By-law No. 86.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined:-

- 1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.
- 2. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.
- 3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value. Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
- 4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value. Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of such land. Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements). rangements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable for watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly in advance on the first day of January, 1919.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust. in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—
The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of St. James, as such district has been proclaimed and defined:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds and upwards.

2. In respect of properties the annual municipal value of which is less than Fifteen pounds, upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as domiciles, the rate to be paid shall in each case be of such percentage, according to the municipal value thereof as shall produce the sum of One pound ten shillings. pound ten shillings.

3. A rate of Ten shillings on each allotment or piece of land, vacant or not built upon.

4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds.

5. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust. Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements). arrangements)

6. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

7. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly in advance on the first day of January, 1919.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

9. Victorian railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

10. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.

- 1. Swim 100 yards by any stroke or strokes;
- 2. Swim 25 yards on the back without using the arms;
- 3. Swim 25 yards by the breast stroke;
- Swim 25 yards by the bleast stoke;
 Swim in clothes—Boys, 30 yards; to be dressed in leather boots or shoes, shirt, stockings, and serge or tweed coat and trousers. Girls, 20 yards; to be dressed in leather boots or shoes, stockings, bloomers, and serge or tweed blouse and skirt to knees (blouse and skirt may be combined);
- Demonstrate diving, and jumping feet first with hands by sides, into deep water;
- Perform successfully the following test:—A weighted dummy, or block of wood, with arms or rope handles, to be sunk not deeper than 5 feet at some distance (not exceeding 15 yards) from the place where the competitor is to enter the water. The competitor shall swim to the spot, dive, and bring the dummy to land at a place appointed. The place where it is sunk may be indicated by a floating cork, not to be attached to the dummy, except in running water.
- To carry out successfully in the water one method of release and two methods of rescue.
- 8. Show a practical knowledge of land drill in the methods of rescue and release, both separately and in combination, as set forth in Part I. of the Handbook of the Royal Life-saving Society.

The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1918, and 31st December, 1918, but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1918.
- 3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1918 (vide Form "A"), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be mid as a whole interpreted, shall be mid as a whole interpreted, shall be mid as a whole interpreted. be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced pro rate.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 190 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 198 for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of erections or hoardings.

3. If the signboard be projected from a building where no verandah exists, it shall not exceed 10 inches in vertical height, and shall not extend more than 4 feet over any public street from the building line of such street.

4. No signboard shall exceed in vertical height 3 feet unless it be fixed flat against the wall or upon the roof of the main building.
