## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Rating By-law:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, supplied otherwise than by meter in all parts where the main pipes of the Trust shall have been extended (the minimum for each house or building to be Thirty shillings), according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1920, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1920.

The rate or charge on the property of the Railway Department, and controlled by the Council of the shire of Euroa as a park or crescent, shall be by measure at the charge of One penny per thousand gallons for such water that may be consumed.

Such rate shall be payable in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1920, and the second instalment on the 1st day of July, 1920.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

## ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920, FIXED BY THE COMMISSIONERS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POWERS CONFERRED ON THEM UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1920 in respect to water supplied to them by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

No. 1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the municipal value of £17 and under the sum of One pound six shillings (£1 6s.) shall be paid.

No. 2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant lands, of the municipal value of £18 and up to £20 One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the £1 shall be paid; all properties over £20 shall pay One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the £1 provided that no ratepayer under this Regulation pays less than £2 5s. per annum.

No. 3. The rate to be paid for vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the £1 according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case the rate shall be less than Fifteen shillings (15s.) per annum.

No. 4. For water supplied to public troughs in the streets, except council troughs, a charge of Two pounds (£2) per annum shall be paid.

No. 5. That water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, and upon such terms, and subject to such conditions, as the Trust and persons requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

No. 6. For water supplied by meter a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that no person pays less than the preceding Regulations, and 1s. per 1,000 for all in excess.

No. 7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920.

No. 8. Water must not be used for other than strictly domestic purposes during the hours of (12) noon and 8 p.m. on Sundays, during the months of January, February, March, October, November, and December.

For the purpose of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

Such persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect and recover the said rates and charges, and enforce Regulations.

## RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920, No. 25.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land. Provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling; and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

6. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—15,000 gallons for the first 20s. of the assessed water rate, and for each additional 20s. of assessed rate or portion thereof at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons; all excess water shall be charged for at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1920. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

10. No person without previously having affixed a water meter to his service pipes shall use for other than domestic purposes water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

11. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the Secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

12. Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

13. Every meter must be fixed truly level, with connexions above ground, approved by the Trust's supervising officer, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within three feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bends must be fixed on each side of the meter, or lead connexions used. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

14. The Trust will, upon application, supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery, or on time-payment on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash deposit, and balance bearing interest of 8 per cent. per annum by annual payments of Ten shillings.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law:—

## By-law No. 16.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners, of lands and tenements liable to be rated or other persons shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of the water supplied in the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or any other tenement and the land (if any) valued therein shall be paid; the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings (20s.). In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound according to the municipal valuation of such land. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.

2. For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.

3. For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months during the year 1920 the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been unoccupied, but in no case shall the rate be less than Thirteen shillings.

4. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the 1st January, 1920, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1920.

5. For water supplied for domestic or other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure the charge shall (except where it is otherwise agreed by the Trust and save as it is hereafter provided in this By-law) be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons till the amount payable equals the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises so supplied and thereafter and over and above the quantity at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons till the amount of such assessed rate is reached, all water consumed shall be charged and paid for at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons.

6. The charge for private water troughs shall be Twenty shillings each per annum (to include the water rate payable when the value of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed Ten pounds). When such rate exceeds Ten pounds there shall be no charge additional to the rate assessed on the property except where in the opinion of the Trust a meter is necessary or advisable, in which case the consumer will be charged and must pay at the rate charged for water supplied by measure. The minimum charge will be Twenty shillings.

7. Water supplied to public gardens, cricket grounds, and bowling greens shall be charged by measurement at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter, and paid for half-yearly.

8. The charge for water supplied from any stand-pipe or hydrant shall be Sixpence (6d.) for any quantity up to 200 gallons, and Sixpence (6d.) for each additional 200 gallons or portion of 200 gallons.

