## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE EUREKA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1890, the Trustees of the Eureka Public Cemetery make the following rules and regulations (that is to say):—

- These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing, with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
- Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified, in writing, by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace, that, for sanitary reasons, it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.
- No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
- The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
- No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
- No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
- No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

## WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, in pursuance to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

## BY-LAW No. 10.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

- For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building, or tenement only shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.
- For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no building erected, a rate of Eighteenpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.
- And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure) shall, for that part of the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantities be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per annum, this charge shall also apply to all consumers outside the water area.

2. The rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1919, and shall be payable in one sum on the 19th day of March, 1919.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

3. Notice of application for the revocation of a licence may be given by an authorized member of the police force in the form or to the effect of the second schedule.
4. A licensee desirous of transferring a licence to other premises may give notice in the form or to the effect of the third schedule.
5. The register required to be kept under the thirteenth section of the Act shall be in the form or to the effect of the fourth schedule.
6. For the metropolitan district registers shall be kept at the central police station in the City of Melbourne; at the police station, Brunswick-street, Fitzroy; and at the police station, Bank-street, South Melbourne.
7. Every licensee shall keep a purchases book in the form or to the effect of the fifth schedule, and shall enter therein the particulars prescribed.
8. The person from whom articles are purchased, or with whom they are exchanged, must sign his name in the column set apart for that purpose.
9. Every licensee shall keep a sales book in the form or to the effect of the sixth schedule, and shall enter therein the required particulars, inserting in the last column the number in the purchases book against which is recorded a description of the article sold.
10. Any person shall for a contravention of or failure to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

#### REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF NEWHAM, KNOWN AS THE "HANGING ROCK WATER AND RECREATION RESERVE."

#### REGULATION.

The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on every New Year's Day and every Easter Monday, or any day substituted for either of them, on any of which occasions a fee of One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every person not under the age of sixteen (16) years to the Reserve.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds: and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
