Midwives Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE REGISTRATION AND BETTER TRAINING OF MIDWIVES.

THE Midwives Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Midwives Acts, doth hereby amend as follows Regulations made by the said Board on the 19th day of February, 1918, for the Registration and Better Training of Midwives:—

In Regulation 4 of Part III., paragraph (b) is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(b) (1) The systematic lectures on Midwifery, Care and Feeding of Infants, and general nursing, shall be given only by a medical practitioner approved by the Board.

(2) The practical instruction in the duties of a midwife, in the preparation of infants' foods, in general nursing, or in conducting of labours, and in nursing lying-in women and infants, shall be given only by a medical practitioner approved by the Board, or by a registered midwife approved by the Board for these purposes. Such registered midwife shall have had hospital experience to the satisfaction of the Board.

(3) The lectures and demonstrations on, and practical instruction in, invalid cookery, shall be given only by a person approved by the Board for these purposes.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 67.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any position specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in such public notice.

2. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be not less than the minimum, nor more than the maximum, age specified in the public notice for the particular grade.

3. The height of every candidate shall not be less than the minimum height prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

4. The salary or wage of every successful candidate on appointment and thereafter shall, subject to the conditions specified in the public notice, be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

5. Every successful candidate for employment in the grade of Junior Clerk, Apprentice, Lad, Labourer, or Lad Porter who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary or wage be granted an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses if so entitled by the Regulation in operation for the time being and the conditions specified in the public notice.

6. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the public notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

7. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age; but every such candidate who is selected will be required to take immediate steps to obtain an official Birth Certificate from the State or country in which he was born.

8. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and, if he has left such service, the cause of his leaving.

9. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for cause, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

10. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

11. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 17 to 28 inclusive of this Regulation.

12. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

13. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

14. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

15. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

16. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

17. Every such candidate, and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

18. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

19. Every such candidate shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass the educational examination prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

20. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, as well as certificates, indentures, or other satisfactory evidence that he possesses the requisite qualifications prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade, and shall furnish the names of any persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years; and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct from the Head of the particular Branch in which he is or may have been employed.

21. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

22. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby certify that on the* 19, we examined† in the for the position of Branch, and allotted him marks, and accordingly certify that he is for such employment.

} Examiners.

23. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c., shall be determined by a ballot conducted in the manner prescribed in Clause 25.

24. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the method prescribed in Clause 25 to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz.:—

25. Two ballot-boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

26. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade for which he is a candidate during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

27. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

28. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

29. Every Apprentice shall, immediately after appointment, attend, at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, or such other institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, the classes of instruction appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which, subject to the provisions of Clause 34, shall extend over a period of three years.

30. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution at his own expense, but the Commissioners will pay the fees of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution.

31. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

32. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the three-years' period of tuition at the Working Men's College, School of Mines, or other such Institution may be adjudged first and second in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in the public notice, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

33. The Apprentice who, at the end of the third year of tuition, is adjudged first in order of merit amongst all Apprentices eligible under the conditions specified in the public notice, shall be nominated as a student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners),

and afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, or other such Institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the fees of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid an annual salary in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

34. Any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, and shall attend such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners, and shall pay the fees imposed in respect of such classes, and any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is adjudged guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, or to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, will render himself liable to the immediate termination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

35. The term of tuition at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution at the expense of the Department shall in every instance be limited to three years, and any apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay the fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution.

36. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Work-shops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the five years exceed sixty-five working days in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the five years exceeding sixty-five working days in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the five years for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

Health Acts.

REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS FOR FOODS AND DRUGS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby amend the Food Standard Regulations 1916 as follows:—

G. FLAVOURINGS AND COLOURINGS.

In Regulation 6 (2), add to the list of exempted articles the words "Preserved raspberries and preserved strawberries when coloured with harmless vegetable colouring."

28. MILK.

In Regulation 28, after paragraph (1), add new paragraphs as follow:—

Sterilized Milk.

(1) (a) Sterilized milk is standard milk which has been subjected to a sterilizing process. It shall not contain any pathogenic organisms or foreign matter.

Labelling.

(1) (b) A label bearing the words "Sterilized milk" in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than twelve points face measurement followed immediately by the words "This milk should not be used as the exclusive food of infants under the age of six months except under medical direction," in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than six points face measurement shall be attached to every receptacle containing sterilized milk; and in every case where sterilized milk is delivered other than in a receptacle to which such label is attached, the person so delivering shall at the same time deliver the prescribed label to the person receiving the milk.

36. COCOA.

In Regulation 36, paragraphs (5) and (6) are hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(5) Prepared cocoa is a compound of cocoa or soluble cocoa with other wholesome foodstuffs. It shall contain not less than twenty parts per centum by weight of fat-free cocoa as defined in paragraph (2).

Labelling.

(6) There shall be written in the label attached to every package containing prepared cocoa a statement showing the percentage proportion of fat-free cocoa and the names of the other ingredients contained in the compound, in the following form:—

This package contains

(Here insert in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than eight points face measurement the percentage proportion of fat-free cocoa and the names of the other ingredients contained in the compound.)

48. FRUIT AND FRUIT PRODUCTS.

In Regulation 48, paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) are hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

Preserved Fruit.

(1) (a) Preserved fruit is any sound fruit treated by drying or by any other physical process which has the effect of preventing fermentation or decomposition and without material alteration of shape of fruit as prepared for the preserving process.

(b) No substance may be added except sugar and water, and in the case of raspberries and strawberries harmless colouring matter; provided that any colouring other than vegetable shall be declared.

