DETERMINATION OF THE STONE CUTTERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 3rd May, 1920, applied to the Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East, and Sandringham; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol; and such portion of the East Riding of the shire of Werribee as is within 10 miles of a city or town.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates, which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter cutting in marble and stone, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That, on the 3rd May, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) OVERTIME.—That the following rates shall be paid for overtime:—

Outside the hours fixed in Clause 4

Within the hours fixed in Clause 4 in excess of the number of hours as fixed for a week's work.

(6) RATES WHERE TOOLS NOT SHARPENED BY EMPLOYER.—That 2d. per hour in addition to above rates shall be paid in all cases mentioned above, unless all tools are sharpened by the employer.

(7) Degree of Degree of Degree of the number of the term "Manumental" shall mean portaining to manumental.

(7) DEFINITION.—Wherever occurring in this Determination, the term "Monumental" shall mean pertaining to monumental erected in cemeteries or in churches.
