9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1915* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture, if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

17. This licence is issued subject to the right of sawmillers to graze on this area such horses and bullocks as are actually used in connexion with their licensed operations on this land.

18. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be forfeited unless the licensee satisfy the Minister that neither he, directly or indirectly, nor his workmen or servants were in any way responsible therefor.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

1. The period of occupation will, except where otherwise specified, be for seventeen months from 1st April, 1919, to 30th September, 1920.

2. The fee for the period as shown in the headlines—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.

3. Separate tenders must be lodged for each block.

4. Tenders to be addressed to the Secretary for Lands (Tender-box), Melbourne.

5. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SNOWDEN GARDENS.

WHEREAS by an order of the Governor in Council made pursuant to sub-section B of section 4 of the *Princes Bridge Approach Act 1900* (No. 1681) the lands described in the Second Schedule to the said Act and known as Snowden Gardens (hereinafter referred to as "the Gardens") were vested in the corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Citizens of the city of Melbourne as sites for ornamental reserves and for no other purpose whatsoever. And whereas by the same order the Council for the time being of the corporation were appointed to be the trustees of such lands And whereas by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* power is given to the said Council as therein stated to make rules and regulations for the care protection and management of the said lands and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. Now therefore the Council of the city of Melbourne (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the Regulations following:—

Regulations.

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the gardens, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the gardens, or throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein, or leave in the gardens any bottles, fruit-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences or other structures, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the gardens, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

6. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the gardens, without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

7. No person, unless authorized by the Council in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the gardens any article, fruit, or merchandise.

8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the gardens any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals.

9. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council in writing shall bring into or use in the gardens any cart, truck, bicycle, motor car, motor cycle, wheel barrow, or other vehicle of any description whatsoever.

10. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or harangue in the gardens.

11. No person shall give out or distribute any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the gardens, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

12. No person shall play at or engage in any game, athletic sport, or gymnastic exercises in the gardens.

13. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

14. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Council, carry, use or discharge any firearms in the gardens.

15. No person shall in any part of the gardens wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the gardens, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any park-keeper or other servant of the Council.

16. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or on any structure or erection within the gardens.

17. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the gardens without the consent in writing of the Council.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Council or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF MORWELL.

BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Morwell, numbered 10, and made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries of the shire of Morwell, for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Morwell order as follows:—

1. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock, contained in section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the shire of Morwell be impounded.

2. That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said shire and occupiers of land fronting the said roads shall be exempt from such impounding of six head of cattle or six head of horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted be the team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

3. That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the shire of Morwell half-yearly in advance at the rate of Eight shillings (8s.) per annum for every head of such cattle and Ten shillings (10s.) for every head of horses so exempted, such payment to be a remuneration for the officers appointed by the Council as persons in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

4. When the above fee is paid to the herdsman, he shall register such head of horses or cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and in the case of such cattle shall fasten a chain and tag on the neck of each beast, in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

5. Any exemption from impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of this By-law shall not extend to any stock found wandering within the portions of the shire, viz.:—

The whole of the township of Boolarra;

The portion of the township of Morwell comprised within the area formed by a boundary line commencing at the junction of Avondale-road and the Mirboo-road; thence northerly to the Gippsland railway line; thence easterly by the railway line to Catherine-street; thence north by Catherine-street to the north-west angle of block 8 (sub-division of Crown allotment 45, parish of Maryvale); thence easterly by the north boundary of blocks 8 and 7 or the said subdivision to the La Trobe-road; thence northerly by the La Trobe-road to its junction with the one-chain road bearing easterly through Crown allotment 69, parish of Maryvale; thence easterly by that road to the western boundary of Crown allotment 68 of the said parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of the last-named allotment to the Gippsland railway line; thence southerly by Julia-street to Elgin-street; thence westerly by Elgin-street to the east boundary of the pottery paddock; thence north by that boundary to Ann-street; thence westerly by Ann-street to the Mirboo North railway line; thence north-east by the railway line to Avondale-road; thence westerly by Avondale-road to the commencing point.

6. The Council will not be responsible or liable for loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained under these conditions.

7. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect, in the form of the Schedule attached hereto.

8. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers, free of charge, up to that limit of age.

9. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted, without the special consent of the Council.

10. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day, of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period, and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock for registration at such musters, and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period the exemption shall be Two shillings (2s.) in the case of cows, and Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the case of horses.

11. The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him and present a return of the same to the Council every six months, on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.

12. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land on any situation whatever.

13. No pigs, goats or sheep are to be allowed to wander or depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 2 miles an hour, and in the case of sheep, at the rate of not less than 6 miles in each day between sunrise and sunset.

14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above, without giving due notice of the same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registered period.

15. The Council shall have exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious diseases to be removed from such streets or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the herdsman or Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

Violations of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
