Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PROCESS ENGRAVERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on 4th July, 1919, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a Process Engraver, has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That on the 4th July, 1919, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

An indenture of apprenticeship was approved on 1st April, 1914.							

(3) DEFINITION.—A juvenile worker is any person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or improver) employed in cleaning, attending on operator, rocking baths, mounting, or proving.

(4) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 44 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on New Year's Day, 28th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
