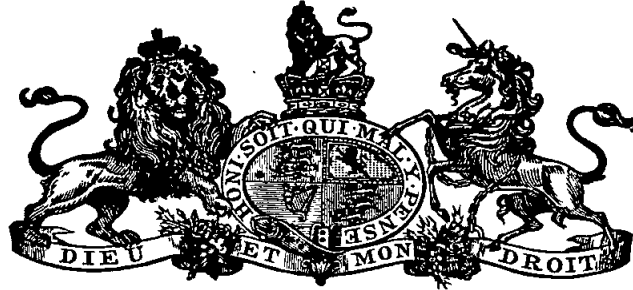

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2713), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as a Public Holiday and Public Half-Holidays respectively at the places specified, viz.:—

Public Holiday:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MAY, 1920, throughout Victoria.

Public Half-Holidays:—

TUESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF JUNE, 1920, in the borough of Newtown and Chilwell, and throughout the city of Geelong, and the borough of Geelong West, until the hour of One o'clock p.m.;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF JUNE, 1920, throughout the city of Bendigo from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon.*

BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2618), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

Bank Holidays:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MAY, 1920, throughout Victoria;

TUESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF JUNE, 1920, at Birregurra;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF JUNE, 1920, at Kingston;

FRIDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF JUNE, 1920, at Bendigo, Castlemaine, Eaglehawk, Maldon, Newstead, Pyramid Hill, and Woodend.

Bank Half-Holidays from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon:—

MONDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF MAY, 1920, at Stratford;

TUESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF JUNE, 1920, at Cobden;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF JUNE, 1920, at Bendigo and Eaglehawk.
