REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
  - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
  - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

  4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to observed:
- character.
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

Note.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.
- 9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

### SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

 $10.\ A$  candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

### Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

### Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved bands boundaries.

### Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

### Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

### Use of Instruments.

(c) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

### Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; ele-mentary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

### Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, com-pilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

### Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates, holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

Certificates of Competency.

### CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. RATING BY-LAW FOR 1919 WITHIN THE BROADFORD URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following

By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to he rated, shall pay for the year 1919, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be paid half-yearly in advance in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1919.

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Thirty shillings.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The

minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For stand-pipe or bydrant water for each load of 250 gallons or under, One shilling.

(3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings. Five shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, brick work and plastering, or in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stone work, brick work, and plastering.

(4) All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid as agreed upon.

5th. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated, with a minimum charge of 10s. on such vacant land as is connected with a service pipe.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

"Baths" mean and include that water dam (under six acres) on the old Lord Nelson lease mine situate at St. Arnaud and commonly known as "The Lord Nelson Dam" and all buildings creeted by the Council and the Swimming Club.

"Council" means and includes the Council of the Borough

"Council" means and includes the Council of St. Arnaud of St. Arnaud. "Swimming Club" means and includes the St. Arnaud Swimming Club. "Supervisor" means and includes the person appointed by the Swimming Club to manage the baths and to protect the property of the Council and Swimming Club or any person appointed as his assistant.

### General Management.

2. A general management committee shall be appointed and shall consist of the Mayor and three members, for the time being, of the Council and three office-bearers of the Swimming

### Duties of General Management Committee.

3. The duties of the general management committee shall include enforcement of by-laws, care of the property of the Council and the Swimming Club and the balance of all profits if any at the end of each swimming season which shall be handed over by the Swimming Club for reduction of amount spent by the Council.

### Defacing Walls, &c.

4. No person shall deface any wall in the baths by writing or drawing or cutting thereon or in any way damage or injure any wall partition or other structure forming part of the

### Interference with Bathers.

5. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the baths by any other person.

### Intoxicants.

6. No person who in the opinion of the supervisor is under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall use the baths or remain on the baths premises when directed to withdraw.

### Obscene Language.

7. No person shall use obscene, indecent or offensive language in the baths.

### Discase.

No person shall resort to or use the baths while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease.

### Cleanliness

9. No person shall use the baths while in an unclean condition but may use the cleansing showers prior to using the

### Soap.

10. No person shall use soap or substance or preparation in the baths whereby the water of the baths may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of the bathers but may use soap in the shower enclosure only.

### Dress.

11. No person shall appear outside the dressing enclosure or enter the water unless wearing a Canadian neck-to-knee bathing dress. Children under twelve years of age may wear knickers

### Nuisance.

12. No person shall wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water or the surroundings of the baths or wilfully or improperly defile any dressing enclosure closet or fitting.

### Damage.

13. No person shall carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any fittings or conveniences pro-

### Sale of Goods.

14. No person shall without the written consent of the Mayor offer any article for sale upon the premises or bring upon the premises any intoxicating liquor.

### Dogs and Animals.

15. No person in charge of any dog or animal shall allow such dog or animal to remain upon the premises or enter the

### Interference with Supervisor.

16. No person shall obstruct hinder or interfere with the supervisor appointed by the Swimming Club or any person employed at the baths.

### Ladies.

17. No man or boy above the age of eight years shall enter or use any dressing enclosure or closet appointed or appropriated for the use of ladies and no man or boy above the age of eight years shall enter that part of the baths appointed for the use of ladies but ladies may use any part of the baths.

### Lost Property.

18. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any part of the baths shall immediately deliver same to any member of the committee of the Swimming Club and any person claiming such article upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership thereof may recover such article.

Right to Close Baths.

19. Notwithstanding the sale of tickets the Council may temporarily close the baths for the purpose of cleansing, repairs or any other purpose without incurring any liability to the holders thereof.

CLAUSE 2 of this By-law shall have force and effect throughout the shire of Mildura, clause 3 hereof within the area therein described.

2. No person shall in the months of February, March, and April within five miles of any horticultural block planted with trees and/or vines in bearing keep any hive or bees unless the same shall be so covered in as to prevent the bees therein from leaving the premises upon which the hive is situate.

3. Within the area situate within the following boundaries that is to say:—Commencing at the intersection of Cureton-avenue and Cherry-avenue; thence along Cherry-avenue to Ninth-street; thence along Ninth-street to its intersection with

Walnut-avenue; thence along Walnut-avenue to its intersection with Eleventh-street; thence along Eleventh-street to its intersection with San Mateo-avenue; thence along San Mateo-avenue to its intersection with Cureton-avenue; and thence along Cureton-avenue to the point of commencement at its intersection with Cherry-avenue aforesaid, or any subdivided area within Block D or Williamstown. No person shall keep any hive of bees unless the same shall be so covered in as to request the beauthers in the beauthers in the least therein from Leaving the contraction to the contraction of th prevent the bees therein from leaving the premises upon which such hive is situate.

4. The occupier of any premises upon which bees are kept shall at all reasonable times afford free access thereto to tne Inspector of Nuisances of the said shire or to any person specially appointed by the said Shire Council in that behalf for the purpose of inspecting any bee-hives or bees thereon.

5. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Two pounds for each such breach. This, By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication in the Government Gazette as provided by the Local Government Act 1915.
