Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE GAS METER BOARD.

Nore.—This Determination on the 20th June, 1919, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of making or repairing gas meters has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 20th day of June, 1919, the last and all previous Determinations of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) Overtime.—All work done outside the hours fixed at the times of beginning and ending work, or within such hours in excess of 48 hours in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(5) Special Rates for Sundays and Public Holidays.—All work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, or Eight Hours Day (21st April), shall be paid for at the rate of double time, and on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday (3rd Junė), or Boxing Day, at the rate of time and a half but if any other day be, by Act of Parliament or Proclamation, substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be only payable for work done on the day so substituted.
