TOBACCO EXPERT (TEMPORARY), DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

ELECTRIFICATION STAFF.

APPLICATIONS are invited from persons qualified to fill the following positions in connexion with the operation of the electrified sections of the Melbourne Suburban Railways.

The system employed is:—Generation at the power-house by means of 10,000 K.W. turbo-alternators of three phase current, transmission at 20,000 volts to the sub-stations, where it is converted by means of static transformers and rotary converters to direct current at 1,500 volts at which pressure it is supplied for the operations of the trains. The control of the supply of electrical energy to all parts of the system will be directed by the Control Engineer at the switching-room of the power-house.

Applicants must submit a statement setting out fully their general and technical education, apprenticeship, if any, experience to date, and where that experience was gained.

Applications must be accompanied by copies of testimonials covering as much of the applicant's experience as is practicable.

Applicants must state their age and say whether married or single; they must also state their nationality.

It is preferred that applicants for this position should have had operating experience in a power-house and sub-station on an extra high tension system.

5. Fixed steam boilers, exceeding two horse-power (excepting for flour mills), £3 per annum; and portable steam boilers, exceeding two horse-power, £2 10s. per annum.
6. Steam boilers, used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.
7. Water from the stand-pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.
8. Flour mills requiring water for milling purposes, a charge of 3d. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.
9. Victorian railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.
10. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.
11. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance namely on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1919, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.

For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1919.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding Thirty pounds—One pound five shillings per annum.

4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds, and not exceeding Forty pounds—One pound ten shillings per annum.

5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Forty pounds, and not exceeding Fifty pounds—One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifty pounds, and not exceeding Sixty pounds—Two pounds per annum.

7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Sixty pounds, and not exceeding Eighty pounds—Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Eighty pounds, and not exceeding One hundred pounds—Three pounds per annum.

9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds, and not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds—Four pounds per annum.

10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred and fifty pounds, and not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds—Five pounds per annum.

11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Two hundred and fifty pounds—Six pounds per annum.

12. Water from the stand-pipe and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—

A licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes—One pound per annum.

A licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only—Ten shillings per annum.

A licence to carry away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray—Five shillings per annum.

13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14. Water troughs—Five shillings per annum (providing ball regulating taps are used).

15. Livery stables—Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16. Hotel, with stabling (not being a livery stable)—Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

IV. (d), Swimming and Life-saving Certificates of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1915*, and doth make the following in lieu thereof, viz.:—

SWIMMING AND LIFE-SAVING.

Regulation IV. (d)—Swimming and Life-saving Certificates.

Junior Certificate.—A Junior Certificate will be awarded to candidates who can—

1. Swim 50 yards;
2. Float on the back for at least 60 seconds in salt water, or 30 seconds in fresh water, arm balancing movements being allowable;
3. Enter the water by a fairly neat dive;
4. Show practical acquaintance with the Schafer method of resuscitation.

Senior Certificate.—A Senior Certificate will be awarded to candidates who can—

1. Swim 100 yards by any stroke or strokes;
2. Swim 25 yards on the back without using the arms;
3. Swim 25 yards by the breast stroke;
4. Swim in clothes—Boys, 30 yards; to be dressed in leather boots or shoes, shirt, stockings, and serge or tweed coat and trousers. Girls, 20 yards; to be dressed in leather boots or shoes, stockings, bloomers, and serge or tweed blouse and skirt to knees (blouse and skirt may be combined);
5. Demonstrate diving, and jumping feet first with hands by sides, into deep water;
6. Perform successfully the following test:—A weighted dummy, or block of wood, with arms or rope handles, to be sunk not deeper than 5 feet at some distance (not exceeding 15 yards) from the place where the competitor is to enter the water. The competitor shall swim to the spot, dive, and bring the dummy to land at a place appointed. The place where it is sunk may be indicated by a floating cork, not to be attached to the dummy, except in running water.
7. To carry out successfully in the water one method of release and two methods of rescue.
8. Show a practical knowledge of land drill in the methods of rescue and release, both separately and in combination, as set forth in Part I. of the Handbook of the Royal Life-saving Society.
9. Show a knowledge of the theory and practice of resuscitation as set forth in Part II. of the Handbook of the Royal Life-saving Society.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Three thousand pounds (£3,000) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

A SUM of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting; forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1918, and 31st December, 1918, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1919. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A," and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B."
2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1918, and 31st December, 1918, but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1918.
3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1918 (vide Form "A"), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.
4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.
5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the city of Melbourne (except the Royal Park) or to Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

BY-LAW No. 198.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 190 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 198 for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of erections or hoardings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. A signboard, hanging lamp, steel or gas pipe, framed fixture, may be erected on or attached to any building or verandah, provided that it be of material, construction, and design approved by the city surveyor, and that it be in no part less than 9 feet above the level of the footpath beneath.

2. If the signboard be placed underneath a verandah it shall not exceed 10 inches in vertical height.

3. If the signboard be projected from a building where no verandah exists, it shall not exceed 10 inches in vertical height, and shall not extend more than 4 feet over any public street from the building line of such street.

4. No signboard shall exceed in vertical height 3 feet unless it be fixed flat against the wall or upon the roof of the main building.

5. No signboard shall project beyond the kerb alignment of any street.

6. Every signboard shall be fixed and stayed to the satisfaction of the City Surveyor.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district of South Melbourne, that is to say:—
