REGULATIONS.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.—CHAPTER XIII.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter XIII. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

Clause 10.—Overtime.—

*For Paragraph—*

When payment for overtime work is authorized, such payment shall be at a rate per hour based on the annual salary of the officer concerned; provided that no payment for overtime work shall be made where the salary of the officer exceeds £456 a year.

*Road Paragraph—*

The following shall be the rates of payment for overtime work where payment is authorized:—

- (a) Officers whose salaries are more than £336, and not more than £456 a year, 4s. 6d. an hour.
- (b) Officers whose salaries are more than £216, and not more than £336 a year, 3s. an hour.
- (c) Officers whose salaries are more than £132, and not more than £216 a year, 2s. 3d. an hour.
- (d) Officers whose salaries are not more than £132 a year, 1s. 6d. an hour.

The first hour and a half of overtime worked on any day shall not be calculated as overtime for which payment is to be made.

## MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1920 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.
2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Four pounds or under, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence sterling.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, a rate of 15 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.
4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.
5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.
6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.
7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.
8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the thirtieth day of April, 1920.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

## SHIRE OF RIPON.

## BY-LAW No. 23, MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

## Part I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1915*, within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

## Part II.—The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement.

- (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water-pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Goldfield's Reservoir, situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort, and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

## Part III.—The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council and which is supplied by the Council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The joint water supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

## Part IV.—The Waterloo Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

## Part V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1919, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1920, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, and the common seal thereof was hereunto affixed this 12th day of April, 1920, in the presence of:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF CALLIGNEE.**

**W**E, Albert Peter Matson Howell, George Guntzler, Fritz Guntzler, John Hogg, and Thomas Angus Downie, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 22nd July, 1912, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Callignee, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings, may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage or deface in any way any trees, tree-guards, fences, gates, seats, buildings, or other improvements in the Reserve.
4. No person shall roll or throw stones or use slings or catapults in the Reserve, or light any fire therein without the consent of the Committee of Management, and then only in such place or places as may be provided for the purpose.
5. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, intoxicating liquor, or goods of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
7. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the Reserve as may be specially set apart for the purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

That he be duly registered as a bookmaker, and pays to the Committee of Management such fee as the Committee may determine, not exceeding Two pounds two shillings for each meeting.

That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied to him by the Committee of Management, which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

8. No person shall put into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with, or take away any animals or bird's eggs, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, or snares within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; Williamstown includes supplies for ss. *Lady Loch* and *Rip*; the Arrarat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, and Police Gaols at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of 2 miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College; Wyuna, the Irrigation Farm; Wahgunyah, the Vine Nursery; and Creswick, the Forest School. The lock-ups at City Watch House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogs-heads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport

consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. If any alteration of the price of any item included in any Schedule be made by the Commonwealth or State Government between the date fixed for receiving tenders and the termination of the contract period, a corresponding allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the article affected will be made by the Tender Board. The contractor shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board before an increase in price is allowed.

22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

23. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

24. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

25. 26. Bearers, 4 inches x 3 inches, 6 ft. 6 in. centres. Joists, 4 inches x 2 inches, 1 ft. 6 in. centres. Plates, 4 inches x 2 inches, top and bottom. Vermin plate, 4 inches x 2 inches. Door, window, and angle studs, 4 inches x 2 inches, others not less than 10 feet long, 4 inches x 1½ inches, 1 foot 6 inches centres. Ceiling joists, 4 inches by 1½ inches for full width of building hung to 9 inches x 1½ inches. Hangers, 5 feet centres, two tie beams. Rafters up to 12 feet long, 4 inches x 1½ inches, 3 feet centres; over 12 feet long, 4 inches x 2 inches. Rafters for slates or tiles, 1 ft. 6 in. centres. All rafters over 15 feet long to have 4 inches x 3 inches purlins, with 4 inches x 2 inch struts from wall plates. Collar ties, 4 inches x 1½ inches to every second rafter. Battens, 3 inches x 1½ inches, 2 ft. 9 in. centres. Ridge, 8 inches x 1 inch. Door jambs, 6 inches x 1½ inches. Flooring, not less than ¾-inch in T. & G., iron roof to have two corrugations side lap and 6 inches end lap, and not less than 26 gauge. In the construction of all wooden buildings except sheds, vermin plates shall be used.

(2) This Regulation shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the municipal district of Footscray.
