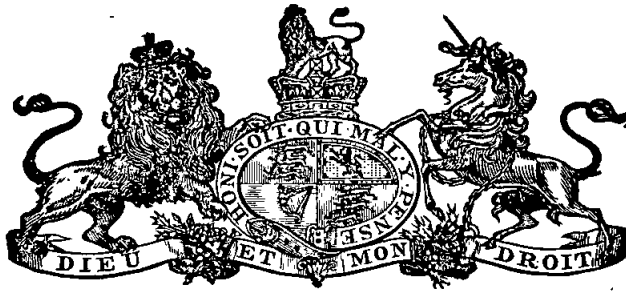

## APPOINTMENT OF DAYS AND TIMES AND INTERVALS OF TIME FOR THE PURIFICATION AND REVISION OF THE SPECIAL GENERAL LISTS, 1920, FOR THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 144 of the *Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* (No. 2632), I hereby appoint the following days and times and intervals of time in connexion with the purification and revision of the Special General Lists, 1920:—

Before or on the 12th June, 1920.—Two certified printed copies of the Lists to be sent to the Clerks of Revision Courts, and one copy to Electoral Inspectors.

Before or on the 19th June, 1920.—Persons not enrolled on Special General Lists, but entitled to enrolment in virtue of residence, may make claim for enrolment.

Before or on the 19th June, 1920.—Notices of objection to be served.

Forthwith after the 19th June, 1920.—Lists of claimants entitled to enrolment to be sent to Clerks of Revision Courts.

Between 25th June, 1920, and 9th July, 1920, on days to be fixed by Police Magistrates.—Revision Courts to revise Special General Lists.

Before or on the 7th August, 1920.—Registrars to certify and sign Special General Rolls, and transmit signed copies to Returning Officers.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.  
BY-LAW No. 933.—RATE.—WATERWORKS DISTRICT OF THE  
LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 30th March, 1920, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 9th April, 1920, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust, except within any Urban District thereof:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission, at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Pyramid Hill; at the office of the municipality of East Loddon at Serpentine; at the Post Office at Mitiamo; at the Post Office at Tandarra; at the Post Office at Marmal; at the Post Office at Boort; and at the Post Office at Bridgewater—a rate of Eightpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Fourpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Twopence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1920, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1920, and shall be payable on the twentieth day of May, 1920, at the office of the said Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1915*, by Frank Bassett, valuer, returned on the third day of May, 1920, and adopted by the said Commission on the third day of May, 1920, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the Water Acts, and if so altered or amended, then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

And whereas by an Act of Parliament of Victoria No. 2665 intituled the *Health Act 1915* it was enacted that nothing therein contained should be deemed or construed to repeal or invalidate any Regulation or By-law made and in force at the time of the coming into operation thereof in any city, town, borough or shire. And by the said Act 2665 power was given to the Council for the time being of any city, town, borough or shire from time to time to make By-laws for certain purposes therein specified and to repeal alter or amend the same as any such Council might see fit. And whereas it is expedient to further alter and amend the provisions of the said By-law numbered 6 be it therefore and it is hereby enacted by the said Council in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of South Barwon that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the undermentioned areas the boundaries of which are described as follows namely:—

*Township of Belmont*—All those pieces or parcels of land being parts of Crown portion 9 parish of Barrabool, county of Grant bounded as follows:—Commencing at the intersection of the west side of the Colac-road with the south side of Roslyn-road; thence by a line running south-westerly along the west side of the Colac-road to the south-east angle of lot 56 of the Belmont Hill estate; thence by a line running west to the south-west angle of lot 77 of the said estate; thence by a line running north to the north-west angle of lot 1 of the said estate; thence by a line running east along the south side of Roslyn-road to the commencing point, and which said pieces or parcels of land are known as "Wurfel's" property and the "Belmont Hill estate."

