaged in the playing of a game or

match, shall enter upon or into
(a) the made tennis courts, the bowling green, or pavilion

(a) the made tennis courts, the bowling green, or pavilion or cricket ground; or

(b) any space in the enclosures surrounding them which may be required to be used by the players in the prosecution of the game; or

(c) any of the buildings or outhouses of the clubs.

(15) No person except labourers or workmen employed on the reserve shall ride or drive any horse or any carriage, cart or other vehicle through the reserve without the permission of the Committee, and no person shall ride any bicycle in the reserve except on the track set apart for cycling.

(16) No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling or occupation of a bookmaker in the reserve, and every club, association of person renting or having been granted the use of the ground shall, if so required by the committee, enforce the provisions of Part IV. of the Police Offences Act 1915, or any statutory modification thereof for the prohibition of betting thereon.

(17) No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or ereate or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency within the reserve or any building

(18) No person shall remain in the reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.

(19) No horses or cattle shall be allowed in the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Manage-

(22) Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the reserve, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee of Management, or by the club, association or person renting or having been granted the use of the ground for the time being, to keep order, shall be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these Regulations. these Regulations.

(23) Upon application to the committee, any club, association, society or person may be granted the exclusive use of the reserve, or any well-defined part thereof, for the holding of cricket, football, tennis or bowling matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of this Regulation, and shall pay to the Committee of Management, or its authorized officers, such charge as the Committee of Management may from time to time fix.
