Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD CARTERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 21st June, 1919, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in the business of a baker or seller of bread, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 21st June, 1919, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.—The times of beginning and ending work shall be as follows:—
Time of Beginning.

Time of Ending.

6 a.m. 5 p.m. on ordinary days.

6 a.m. 7 p.m. on days during which bread for more than one day's consumption is delivered.

(4) OVERTIME.—Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work. 3s, per hour.

Within the hours fixed in excess of 52 hours in any one week . . 9d, per hour in addition to ordinary rates.

(5) Special Rates.—That 3s. per hour shall be the rate payable for any delivery on Sunday, and that 2s. per hour shall be the rate payable for any delivery on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), King's Birthday, Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