(c) In the case of dried fruits, sulphur dioxide gas may be used for bleaching purposes and the presence of not more than seven grains of sulphur dioxide (or sulphites calculated as SO_2) per pound unavoidably remaining from the bleaching process, shall not be deemed to constitute a contravention of this Regulation.

Fruit Juice and Crushed Fruit.

(2) (a) Fruit juice is the liquid obtained by subjecting sound fruit to crushing, pressure, and straining.

(b) Crushed fruit is the product obtained by subjecting sound fruit to any disintegrating process.

(c) No substance may be added except glycerine in proportion not exceeding ten parts per centum or sulphur dioxide (or sulphites calculated as SO_2) in proportion not exceeding seven grains per pint.

Labelling.

(3) There shall be written in the label attached to every package of preserved fruit, fruit juice or crushed fruit the name or names of the fruit or fruits contained in the package in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than eighteen points face measurement; and in the case of dried fruit containing more than two grains of sulphur dioxide per pound there shall be written in the label immediately following the name of the fruit or fruits the word "Sulphured" in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than eighteen points face measurement.

54. AERATED WATERS.

In Regulation 54 (4), under the heading "Labelling" the following words are hereby inserted before "There" in the first line:—"Except in the case of lithia, potash, and seltzer waters prepared as prescribed by the regulations."

60. LEMON SQUASH.

Regulation 60 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

60. LEMON JUICE.

(1) Lemon juice is the expressed juice of the sound fruit of citrus medica variety Limonum. It shall contain not less than six parts per centum of citric acid naturally present in the fruit.

Lemon Juice Cordial.

(2) Lemon juice cordial shall consist of lemon juice, sugar and potable water and shall contain not less than two parts per centum of citric acid naturally present in the fruit. It shall not contain any added substance except glycerine in proportion not exceeding ten parts per centum.

Lemon Squash.

(3) Lemon squash shall consist of lemon juice and shall not contain any added substance except sugar and preservative.

Preservative.

(4) To lemon juice, lemon juice cordial not containing any glycerine, and lemon squash there may be added sulphur dioxide (or sulphites calculated as sulphur dioxide) or salicylic acid (one but not both) in proportion not exceeding two grains to the pint.

62. SUMMER OR "TEMPERANCE" DRINKS.

In Regulation 62, after paragraph (2), the following paragraph is hereby added:—

(3) To summer or "temperance" drinks there may be added sulphur dioxide (or sulphites calculated as sulphur dioxide) in proportion not exceeding one grain to the pint. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1919.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1919.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. The rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of meters and special arrangements with the Trust) situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1919.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be payable.

3. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties; provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings per annum be payable.

4. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

5. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of not more than Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

6. For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

7. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

8. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, for domestic and garden purposes, will be charged for at One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

9. Ratepayers supplied with meters by the Trust shall pay an annual rental for such meters at 9s. per annum.

10. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

11. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* on the above scale.

12. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, according to clause 5 of this By-law.

13. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes; and any owner or occupier using more water than (in the opinion of the Trust or its officers) they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use except between the hours of seven o'clock a.m. and nine o'clock p.m.

14. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this By-law, provided that such spray shall only be used between the hours of seven o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock p.m.

15. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1919, and are payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year, excepting those by measure and special arrangement, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1919, No. 29.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1919 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-three pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement of more than Thirty-three pounds (£33) annual municipal value, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid.

4. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land if not more than Five pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Five shillings for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

5. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 54,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1919.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 12.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupier or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid or where houses or tenements if not fronting such street are supplied with water by reticulation and being of an annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of One pound (20s.).

2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10) the sum of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes and if not supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) in streets with no pipes and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound on the annual value of such property.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1919 and shall be payable on the 1st January, 1919.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust area, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of water supplied by special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust by special agreement may make a reduction to not less than Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the previous clauses the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also applies to the freezing works.

11. On properties where the officers consider it necessary a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off, according to the powers conferred by the Water Acts.

The foregoing By-law No. 12 was made by the Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts this 22nd day of August, 1918.

SHIRE OF TALBOT.

TALBOT WATER SUPPLY RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1919.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1919 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the shire of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District, also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such District.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under the sum of One pound (£1).

2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every hotel a rate of Six pounds per cent. on the value of such property.

4. Government Departments, railways and other properties supplied by meter a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.

5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Council the following charges shall be made:—

Post Office Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.

State School Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water-trough connected with hotels Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory mill tenement where steam machinery is attached and working the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of each property or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 210,000 gallons per acre and 105,000 gallons per half acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 210,000 gallons per acre where supplied from open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For the water supplied to mining companies dredges &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1919, and the 1st day of July, 1919, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Bena-Poowong road in the shire of Poowong and Jeetho (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th January, 1914, on page 93) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plans marked "A," "B" and "C" respectively and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plans and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

1. All that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 40, parish of Jeetho, county of Mornington: Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the western portion of the said allotment, at its junction with a Government road; thence bounded by lines bearing north 42 deg. 4 min. west 222 links, south 14 deg. 44 min. east 170.5 links, north 89 deg. 55 min. east 105.3 links to the point of commencement.
2. Also all that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 40 of the parish aforesaid: Commencing at the intersection of two lines on the westerly boundary of the Government road running through the said allotment, bearing north 9 deg. 31 min. west 137 links, and north 15 deg. 0 min. east 217.5 links respectively; thence bounded by lines bearing north 15 deg. 0 min. east 217.5 links, north 30 deg. 40 min. west 180 links, south 5 deg. 33 min. east 366.5 links to the point of commencement.
