AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 10.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal value.

3. Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand gallons (10,000).

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per thousand gallons (1,000).

5. Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

6. For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter, and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.

8. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

9. In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to make a special charge.

10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.

12. For all tenements in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, shall be one-quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1920.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1920.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1920 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust, which district has for the purposes of the Water Acts been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be made on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

3. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).

4. For every livery, coach, and carriers' stables, the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, each six feet is to be considered one stall.

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of January, 1920.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The following rate is made for the year 1920, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1920, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1920, on the annual value of all rateable property within the Trust District, according to the municipal valuation for the time being thereof, that is to say:—

A rate of Fourpence (4d.) in the pound sterling on such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the 1st day of January, 1920.

Such person or persons as the said Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rate.

BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1920:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1920, and ending on the 31st December, 1920, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of £20 annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £20, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal value thereof.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of Twenty shillings will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at a rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service-pipe for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—
 - (1) For domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.
 - (2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- (l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.
- (m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under the By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1920, and on the first day of July, 1920.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1, 1920

THE Tatura Waterworks Trust in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of all lands and tenements within the district of the said Waterworks Trust comprised in and affected by any notice or notices heretofore or hereafter to be published in the *Government Gazette* pursuant to sections 236 and 237 of the *Water Act 1915*:—

For the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure—

- (a) For all lands and tenements within the said district excepting and excluding all lands set out and described in paragraph (b) hereof, a rate of One shilling and tenpence in the £1 of the rateable value of such lands.
- (b) For every Crown allotment and lesser piece of land upon which no building is erected, or which is unoccupied or vacant, and which is not supplied with water, a rate of Ten shillings for every such Crown allotment or lesser piece thereof.

2. Such rate is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1920, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1920, and shall be payable in equal half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the first day of January and July in the year 1920.

3. The valuation for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district for the municipal rate in the municipal district of the shire of Rodney, in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rates.

4. Water will also be supplied by measurement, and in such case the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter and maintain the same in good working order, and pay for the water according to measurement thereby at the rate following:—

- (a) For stean boilers at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) For shire water troughs, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (c) In all other cases, water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons until the amount payable equals the amount of the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied. Excess water over and above such amount will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to 200,000 gallons; over and above 200,000 gallons Sixpence for each additional 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will in each case be fixed by the Trust.

5. Water will also be supplied for the year in paragraph 2 hereof set out for watering gardens according to the area thereof, and the following scale of charges payable yearly in advance on the 1st January, 1920, is hereby fixed for water supplied otherwise than by measure for watering gardens:—

- (a) For water supplied solely for watering gardens not exceeding in area 75 square yards, Ten shillings.
- (b) For water supplied solely for watering gardens not exceeding in area 150 square yards, Twenty shillings.

6. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment of such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

7. The minimum amount to be paid for water supplied by measurement for domestic purposes only, or both for domestic purposes and for purposes other than domestic combined, shall be the amount which, at One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied other than by measure.

8. For water supplied by measure the minimum charge thereof being the same amount as the rate for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, shall be paid half-yearly in advance upon the same days as the said rate is hereinbefore made payable and shall be deemed to be in satisfaction of the said rate; and the excess over and above the amount allowed by the rate shall be paid upon demand, in writing, immediately after the amount thereof shall be ascertained by the reading of the meter at the end of each year.

9. In no case will water be supplied to any person whatsoever at a lesser rate or charge than Twenty shillings sterling per annum.

10. Such person or persons as the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate, and all moneys made payable hereunder.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1920.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which all householders, or occupiers, or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water by the said Trust for the year 1920:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds and not exceeding Thirty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Thirty pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (d) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- (e) A minimum rate of One pound five shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening or stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (f) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum. Provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust District, a rate of Fifteen shillings per annum will be charged.
- (g) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes the quantity used in excess shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (h) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brick and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract, then upon the value, or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention to do so.

(i) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

(j) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.

(2) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1920, and the 1st day of July, 1920.

(3) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1920.

WHEREAS by section 31, sub-section (a), of the *Dairy Supervision Act 1915* the Governor in Council is empowered, on the application of the Council of any municipal district, whether wholly or partly within a Milk Area or not, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part or parts or in any part of such area or district: And whereas the Council of the municipal district of the city of Hawthorn has applied to the

Governor in Council to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows in the following specified area of such municipality:

Commencing at the junction of Burke-road with Toorak-road; thence westerly by Toorak-road to Toorong-road; thence northerly by Toorong-road to Wiseman-street; thence westerly by Wiseman-street to Auburn-road; thence northerly by Auburn-road to Currajong-road; thence westerly from Currajong-road by Kembala-street and Callantina-road to Fordholm-road; thence northerly by Fordholm-road to Haldane-street; thence westerly by Haldane-street to the River Yarra; thence following the course of the said river to its junction with Barker's-road; thence easterly by Barker's-road to Burke-road; thence southerly by Burke-road to the commencing point.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one District must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oatens, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatens hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

SHIRE OF MILDURA.

BY-LAW No. 34.

THE Council of the shire of Mildura doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2636), and section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915* (No. 2708), and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order and direct that the following By-law, Rules, and Regulations shall be observed and enforced within the said shire:—

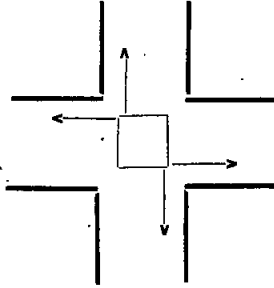
- In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—
 "Council" means the Council of the shire of Mildura.
 "Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat, and swine species respectively.
 "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car.
 "Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.
 "Horse" includes mule and donkey.
 "Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.
 "Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire other than a footway.
 "Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.
 "Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.
 Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC GENERALLY.

