The system employed is:—Generation at the power-house by means of 10,000 K.W. turbo-alternators of three phase current, transmission at 20,000 volts to the sub-stations, where it is converted by means of static transformers and rotary converters to direct current at 1,500 volts at which pressure it is supplied for the operations of the trains. The control of the supply of electrical energy to all parts of the system will be directed by the Control Engineer at the switching-room of the power-house.

For all water supplied by meter Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons will be charged except in cases of special agreement.

For all water sold from the stand-pipe Sixpence (6d.) per 100 gallons will be charged and paid for on delivery.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1919, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1919, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1919.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be One pound.

2. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust). Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound.

3. For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District the charge shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust. Such minimum charge shall be computed at the charge of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling according to the municipal valuation of the properties so supplied and for all water used in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound.

All rates and charges other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety of the first day of January, 1919, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1919.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.
