#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE NAILMAKERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 7th June, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newmand Chilwell, Sebastopol, and Castlemaine; and the shire of Braybrook.

Note.—On the 19th August, 1913, the powers of the Nailmakers Board were extended to enable it to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as storeman, packer, or sorter in connexion with the trade or business of making nails.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—(a) Making nails, (b) weaving wire netting and barbed wire; (c) galvanizing, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 7th June, 1920, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

#### DEFINITION OF JUVENILE WORKERS.

(3) Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed in assisting polisher, sawdusting, filling ladles, washing, scrubbing, drying, brushing off, sorting, packing, watching nail machines, wiring nail machines, attending machines, attending horseshoe nail-heading machines, attending horseshoe nail-heading machines.

(4) Shirts.—That—

<sup>(</sup>b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a half, calculated on the rates fixed for the Day shift.

<sup>(5)</sup> Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day: but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
