## SHIRE OF COLAC.

## BY-LAW No. 81.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1915*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 81 of the said shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law to amend By-laws Nos. 55, 63, 68, and 78, for regulating earth closets and the emptying and cleansing of cess pans in the township of Colac, for extending the sanitary service area and for fixing the charge for the same.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Section 4 of By-law No. 78 is hereby repealed, except so far as affects any charge now due and/or payable thereunder.

4. The area named in section 4 of By-law No. 55, and in section 3 of By-law No. 63, and in section 3 of By-law No. 68, as the area within which the provisions of the said By-laws shall apply is hereby extended to embrace the area in the township of Colac, bounded on the north by Lake Colac; thence south by the western boundary of the township to the south side of Wilson-street; thence east along Wilson-street to Armstrong-street; thence south along Armstrong-street to the south side of Pound-road; thence east along Pound-road to Talbot-street; thence north along Talbot-street to Wilson-street; thence easterly along Wilson-street and Tulloh-street to Forest-street; thence northerly along Forest-street to Bruce-street; thence north along Bruce-street to Lake Colac.

5. The charge for emptying and cleansing the cess pans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement under section 320 of the *Health Act 1915* shall be as follows:—

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## BY-LAW No. 241.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. Any previous By-law, condition, practice, instruction, classification, rate, or charge inconsistent with the provisions of this By-law, or in conflict therewith, shall, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict, be read as amended, extended, or restricted, as the case may require.

2. Chaff consigned to Melbourne (Spencer-street) from any outside place shall be deemed as accepted for delivery at such one of the sidings at Spencer-street as the proper officer may determine on the arrival of the truck or trucks containing the same.

3. Chaff consigned to Melbourne shall, except as hereinafter provided, be taken delivery of direct from the truck into road vehicle, whether such truck be placed for delivery at a siding alongside a platform or at a siding unprovided with a platform, but provided with an approach road. In the case of a truck placed for delivery at a siding inside the shed known as the chaff shed at Spencer-street the chaff shall be unloaded and discharged from such truck on to the floor of the said shed, and such unloading and discharging shall be performed by the Commissioners and paid for by the consignee at the rates prescribed in clause 1 of By-law No. 235, but in any such case the chaff so unloaded or discharged must be removed from the railway premises not later than 5 p.m. on the working day next following the day upon which the same was unloaded or discharged, and failing removal of such chaff as aforesaid a storage charge of 1s. per ton or part of a ton per day—or part of a day—shall be imposed and levied in respect of so much of the said chaff as remains on railway premises after the time specified herein for removal.

4. Except as hereinbefore provided, the unloading and discharge of chaff from any truck placed in any siding for the purposes of delivery shall be performed by and at the expense and risk of the consignee within eight (8) working hours from the time when such truck is so placed for such purpose.

5. A demurrage charge of 10s. per four (4) wheeled truck, and of 20s. per bogie truck, shall be imposed and levied in respect of each day or part of a day of twenty-four (24) consecutive hours in every case in which any truck containing chaff is detained at Spencer-street for unloading or discharging purposes beyond the time hereinbefore specified. This provision shall not apply in any case where any truck containing chaff is placed for delivery at a siding inside the chaff shed and unloaded and discharged on to the floor of such shed.

6. The Commissioners will not, except as prescribed in clause 3 hereof, provide room or space on railway premises for the storage of chaff. The consignee shall, except as hereinbefore provided, forthwith upon unloading or discharging chaff from any truck placed in any siding for delivery remove from the railway premises the chaff so unloaded or discharged.

7. On and after the date from which this By-law becomes effective the conditions set out in such By-law shall be and be deemed to be incorporated in any contract made or entered into for the carriage by the Commissioners of any chaff, and on and after such date all consignments of chaff shall be received *inter alia* under and subject to such conditions.

8. The words "proper officer" shall mean and include the Metropolitan Goods Superintendent of the Commissioners for the time being, or such other officer or class of officer as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint in that behalf, and any officer of the Commissioners duly authorized to place trucks for unloading or discharge.

The conditions of this By-Law shall become effective as from the 15th day of January, 1920.

In witness whereof the Common Seal of the Victorian Railways Commissioners was hereunto affixed this thirteenth day of January, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and twenty.

## COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

## By-law No. 16.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1920 for water within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1920.
2. The minimum rates for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.).
3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street; Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Main-street, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-road, from Station-street to High-street; Bank-street, from Punt-road to High-street; and High-street, from Queen-street to Pine-street, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.
4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.
5. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.
6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1920.
7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water pipe supplying any allotment, house, or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of such allotment, house, or tenement, but the Trust may permit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments, with interest added.
8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement in any case where it may deem necessary.
9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.
10. For water supplied by measure a charge of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.
12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

## ORBOST WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Orbost Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

1. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

3. The Trust may at any time cancel any such licence if, in the opinion of the Trust Commissioners, the holder thereof, by himself or his employees, commits any breach of this By-law.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice in writing to the Trust or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work, the property of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or with any service pipe connected therewith, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence. Galvanized wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

| Diameter of Pipe.  | Weight of Pipe per Yard. |

| $\frac{1}{2}$ inch | 5 lbs.                   |
| $\frac{3}{4}$ inch | 6 lbs.                   |
| 1 inch             | 7½ lbs.                  |

| 2 inch             | 12 lbs.                  |
| 2½ inch            | 18 lbs.                  |
| 3 inch             | 20 lbs.                  |
| 4 inch             | 28 lbs.                  |

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subjected. Connexions with the pipes of the Trust must be with proper stop-cock screwed ferrules. One service pipe only, for domestic supply, to each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service pipes, unless by special consent of the Trust, shall be for tenements of annual value not exceeding £40, 1-in. bore; for tenements exceeding £40 annual value, 1½-in. bore. All service pipes on private property shall be at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface of the ground.

6. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed to each service at a distance of not more than 3 feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

7. The service pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier or owner shall, in every instance in which any damage is caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be guilty of an offence.

8. If any person neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected.

9. The Trust may at any time, when found necessary, repair or renew any pipes and stop-cocks laid for conveying a supply of water to any tenement, and may charge the owner thereof with the cost and expense of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same; and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

10. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be guilty of an offence.

12. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Trust. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

- For ½-in. meter, Four shillings;
- For ¾-in. meter, Five shillings;
- For any meter of larger size than ¾ inch, 6 per cent. upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of the months of January and July in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

13. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of the meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall

forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

14. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and re-fixed, by taking it as equal to the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

15. Meters used for measuring the water supplied to consumers, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

16. The Trust, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer, and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of ten in the forenoon and four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

17. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Trust, on which such waste is continued.

18. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair.

19. Any person, whether licensed or not, connecting any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing the self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be guilty of an offence.

20. Water closets and urinals will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the pipes of the Trust, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continually, and that not more than two gallons can escape at one flush; the supply thereto shall be by measure.

21. Any person, having received a supply of water from the Trust allowing any other person who has not agreed to be supplied by the Trust to use such water, shall be guilty of an offence; and any such last-mentioned person so using such water shall be guilty of an offence.

22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, the Trust may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

23. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

24. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole. The expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Trust authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Trust.

#### TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1920.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1920 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which district has, for the purpose of the Water Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges of the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the

time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the shire of Traralgon, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound five shillings (£1 5s.).

For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over £5, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charges shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during the year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand of the Trust.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make special provision as may be deemed necessary.

The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st of March, 1920.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

#### WARBURTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Warburton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1920.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of £25 or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under £25 sterling, the minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.).

4. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

5th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of under Ten pounds sterling (£10), the minimum sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.).

6th. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum.

7th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

8th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, or plastering.
