Health Acts.

CONSOLIDATED INFLUENZA AMENDING REGULATIONS (No. 2).

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by Section 19 of the *Health Act* 1915 on the Minister of Health to exercise the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the Board of Public Health, I, the undersigned, the Honorable John Bowser, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, do make the Regulations following, under the authority exercisable by the said Board by Section 173 of the said Act in consequence of an order in that behalf made under Section 172 by the Governor in Council, such Board so enabling :—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Consolidated Influenza Amending Regulations 1919 (No. 2) and shall be read and construed as one with the Consolidated Influenza Regulations 1919 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations").
2. From and after the making of these Regulations paragraph 8 of the Principal Regulations as amended by paragraph 2 of the Consolidated Influenza Amending Regulations 1919 (No. 1) shall as regards all billiard rooms stand suspended.
3. Clauses (ii) and (iii) of sub-paragraph (f) of paragraph 4 of the Consolidated Influenza Amending Regulations 1919 (No. 1) as to picture theatres (continuous and ordinary) are hereby revoked, and that in lieu thereof the following provisions shall during the suspension of the Principal Regulations apply to every picture theatre or other like place of entertainment and be observed by the person or persons or body corporate or unincorporate having the right to control or power to regulate the admission of persons to such theatre or place :—
 - (a) No picture theatre or other like place shall be kept open or be permitted to be used by members of the public on any day except between the hours from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., and from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., and from 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. During the periods aforesaid between 2 p.m. and 11 p.m. respectively, all doors, windows, and ventilators shall be opened, kept opened, and used for at least ten minutes every one and a half hours.
 - (b) Where the business of a picture theatre or other like place is arranged or conducted by the presentation or production of a spectacular display (whether made up of the same item or items of entertainment or not) given or produced on the same date before a succession of substantially different audiences or sets of spectators a space of time of not less than one hour in duration shall be allowed to elapse between each successive show or performance, and during such time the auditorium or place used for the accommodation of spectators in such theatre or place shall be thoroughly air flushed in every part, and no person other than an employee shall be permitted to be within the building during the time of closure.