9. For a supply of water during the erection of new buildings or alterations to, or additions to existing buildings, the charge shall be Five shillings per centum on the amount of the contract price for a stone or brick or concrete building, or the same shall be fixed by agreement with the Trust. For a supply of water for erection of wooden buildings with plastered walls, the charge shall be £1 for each such building. For a supply of water for wooden buildings with no plastered walls the charge shall be Ten shillings for each such building. All payments shall be made in advance. No person shall take or use any water for or in connexion with the erection of any new building or alterations to or addition to existing buildings till he has obtained the receipt of the Trust's officer for payment of the amount payable for use of such water, or the consent in writing of the Trust or its officer. Any person offending against the provisions hereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence. All such charges shall be additional to all rates or other charges payable by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which the building is being erected, and shall in the first instance be payable by the builder or contractor, if unpaid by the builder or contractor shall be charged to and paid by the owner of the premises whereon such building is being erected, but such charge to the owner shall not prejudice the right of the Trust to proceed at its option against either the builder or the contractor or the owner or the occupier for the amount so payable.

10. The occupier of two or more tenements liable to be rated, one of which is supplied with water, by measure, shall be entitled upon payment of the rates of such tenements respectively to use without further charge such a quantity of water by meter as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure on the amount of such rates; provided that the tenement or tenements not supplied by measure shall not be connected with the pipes of the Trust.

11. The occupiers of two or more tenements each of which is supplied by water by measure shall be entitled to use without further charge such a quantity of water at either or both such tenements as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure, the total amount at which such tenement, if not supplied by measure, would be rated.

12. The water used or supplied for gas engines, oil engines, or steam boilers, the charge shall be by measure; the minimum amount to be charged and paid shall be Twenty shillings, to be paid and payable in advance in each case. No water will be supplied to any such engine or boiler until a meter has been affixed to the supply pipe of such engine or boiler to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust, and no water will be supplied to any engine unless such engine is fitted with mechanical appliances to circulate and re-use the water to the satisfaction of the Trust's officer.

13. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly, in each case where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes shall (except where otherwise implied or provided by this By-law) be 10,000 gallons, and such water shall (where it is not otherwise provided by this By-law or otherwise specially agreed by the Trust) be charged at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons.

14. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charges as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payments appointed by the Trust on account of such charge shall be paid at the offices of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

15. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid and each of them.

16. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Hamilton Waterworks Trust."

## UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated, the minimum rate to be Twenty shillings.

2. Water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes during January, February, March, November, and December shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and the minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at Sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The above rate is for one year commencing on the first day of January, 1920, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1920, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the first April and on the first October, 1920.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rate and charge.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1920 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound ten shillings.
2. A rate of Fifteen shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.
5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the 1st day of April, 1920.
6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following rates are those which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District:—

A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties, and shall be paid in equal moieties on the 1st day of January, 1920, and the 1st day of July, 1920.

A minimum rate of Twenty shillings shall be paid on all properties valued at £4 sterling and over, and a minimum rate of Ten shillings shall be paid on all allotments of land on which there is no building and valued at less than £4 sterling; all water supplied by the Trust for domestic use and for other than domestic use shall be charged for by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust). Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons or at such price as may be specially agreed upon.

The minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at Sixpence every 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.**  
RATING BY-LAW, 1920.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities contained by Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law numbered 39 fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1920.

The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District who are supplied with water by the Trust, as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement not being a hotel or wine-shop, of the annual value of £20 or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement not being a hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding the annual value of £200 the sum of £5 per cent. on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement not being a hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £200 the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of £30 or under a minimum rate of Two pounds per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30 the sum of 6 per cent. per annum on the valuation provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which there is no tenement erected, nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on the charge to be in accordance with rates fixed in this By-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach and hotel stables at the rate of Ten shillings per annum on the first stall and 7s. 6d. for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered one stall. For horses kept on private premises Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept and 7s. 6d. for each additional horse kept. Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. per annum each. Water troughs Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter is to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons except to manufacturers, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied by meter separate from house connexions for irrigation for gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for brickwork, stonework or plastering, or should the Trust require a meter to be put on, it shall be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920, except in cases where the Trust has made special agreement regarding the time for payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust from time to time may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect or recover such rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure except in the case of special agreement with the Trust shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing By-law, number 39, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this tenth day of November, 1919.

(2) subject to the jurisdiction of the Fish and Poultry Board:

Also, that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Restaurant Board.

