DAYLESFORD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, the Trustees of the Daylesford Public Cemetery make the following rules and regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be, and are hereby, rescinded.
2. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
3. By the 23rd section of the Act, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the consent and permission of the trustees under these rules and regulations, upon the payment of the charges set out in the scale of fees is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the terms of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their heirs or near relations for ever.
4. All applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges set out in the scale of fees.
5. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery upon an order signed by a justice of the peace, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or a certificate signed by, at least, three known and respectable householders or storekeepers proving to the satisfaction of the trustees applied to that such person was a pauper, and that the friends and relations of deceased are unable to pay the cost and charges.
6. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.
7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will require to construct them under the direction of the surveyor, and, in case the interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the cortege is to be at cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. throughout the rest of the year, except on Sundays, when the hours for funerals will be from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. throughout the year.
10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 22nd section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. No catacombs or any wooden kerbing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

14. No servant or person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity on the discharge thereof, or engage in private work within the the cemetery, without the consent of the trustees.

15. The ground will be kept open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves shall be kept at the office of the secretary, together with a register of all graves, which may be inspected at the charge set out in the scale of fees.

17. The keepers have orders to turn out, or to take into custody, as the case may require, any person or persons who shall behave themselves indecorously, and any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 38th section of the Act.

18. On no condition will any funeral be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 o'clock p.m. and 8 o'clock a.m.

19. All grave decorators to be registered and under the control of the trustees.

20. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these rules and regulations.

21. No trees, shrubs, plants, or seeds shall be planted or set on any grave without the consent of the sexton.

MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1919 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwellinghouse is erected of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.
2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Four pounds or under, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence sterling.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, a rate of 15 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds, except where a meter is used.
4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be made.
5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.
6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.
7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter unless at the discretion of the Trust.
8. Such rate shall be payable yearly, in advance, on the thirtieth day of April, 1919.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR BOTANIC AND PUBLIC GARDENS, KNOWN AS THE "BOTANICAL GARDENS," IN THE CITY OF BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS by section 182 of, the *Land Act* 1915 it is enacted that in the case of any land which under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the said Act or the corresponding section of any repealed Act and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board and trustees it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land with the approval of the Governor in Council to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the first mentioned section And whereas under and by virtue of a Crown grant the Reserve for Botanic and Public Gardens known as the "Botanical Gardens" in the city of Ballaarat became vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat Now therefore the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat (hereinafter called the Trustees) do hereby with the approval of the Governor in Council make the Regulations following in respect of the said Reserve for Botanic and Public Gardens known as the "Botanical Gardens" (hereinafter called the "Reserve").

(1) The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—

1st Division.—The outer area between the north and south boundary fences and the margin of Lake Wendouree and the eastern boundary fence on the east and the western boundary fence on the west exclusive of the areas inside fences around the flower or Botanic Gardens proper, the swing-boats, the maze, the lawns bordering the lake at and about the steam and other boat landings, the caterer's pavilion for sale of refreshments, the house for heating and supplying hot water, the enclosures for keeping and displaying animals and birds in captivity, and the ground enclosure and premises comprised in Divisions 2, 6, and 7 hereof.

2nd Division.—The playing grounds for cricket and football and the cricket pitches thereon.

3rd Division.—The areas and enclosures wherein flowers, shrubs, plants, &c., are grown and which include the glass-houses, hot-houses, fernery, propagating sheds, and all the places and appliances wherein and with which the propagation, growth, and display of flowers and plants are carried on, the lawns therein, and the houses, plant, appliances, and ponds and growths used in pisciculture.

4th Division.—The statuary pavilion within the 3rd Division.

5th Division.—The enclosures in which are swing-boats and the maze.

6th Division.—The enclosure called the horse paddock and the places at which horses are to be tethered when stationed in the Reserve.

7th Division.—The cottages, premises, and enclosures allotted to the caretakers.

8th Division.—The enclosed area situated at the northern end of the Reserve used for the accommodation and exhibition of flowers, plants, and trees, and of animals and birds in captivity, and known as the Zoological Gardens.

(2) The 1st, 2nd, and 6th Divisions of the Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise until 11.30 o'clock p.m. free of charge, daily.

(3) The 3rd Division shall be open free on all days other than Sundays from 8 o'clock a.m. until 7 o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, and in all other months from 8 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m., except the glass-houses, the hot-houses, propagating, and the potting houses, which shall be open only at such hours as the Trustees' officer shall direct. On Sunday the 3rd Division, with the exception as aforesaid, shall be open free from 9 o'clock a.m. until 7 o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, and in all other months from 9 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m.

(4) The 4th Division shall be open only at such hours as the Trustees may direct and which shall be plainly notified at the entrance doors of the pavilion. There shall be no charge for admission to this division during the hours which it is open.