And by the said Act No. 2665 power was given to the Council for the time being of any city, town, borough or shire from time to time to make By-laws for certain purposes therein specified and to repeal, alter or amend the same as any such Council might see fit. And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the provisions of the said By-law numbered 7 be it therefore and it is hereby enacted by the said Council in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of South Barwon that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the undermentioned areas the boundaries of which are described as follows, namely:—

*Township of Barwon Heads*.—All that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Connewarre, county of Grant, being part of allotment N of section 15, and bounded as follows, namely:—Commencing on the north boundary line of the said allotment N at a point 32 chains 4 links or thereabouts east from the Government road forming the west boundary line of allotment M of said section 15; and thence bearing further east to the River Barwon 3 chains 96 links; thence bounded on the east by the said River Barwon to the south-east boundary line of said allotment N on the south by another Government road being a line bearing west 2 chains 79½ links to a point distant 32 chains 20½ links east from the said Government road forming the west boundary line of the said allotment M; thence by a line bearing north 10 degs. 1 min., west 7 chains 80 links and north 5 degs. 29 mins., east 12 chains 46 links to the commencing point, be the said several admeasurements little more or less and which said piece or parcel of land is more particularly known as the "Barwon Heads Estate."

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, do hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 82 of the said shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law to repeal By-law No. 64, and to further amend By-law No. 62, for regulating earth closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans in the parish of Ondit, and for fixing a charge for the same.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. By-law No. 64 is hereby repealed, except so far as affects any charge now due and/or payable thereunder.

4. The charge for emptying and cleansing the cesspans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement under section 320 of the *Health Act 1915*, shall be as follows:—

Once a week for each pan per annum ..	£1 15s.
Twice a week for each pan per annum ..	£3 10s.
Thrice a week for each pan per annum ..	£5 5s.

such charge shall be payable half-yearly in advance.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLAC GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, the Trustees of the Colac General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply at the Cemetery therefor. If the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid the Trustees will in due course issue a Certificate of Right of Burial, which shall give the person to whom issued and his or her representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, subject to such conditions as the Trustees may from time to time determine.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, brick or concrete grave, enclosure, tombstone or other erection shall give notice at the Cemetery, and, if so required, shall submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such work shall be executed if the Trustees intimate that approval is withheld.

5. No interment shall be authorized until an application has been made, all required particulars furnished, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the sexton.

6. Application for interment shall be made to the sexton at least seven working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. Every new grave shall be not less than 6 ft. 6 in. deep, and not more than two adults shall be interred in each unless the grave be of extra depth. Two children under twelve years shall be considered equivalent to an adult.

8. The hours for burial, except by special permission of the Trustees, shall be on week days from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m., and on Sunday from Two o'clock to Four o'clock p.m.

No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing, on a form provided for the purpose, by a duly qualified medical practitioner or a Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day.

9. The time fixed for any burial shall be the hour when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and shall be punctually observed. At least three-quarters of an hour shall be allowed to elapse between the arrival of different funerals.

10. No re-interment of any body will be permitted, on removal from another cemetery, until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf or a certified copy of the same.

No exhumation of any body will be permitted except in compliance with the provisions of section 46 of the *Cemeteries Act 1915*.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent of the person entitled to give the same, and such consent shall be given in writing on the proper form if so required.

12. If required the Certificate of Right of Burial shall be produced or other satisfactory evidence given that the person desiring to have an interment made in a private burial place is entitled to the same.

13. No fencing or enclosure of wood shall be allowed within the Cemetery other than a plain wood kerb approved by the Trustees.

14. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person who has paid the fee for a private grave and requires a brick or concrete grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be covered by a slab of stone, concrete, slate, or iron securely cemented on the brick or concrete walls.

15. Any tomb, monument, or material other than soil requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault shall be removed and re-erected or replaced by and at the cost of the owner.

16. Any public grave may, on the approval of the Trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees payable thereon.

17. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery without special authority from the Trustees.

18. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 8 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

19. No tree or shrub shall be planted or allowed to remain in any portion of the Cemetery except with the approval of the Trustees.

20. No smoking shall be permitted in the Cemetery, nor shall any fireworks or firearms be carried or discharged (unless by permission of the Trustees in the latter case).

21. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

22. All material required in the construction or repair of any enclosure or monument shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery. Refuse or rubbish remaining after the completion of such work or after the dressing of graves or enclosures shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person employed on the work. No materials shall be carted or wheeled along any path or road while the surface is soft from rain or other causes.

23. Within the Cemetery no person shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or do any injury to any property, or remove or interfere in any way with anything built, placed, or growing on or in any grave or burial place.

24. No advertisement, business card, or announcement of any kind shall be exhibited in the Cemetery without the express permission of the Trustees.

25. Any person guilty of a breach of these Rules and Regulations shall be liable for every such offence to the penalty prescribed by section 10 of the *Cemeteries Act 1915*.