(II.) That a Special Board consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons engaged in any work connected with the sale of intoxicating liquors in a hotel or in any premises for which a Colonial wine licence is in force or which are occupied as a club: Also that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Hotel Board.

(III.) That the area or locality within which each of the Determinations of the said Restaurant Board and the said Hotel Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, all cities and towns, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

There shall be added to the list of explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1 made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality and character of which are hereby defined:—

## CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUNDS.

## Division 1.

"Seven C's"—consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of sodium, woodmeal, collodion cotton and glauber salt, with or without calcium or magnesium carbonate, provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 62 per cent., and that the proportion of collodion cotton does not amount to less than 3 per cent.

*Special Plastic Gelignito*—

*Special Winter Gelignito*—

Consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened with nitro-cotton and incorporated with nitrate of sodium and woodmeal, with or without flour, mineral jelly, calcium carbonate or magnesium carbonate, provided the nitro-glycerine is not more than 63 per cent or less than 58 per cent., and the calcium or magnesium carbonate does not exceed 1 per cent. of the finished explosive.

No. 2686) it is enacted that the Governor in Council, on the application of the council of any municipality, and being satisfied that the special circumstances of the case require it, may make regulations for declaring the maximum weight to be carried in or by means of any vehicle on any public road in the district of such municipality or in the portion of such district which is mentioned in such Regulation: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, to apply within the municipality of the city of Caulfield, viz:—

No person shall in or by means of a vehicle carry on any main road and public road within the municipal district of the city of Caulfield, a greater weight than the next mentioned (that is to say):—

For each wheel of any four-wheeled vehicle a total weight of three hundredweight avoirdupois for each half-inch of width of bearing surface of the tire or felloe, and for each wheel of any two-wheeled vehicle a total weight of two and two-thirds (2 $\frac{2}{3}$ ) hundredweight for each half-inch of width of bearing surface of the tire or felloe. The weight of the vehicle shall in all cases be reckoned as part of the weight which may be so carried.