2. The driver of a vehicle or motor car upon any street, and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any street, shall, except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

- Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.
- When meeting a vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian keep on the left or near side of the street.
- When passing by any vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian going in the same direction, go on the right or off side of such vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian.
- Before stopping or turning round in any street, or turning from one street into another, give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following, and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or a motor car) upon stopping, so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic; and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall, upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car, or by any member of the police force or officer of the Council, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass; and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

- (5) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left-hand side of the street which he is entering, as shown in the subjoined diagram.



- (6) Not leave the same unattended except for a few minutes only, and except it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic. This clause shall apply only to the following streets and avenues:—Langtree-avenue, from 7th to 9th streets; Deakin-avenue, from 7th to 9th streets; and 8th-street, from Langtree to Madden avenue inclusive.
- (7) Cause the same to be drawn as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side of the street and parallel thereto, and brought to a stand-still on the approach of and during the passing of any fire engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to scene of any fire.
- (8) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers, do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side.
- (9) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any other person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow, or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle or motor car.

3. Every driver of a motor car or bicycle upon any street shall, within reasonable distance and before passing any other vehicle or motor car, horse, or pedestrian, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell, or other instrument.

4. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, drive any motor car upon any street, or permit any motor car to be upon any street, unless good and serviceable lamps suitable to such motor car securely fixed one at each side of the front of such motor car, and are lighted and are so placed that the lights therefrom are distinctly visible to persons in front of such motor car as white lights and to persons at the rear of such motor car as red lights. Provided that in any case where a red tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear.

5. The driver of every vehicle which shall be driven or be upon any highway during the period between sunset and the following sunrise, save and except the like periods during four nights immediately preceding the full moon, the night of full moon, and two nights thereafter, shall cause to be fixed outside such vehicle and on the right or off-side thereof a lamp, which shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light visible in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding, and sufficient to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the vehicle; and shall, during the said period, keep such lamp properly lighted. Provided always that this By-law shall not apply to any vehicle which is by any statutory enactment, or by any rule, regulation, or order made under any statutory enactment and for the time being in force, required to carry a lamp or lamps in any other manner.

6. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street, or permit any vehicle or motor car to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle or motor car is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle or motor car, and no person while driving any vehicle or motor car upon any street shall occupy such position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

7. No person shall ride any horse or other animal, or drive or impel any vehicle or motor car upon any footway. Provided, however, that bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

8. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his right-hand side of the footway, and shall, when meeting or overtaking any person, pass on his left-hand side of such person.

9. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon.

10. Every person shall at all times obey and conform to any notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Shire President, or, in his absence or in the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Shire Secretary or the officer in charge of the police, and shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any member of the police force or officer of the Council.

11. Upon any member of the police force or officer of the Council, in order to enforce the due observance of any law, by-law, regulation, or lawful notice, holding up his hand or giving an order or direction as such member of the police force or officer of the Council deems necessary to allow free space between any persons, procession, or vehicles, or for cross traffic, or for any other like purpose.

12. If any horse or vehicle or motor car in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by any member of the police force or officer of the Council to remove such horse, vehicle, or motor car, remove the same either from the vicinity or to some adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as is indicated by the member of the police force or officer of the Council.

13. Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any direction, order, or request given or made as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

14. Whenever for the prevention of accidents or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the President, or in his absence or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Shire Secretary or the officer in charge of the local police, any carriage-way, footway, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both; and the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notices shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicle thence, and, if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force.

15. No person shall allow any cattle to graze or wander upon any land, whether public or private, not enclosed by a substantial fence within block D and Williamstown, and within any other avenue named or referred to by regulation from time to time.

16. No person shall, in or upon any street or footpath, or any land or place under the control of the Council, be guilty of any disorderly or indecent conduct, or use any obscene, indecent, or offensive language. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Council or member of the police force to arrest any person found offending against any provisions of this clause.

17. No person shall expose for sale or exhibit any goods or merchandise upon any street or footway.

18. No person shall interfere with, remove, deface, injure, or destroy any statue, monument, or erection in any street or public place, or in any garden, plantation, or enclosure under the control of the Shire Council, or any building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, or erection in any such street or public place.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN RESERVES FOR ORNAMENTAL PLANTATIONS AND FOR ROAD AND ORNAMENTAL PURPOSES IN THE SHIRE OF MILDURA.

Regulations.

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserves, or any of them, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.

2. No person shall interfere with, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, or any property in the Reserves, or any of them, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in the Reserves, or any of them, any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in or around the Reserves, or any of them, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into the Reserves, or any of them, any dog unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by any caretaker or constable.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserves, or any of them, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

6. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Reserves, or any of them, without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

7. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Council, shall offer for sale in the Reserves, or any of them, any article, fruit, or merchandise.

8. Any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from the Reserves, or any of them, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserves, or any of them, and to be prosecuted.

9. No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, truck, or barrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserves, or any of them, without the consent in writing of the Council first obtained.

10. No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserves, or any of them, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.

11. No horse with a rider shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserves, or any of them, except on the portions thereof specially provided for equestrians.

12. No horse shall be broken in or trained in the Reserves, or any of them.

13. No bicycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserves, or any of them, except on the portions thereof specially provided for bicyclists.

14.
