FURTHER PROPOGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the twentieth day of May, 1919:
Now, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of June, 1919.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the tenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