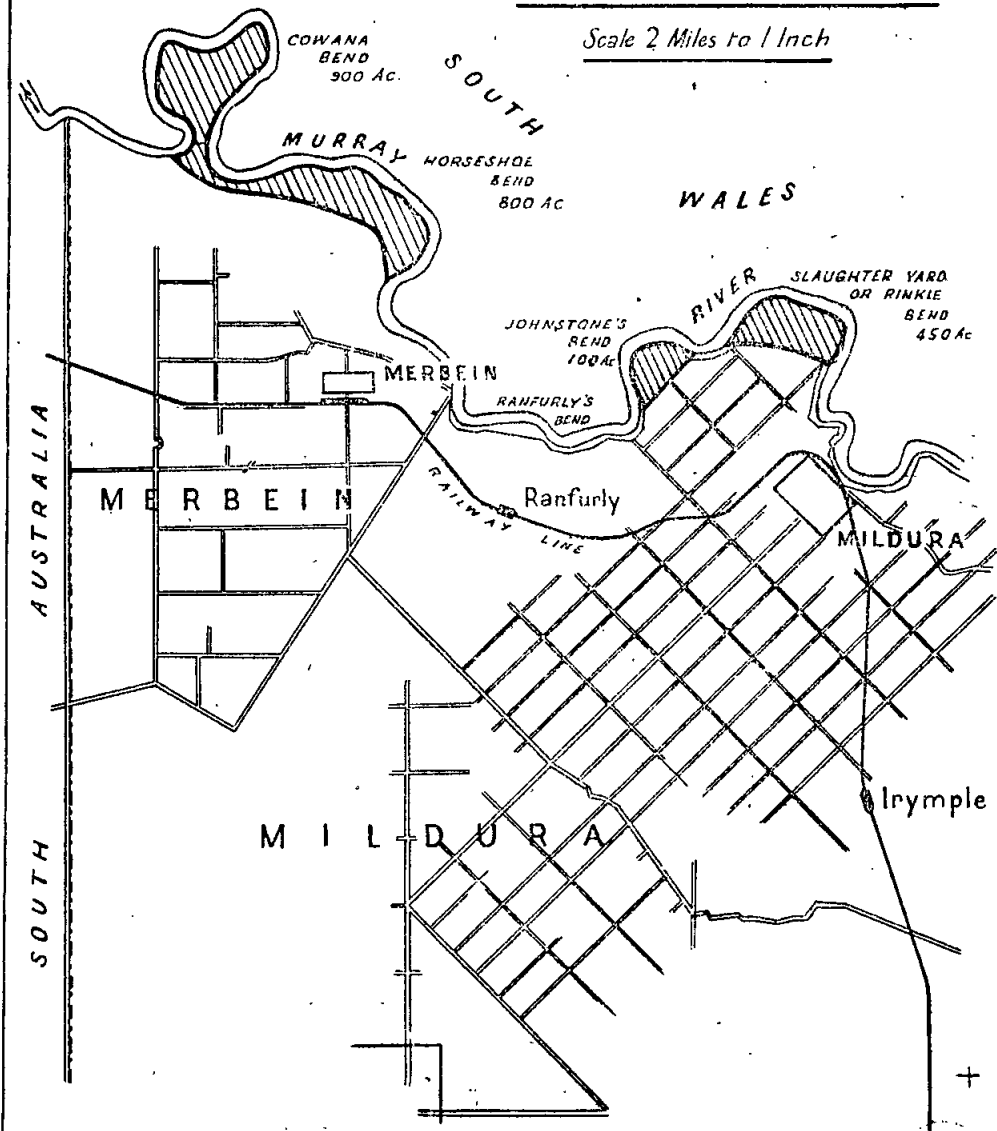

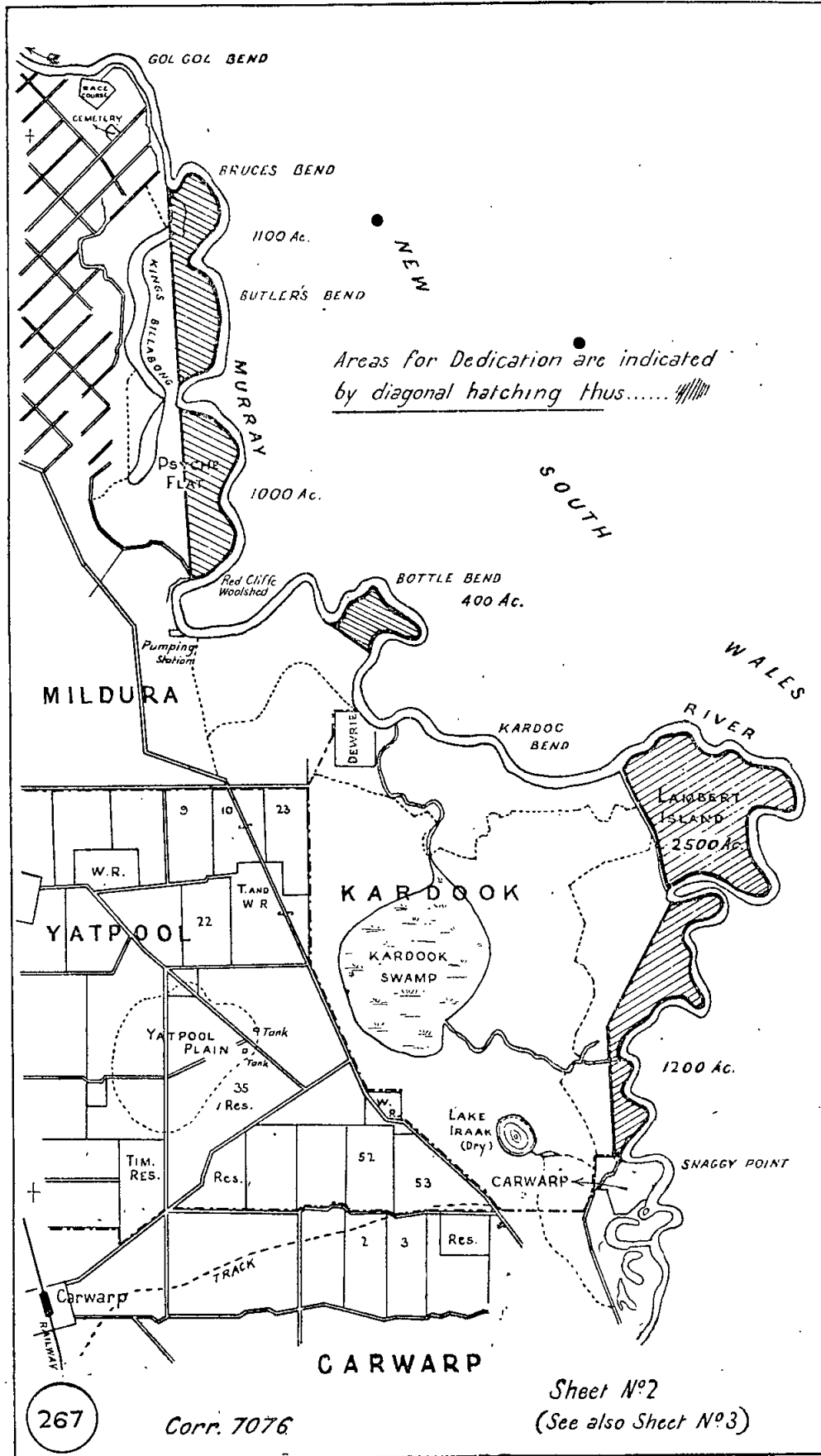


