Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAPER BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 1st July, 1919, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed making paper, cardboard, carpet felt, or any similar products, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of July, 1919, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(4) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Time and a half shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
