TOBACCO EXPERT (TEMPORARY), DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREAS FROM THE SHIRES OF COLAC, HEYTESBURY, AND WINCHELSEA, AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the ratepayers in the respective portions of the shires of Colac, Heytesbury, and Winchelsea, which are described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the shires of Colac, Heytesbury, and Winchelsea respectively, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Cape Otway."

Area described in petition :—

Commencing at a point on the coast at the mouth of the Wye River; thence following the course of that river and the northern boundary of the parish of Wongarra westerly to a point near Mount Sabine; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the parishes of Barramunga and Yaughar and westerly by the northern boundary of that parish and the parish of Nate Murrang; thence southerly by the western boundary of that parish and the parish of Newlingbrook; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Wirridgil; thence southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned parish and the parish of Latrobe to the coast; thence easterly along the coast to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that their reasons for desiring severance are :—

- That every part of the area is remote from the headquarters of the existing shires.
- That the whole area is in a backward and undeveloped condition.
- That this condition is due to the lack of interest on the part of the existing municipalities in the welfare of the area.
- That there is a community of interest in the area proposed to be constituted a new shire.
- That it is believed that the present neglected condition of the area can only be remedied by separation from the existing municipalities, so that the construction of roads, the absence of which is the cause of existing conditions, would be under the control of a council elected by ratepayers within the area.
- That it is in the direct interests of the State, as affecting the two unprofitable railway lines leading to the area, that present conditions should not continue any longer.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described and constitute it a separate municipality, under the name and title of "The Shire of Cape Otway."

By-law No. 15.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1919 for water within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1919.

2. The minimum rates for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street; Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Main-street, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-road, from Station-street to High-street; Bank-street, from Punt-road to High-street; and High-street, from Queen-street to Pine-street—a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

5. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made, payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1919.

7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water pipe supplying any allotment, house, or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of such allotment, house, or tenement, but the Trust may submit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments, with interest added.

8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement, in any case where it may deem necessary.

9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

10. For water supplied by measure a charge of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed 4 inch in diameter. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

5. A minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) and a maximum rate of Two pounds (£2) sterling shall be charged any person, as the Commissioners may determine, for using water for garden watering during the year in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such water is used.

6. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply, nor will allow any water to be taken under clauses 5 and 6, until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

7. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable on the first day of March, 1919.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.

Regulations re Certificates of Qualification.

1. The Board will grant a certificate of qualification, without examination, as follows:—

- (a) To any holder of a certificate of qualification as municipal engineer granted after examination by the examining committee appointed under the *Local Government Act 1906* of New South Wales; or
- (b) To any corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London, who can produce evidence that he has for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by municipal surveyors or engineers; or
- (c) To any graduate who holds the degree of M.C.E. or of B.C.E. of the University of Melbourne (or the corresponding degree of any University whose graduates in civil engineering are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*), who can produce evidence that he has for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by a municipal surveyor or engineer; or
- (d) To any applicant who shall possess such other engineering qualifications and experience as in the opinion of the Board are equivalent to one of the before-mentioned qualifications.

2. The Board will grant a certificate of qualification after partial examination as follows:—

- (a) To any applicant who has had one (1) year's practical experience in civil engineering work, and holds the degree of M.C.E. or of B.C.E. of the University of Melbourne (or the corresponding degree of any University whose graduates in civil engineering are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*) on passing the Board's examination in "Road and Street Engineering"; or
- (b) To any applicant who has had one (1) year's practical experience in civil engineering work, and holds the certificate of Engineer of Water Supply granted after examination by the Board of Examiners appointed under the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, on passing the Board's examination in "Road and Street Engineering"; or
- (c) To any applicant who has had two (2) years' practical experience in civil engineering work and holds the certificate of Land Surveyor granted after examination by the Board of Examiners for land surveyors of any Australian State or of the Dominion of New Zealand, or of Mining Surveyor granted after examination by the Mining Surveyors Board of Victoria on passing the Board's examination in "Principles of Engineering Construction," and in "Drainage and Sanitary Engineering," and in "Road and Street Engineering."

3. On each certificate of qualification shall be stated—

- (a) the qualification in respect of which it is issued;
- (b) whether it is granted without examination, or, if after partial examination, the subjects in which the applicant was examined.

4. In all cases an applicant must submit satisfactory documentary evidence in detail as to his experience, and satisfy the Board that the rights conferred by the certificate, diploma, or membership in virtue of which he makes his application have not been cancelled or suspended.

5. A certificate will not issue to any applicant until he has satisfied the Board that he has attained the age of twenty-three (23) years, and satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, as to respectability of character. No person will be eligible who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

6. Each application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of Three guineas (£3 3s.).

7. Every applicant for a certificate of qualification must legibly give his name in full and post-address, in the margin of his letter of application, which should be addressed to—