(5) No person shall enter the 5th Division or any part of it except on production of a ticket duly authorizing him or her in that behalf.

(6) The 7th Division shall be closed to the public, and any person found therein or thereupon without the authority in writing of the Trustees will be trespassing.

(7) The 8th Division shall be open only at such hours as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, which hours shall be plainly notified on a board at the main entrance of the enclosure, and charges may be made for admission.

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(8) No person shall pluck any of the flowers or walk on any bed or border or climb any tree, or climb upon or get over any fence, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb, damage, or destroy any tree, plant, bird, animal, or other property or thing in the Reserve unless authorized by the Trustees.

(9) No person shall carry any fireman into or through the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild or other fowl, or take, injure, or destroy any bird's nest or bird's egg, either in the Reserve or in or on any water therein or adjacent thereto, or bathe in such water, unless authorized by the Trustees.

(10) No cart or vehicle used for the conveyance of goods or for any purpose of trade or business, other than conveying passengers into the Reserve, shall without the authority of the Trustees be driven into or through the Reserve.

(11) No visitor shall interrupt or interfere unnecessarily with or converse with any gardener or labourer at work in the Reserve.

(12) Children under the age of ten years not being under the control of some adult competent person, shall not be allowed in the Reserve; but in the case of the 8th Division children shall mean persons under the age of fourteen years in this clause.

(13) All goats, pigs, and poultry found within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

(14) No dogs will be allowed in the Reserve, and if found there shall be immediately seized and destroyed.

(15) No person shall break in or exercise for training purposes any horse within the Reserve.

(16) No person or persons shall ride on horseback or on motor or other cycle, or drive over any portion of the grass land of the Reserve; but any person or persons riding or driving shall keep to the carriage-ways and shall not at any time ride or drive at a greater speed than ten miles per hour or any speed less than ten miles per hour which is liable to endanger the safety of the public over such carriage-ways, nor shall any horse be tethered to any tree, fence, or other place other than those mentioned in Division 6.

(17) No person shall interfere with, remove, deface, injure, or destroy any statue, monument, fence, gate, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, or erection, or any bird or animal in the Reserve.

(18) No person shall ply for hire, either with an omnibus, hackney carriage, or other vehicle, in the Reserve except on stand provided by Regulation 23 of the City of Ballaarat.

(19) No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use and enjoyment of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, or interrupt any officer of the Trustees in the execution of his duty therein.

(20) No person shall sell or offer or expose for sale any article or commodity or take photographs within the Reserve without first having obtained the licence of the Trustees.

(21) No person shall camp or erect or place within the Reserve any structure, erection, tent, stall, or table for public amusement or for performances of any kind for gain, without having first obtained the consent of the Trustees, nor shall any person lunch, pic-nic, or play any games in Divisions 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7.

(22) No person shall in any manner interfere with the artificial ponds in the Reserve or with the water or fish therein, without having first obtained the consent of the Trustees.

(23) No person shall enter any of the latrines or conveniences within the Reserve unless of the sex to whose use the said latrines and conveniences are restricted.

(24) Every person paying for admission to the 5th or 8th Division of the Reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission (unless turnstiles are used at entrances and then entrance shall be through them on payment of charges as herein authorized, which he shall upon demand produce), and if required shall surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Trustees to demand the production or surrender of tickets, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

(25) The maximum scale of fees for admission to the 5th and 8th Divisions of the Reserve shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of each adult person, including child over the age of fourteen years, such a sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding One shilling, and for each child under fourteen years of age not exceeding Sixpence.

Provided always that the Trustees shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such fees.

(26) Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof, or otherwise paid for admission—

(a) being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language;

- (b) assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner;
- (c) crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground (comprised in Division 2) during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground in such division would be injurious to it as a cricket or sports ground;
- (d) being found in any part of the Reserve for admission to which a charge is made and not producing upon demand or not surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized by the Trustees to demand production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy such gatekeeper or other person that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission has been lost (if entrance is not by turnstiles);
- (e) entering or being found in any part of the Reserve at any time when not entitled to enter under these Regulations.

(27) No person shall put or allow in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the Reserve. Provided that this shall not apply to horses being ridden, driven in a vehicle, or led, or cattle being led over the drives of the said Reserve.

(28) No person, club, or association shall enter or use the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 8th Divisions of the Reserve for any shows or musical performances without the permission in writing of the Trustees first obtained. No such shows or musical performances will be allowed in any of the divisions not mentioned in this clause.

(29) No person shall throw, place, or distribute refuse, paper, bottles, tins, fruit, or skins of same, or any other rubbish about the Reserve, but shall place all such refuse, paper, bottles, tins, fruit, or skins or any other rubbish in bins provided for that purpose.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.