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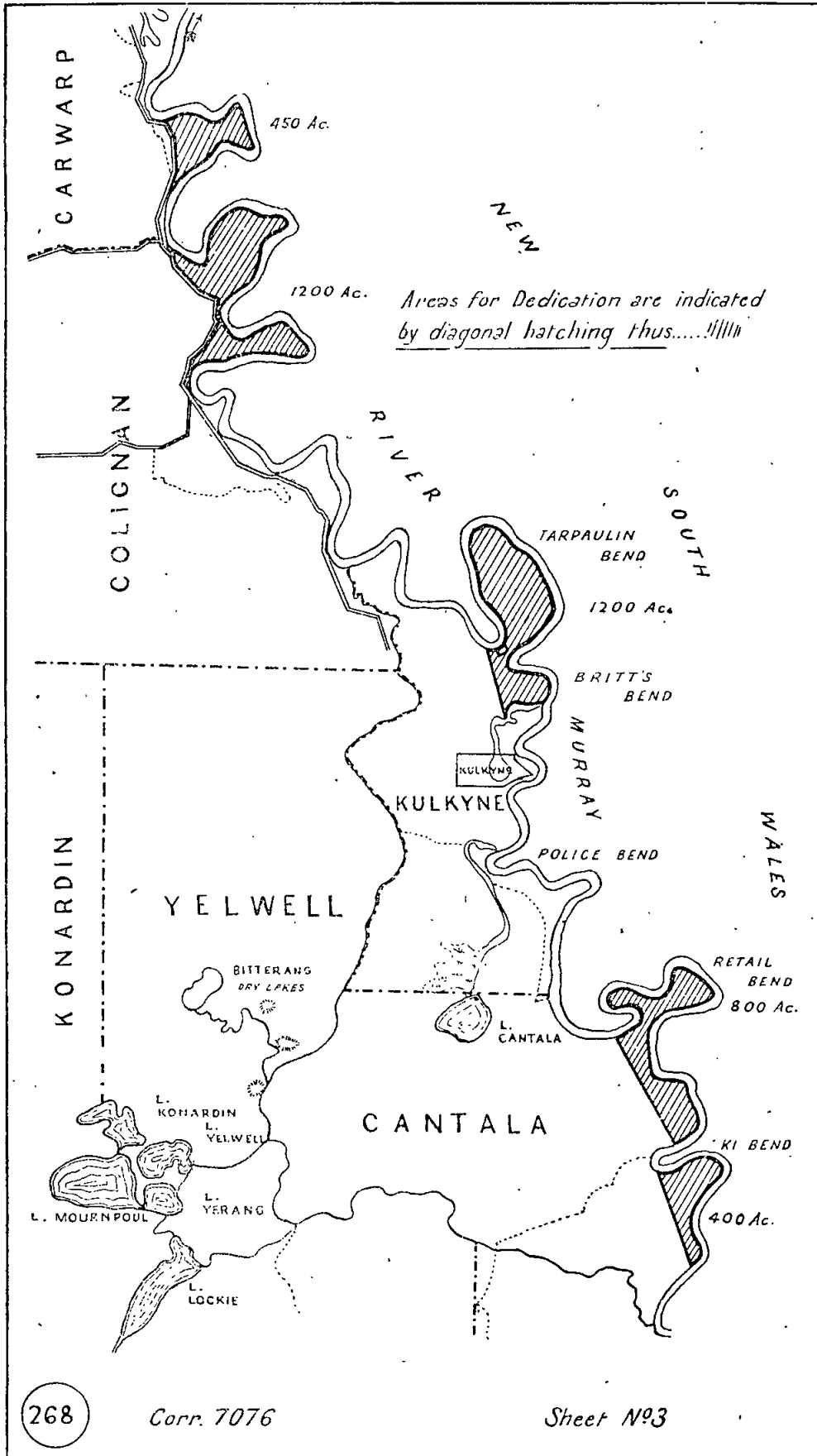

