Tea Money.—An allowance, to procure a meal, of One shilling and sixpence may be paid to officers who are required to work after office hours, provided that no payment shall be made unless an officer works after Five o'clock p.m. for at least two hours in addition to the interval of one hour taken for tea.

Such payment may, however, be made to Warders who are required to remain continuously on duty at the Law Courts later than half-past Seven o'clock n.m.

Officers in charge are to carefully watch that no abuse of this Regulation is permitted.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SNOWDEN GARDENS.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Governor in Council made pursuant to sub-section B of section 4 of the Prince's-bridge Approach Act 1900 (No. 1681) the lands described in the Second Schedule to the said Act and known as Snowden Gardens (hereinafter referred to as "the Gardens") were vested in the Corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors of the Mayor, cillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne as sites for ornamental reserves and for no other purpose whatsoever And whereas by the same Order the Council for the time being And whereas by the same Order the Council for the time being of the Corporation were appointed to be the Trustees of such lands And whereas by section 182 of the Land Act 1915 power is given to the said Council as therein stated to make Rules and Regulations for the care protection and management of the said lands and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. 2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the Gardens, or throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein, or leave in the Gardens any bottles, fruit-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the Gardens, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences or other structures, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into the Gardens any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the Gardens, shall enter any plots therein which may be exclosed for plantations

or for other purposes.

6. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Gardens, without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

7. No person, unless authorized by the Council in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the Gardens any article, fruit,

shall offer or expose for sale in the Gardens any article, irunt, or merchandise.

8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the Gardens any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals.

9. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council in writing shall bring into or use in the Gardens any cart, truck, bicycle, motor car, motor cycle, wheelbarrow, or other vehicle of any description whatsoever.

13. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

14. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Council, carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the Gardens.

15. No person shall, in any part of the Gardens wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Gardens, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any park-keeper or other servant of the Council.

16. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or on any structure or erection within the Gardens.

17. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the Gardens without the consent in writing of the Council. Every person offending against these Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Council or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Flagstaff Cardens, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted (hereinafter called the said Gardens) and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times thereafter maintained and used as and for a Public Garden and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof and in the meantime under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne and for no other purpose whatsoever And whereas the Governor in Council did on the ninth day of October One thousand nine hundred and seventeen in pursuance of section 183 of the Land Act 1915 appoint the Council of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Trustees) to be a Committee of Management of Iand and Works and the Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of such portion of the said Gardens as is set apart for and hereinafter designated Children's Playground and for the preservation of good order and decency therein in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Gardens.

### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Children's Playground shall be opened daily from 10 o'clock a.m. till sunset, except on Sundays and such other days as may from time to time be specially indicated by the

days as may from time to time be specially indicated by the Trustees.

2. Any person found within the Children's Playground except during the hours it is open to the public shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

3. Although the Children's Playground is provided for the use of children only, mothers and female attendants shall be at liberty to be present to watch over them.

4. No male person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be admitted to the Playground.

5. No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be allowed to use any of the swings or other appliances erected in the Children's Playground. Such swings or other appliances shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five (5) minutes at any one time if any other children are waiting to use them.

6. No children's Playground except in the ordinary way.

7. No cricket or football shall be played in the Children's Playground.

9. All years fruit real or other litter shall be played in

S. All paper, fruit, peel or other litter, shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Trustees for the purpose.

9. All persons in the Children's Playground shall obey the

directions of the Caretaker thereof.

10. The Trustees shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

11. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Trustees shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Children's

these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or any property in the Children's Playground.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the Land Act 1915 on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff or Crown Lands officer, or servant of the Trustees or by any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant or constable and taken before some Justice and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding more than twelve (12) days in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows shall be as follows:—

For the admission of each person not under the age of

For the admission of each person not under the age of twelve (12) years such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling, and for each person under the age of twelve (12) years, Sixpence.

For the admission of each person to the grand-stand in the Reserve such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

For the admission of each horse such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.

For the admission of each vehicle such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.

No person except the judge or judges, stewards, and officials appointed by the Committee of the Port Fairy and District Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Association to act in the particular class then exhibiting, exhibitors and authorized attendants and such persons as may be authorized by the Trustees shall enter the judge's box, the show ring, the judging ring, or any other place where exhibits are being judged in the Reserve.
