NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DEFINE THE MOUTH OF SAWTELL'S OR TOORADIN CREEK, TOORADIN, AND TO PROHIBIT NETTING NEAR SUCH MOUTH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation for the following purposes:—

(1) Defining what shall be deemed the mouth of Sawtell's or Tooradin Creek as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such creek enter Western Port Bay.

(2) Prohibiting during the whole year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets, or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters of Western Port Bay within a quarter of a mile of the mouth of Sawtell's or Tooradin Creek, as herein defined.

(NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others, boundary posts will be erected on the shore a quarter of a mile from the mouth of the creek.)

The Rules dated the nineteenth day of April, 1915, are amended as follows:—

(1) Rule 6 is amended by inserting after the words "must thereafter" the words "save as provided in Rule 18a."

(2) Rule 7 (b) is amended by inserting before the word "served" the words "Save as provided in Rule 18a."

(3) In Part VI. "Articles" the following Rule is inserted before Rule 19:—

18a. No service under articles shall be required in the case of any person who has completed a period of ten years' service in the offices of the Supreme Court or of the Registry of the High Court of Australia, or of the Attorney-General, Solicitor-General, or Crown Solicitor for Victoria or the Commonwealth (or partly in one and partly in another), provided that he produces a certificate from the head of his office that during the last four years of such service he has been entrusted with duties requiring a knowledge of law.

(4) Rules 6 and 7 (b) are amended by inserting after the words "practising in Victoria" the words "or to the Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth."

For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 842.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building, situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with

water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1919, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1919, and shall be payable on the ninth day of May, 1919, at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-six pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-six pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building, situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1919, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1919, and shall be payable on the ninth day of May, 1919, at the office of the Commission's collector at Charlton.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act 1915* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 121st section of the *Land Act 1915*, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1915*, or for mining purposes.

2. 3. 4. 6. 13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for the Insane; for Lara, from the Superintendent of the Inebriates Retreat, and the Receiver and Paymaster at Geelong; for Greenvale, from the Superintendent at the Sanatorium; for Aborigines, from the police stations as follow:—Coranderrk, at Healesville; Lake Condah, at Heywood and Portland; and Lake Tyers, at Bairnsdale and Cunninghamham; for Rutherglen, from the Superintendent, Viticultural College; for Wyuna, from the manager, at the Irrigation Farm, and from the police at Kyabram; for Wahgunyah, from the manager, at the Vine Nursery; for the Forest School, from the senior master; and for the McLeod Settlement, from the Officer in charge of Police, Lang Lang, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for _____ at _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; Williamstown includes supplies for ss. *Lady Loch* and *Albert*; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, and Police Gaols at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of 2 miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College; Wyuna, the Irrigation Farm; Wahgunyah, the Vine Nursery; and Creswick, the Forest School. The lock-ups at City Watch House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport

consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. If after a tender has been received any alteration of the price of any item included therein be made by the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner, and gazetted, the Tender Board will make allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item affected, provided that the contractor produces evidence to the Board that the increase in price has been actually paid for the supplies to the Government.

22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

23. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

24. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

25. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

26. Where specially indicated in the schedules no sub-letting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in the schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any way engaged in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in the schedules under this contract, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated), and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the Factories and Shops Act to which such persons are subject as employees, and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board; to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

A By-law of the shire of Dandenong made under Division 1 of Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915* and numbered 40 for regulating traffic and processions and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and public places and for preventing any obstruction thereof whether by the assemblage of persons or otherwise and for suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and of the *Police Offences Act 1915* and of any and every power thereunto them enabling the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon.

2. No person shall between sunset and sunrise drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street or permit any vehicle or motor car to be upon any street unless good and serviceable lamps suitable to such vehicle or motor car are securely fixed on at each side of the front of such vehicle or motor car and are lighted and are so placed that the lights therefrom are distinctly visible both to persons in front of and to persons at the rear of such vehicles or motor car. Provided that in any case where a tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear. Provided also that in the case of a bicycle or motor bicycle one front light and one tail light shall be sufficient.

3. No procession of persons or of vehicles or motor cars or of any combination of persons, vehicles or motor cars shall except for military or funeral purposes parade or pass through any street unless with the previous consent in writing of the President of the shire or of the Shire Secretary and by the route specified in such consent and unless and until the recipient of such consent has given at least twenty-four hours' notice with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of the police station within whose district such procession shall parade or pass.

4. No person upon any street or footway shall to the obstruction or annoyance of any person thereon make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue and no person shall without the consent in writing of the President of the shire address by speech, harangue, oration, display of pictures or otherwise any gathering or concourse of people standing or being upon any street or footway.

5. No person upon any street or footway shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue or address by speech, harangue, oration, display of pictures, or otherwise, any gathering or concourse of people standing or being upon any street or footway after being required to desist by any member of the police force or by any officer of the Council.

6. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods in any street or footway in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder or which does obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use thereof.

7. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by wilful act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

8. Any person who is guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following parts of the municipal district that is to say Aspendale, Chelsea, Edithvale, Carrum and Dandenong.

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

A Regulation of the shire of Dandenong, No. 3, made under section 4 of Part VI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the shire by virtue of a By-law of the above-named shire, numbered 31, for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building in the shire of Dandenong used for public meetings or any registered building or any registered ground within the said shire in which public amusements are conducted shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered or shall be closed.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Dandenong make the following Regulation:—

1. The times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building situate in the said shire of Dandenong used for public meetings or any registered ground within the said shire in which public amusements are conducted shall be used for the purpose for which such hall, building or ground is registered shall be as follows, namely:— On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight, and on the Saturday of each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until half-past Eleven o'clock at night. Provided this Regulation shall not apply in the case of any ball, private party, or social held in any registered hall or other building on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

2. All registered halls and other buildings used for public meetings and all registered buildings and grounds in which public amusements are conducted shall be closed between the hours of Twelve o'clock midnight on Saturday and Eight o'clock in the forenoon on Monday in each week. This provision shall not apply in the case of any religious services conducted in any registered hall or building.

This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the said shire of Dandenong.

Fourteenth Schedule.—Form A.