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure, by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and

- arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

**REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.**

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of Caulfield of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE.

By-LAW No. 92.

A By-law of the City of Port Melbourne made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 92 for the protection, maintenance and management of the gardens and reserves in the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Port Melbourne order as follows:—

1. The word "gardens" wherever used in this By-law shall mean and include all land reserved in Port Melbourne for ornamental purposes, and all tree reserves in the public streets.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the gardens, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

3. No person shall pluck any flower or damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, flowers, seats, fences or other property in the gardens, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except by a person authorized by the Council.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, or gates, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or buildings, or cut names or letters on the fences, trees, seats or buildings in the gardens.

5. No person shall bring into the gardens, any cattle, goat, horse, pig, fowl or other animal; and the owner of any cattle, goat, horse, pig, fowl or other animal, found in any gardens under the management and control of the Council shall be liable to a penalty as provided under clause 21 of this By-law.

6. No person shall bring into or have in the gardens any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

7. Any dog, goat or fowl found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace in a Court of Petty Sessions for any damage done.

8. No vehicle shall be allowed in the gardens, without the permission in writing of the Council, and no person shall ride, or drive in the gardens. (The expression vehicle in this By-law shall include a vehicle propelled by mechanical power and a bicycle.)

9. No person shall throw any stones or other missiles in the gardens or commit any nuisance, or leave any bottles, cast-off clothing, refuse, rubbish of any kind, or dead animals in the gardens. No person shall leave or deposit therein any fruit skins, paper or litter except in the bins provided for that purpose.

10. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the gardens, and to be prosecuted.

11. No person shall hawk or offer for sale any goods, or articles of any description in the gardens without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

12. No person shall play football, cricket, lacrosse, baseball, rounders or any game in the gardens.

13. No person shall train for any sports within the gardens; and no footracing or athletic sports of any kind shall take place within the gardens.

14. No band of music, or entertainment of any sort shall be permitted in the gardens without permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

15. No assemblies for fetes or concerts, or for the purposes of public worship, preaching, or public speaking, or any kind of meeting of a like character shall take place in the gardens, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

16. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers, or employees of the Council employed in the gardens, by conversation or otherwise.

17. No betting or gambling shall be allowed within the gardens.

18. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the Council of the said city from closing the gardens or any portion thereof, and excluding the public therefrom, whenever they think fit, or prevent such Council from holding or permitting entertainments in the gardens or any portion thereof; and excluding therefrom for such time as they think fit all persons but those who pay the sum fixed for admission thereto. Notices shall be posted on the entrance gates, when the gardens or any portions thereof are closed to free access. Any person found in any of the gardens under the management and control of the Council, which have been, by order of the Council, closed to the public shall be liable to the penalty provided under clause 21 of this By-law.

19. In addition to the provisions of this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper care and management of the gardens as shall seem to them fit.

20. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the gardens under the management and control of the Council, which have been, by order of the Council, closed to the public shall be liable to the penalty provided under clause 21 of this By-law.

21. Any person offending against this By-law or any regulation made in pursuance with this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

The portion of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890* relating to public gardens, viz. sections 3 to 12 of Division 2 of Part IV., adopted under By-law 72 is hereby repealed.
