## ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1920.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Seventeen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For all tenements in the said district in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates, and, where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the first day of January, 1920, shall be as follows:—

- For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust—Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
- For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust)—One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate, which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, show grounds, bowling green, shire hall, sale-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to carriers and livery stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be used as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1920. Such rates shall be paid by equal moieties, half yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly, on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

- IV. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe and not supplied with a service-pipe from the main, shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.
- V. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile but within half a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter the assessed rate.
- VI. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling and ninepence every thousand gallons.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall
  - (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling and ninepence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
  - (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July,

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions of section 39 of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* (No. 2916), and section 20 of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1919* (No. 3039), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations made on the 4th June, 1918:—

PART 7.

GENERAL.

30. The Trustees of any public hall shall be elected at a meeting of settlers under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts duly convened by the Secretary of the local Returned Soldiers Association, or in the event of there being no such body in existence, by the Land Officer of the district. Due notice of any such meeting must be given, either by written notice to each settler, or by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the district. Only those settled in the district in which the hall is to be erected shall be entitled to a vote.

31. Each valuation sub-committee shall meet whenever the business in hand justifies the summoning of the members for the purpose, notice of such meeting to be given in writing by the Secretary. On any matter arising at any meeting where there are only two members of the valuation sub-committee in attendance, and they cannot agree, the matter in question must be postponed in order to secure the attendance of the third member at a subsequent meeting to permit of finality being attained. The valuation sub-committee shall furnish (through the Advisory Committee for the information of the Board) periodically, and at intervals of not more than three months, a report of its proceedings.

32. Every Advisory Committee may appoint, subject to the approval of the Board, a person to act as Secretary to the valuation sub-committee in its own municipality. The remuneration paid to the Secretary (which shall not exceed Fifty pounds per annum) shall be fixed in accordance with the nature of the work to be performed, and shall be subject to the recommendation of the Board and approval of the Minister.

33. The forms which shall be used by the valuation sub-committees in making the reports, &c., required under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts, shall be those as from time to time are issued by the Board for that purpose.

34. Each Secretary of a valuation sub-committee shall keep a proper record of correspondence and all matters relating to the business of soldier settlement dealt with by such sub-committee, and the registers containing such records shall be open for inspection at any time by the Board's officers, and all Secretaries of valuation sub-committees shall be subject to the Board's direction from time to time as to methods to be employed in keeping same.

35. The Secretary, when instructing valuers, shall fix the valuation fee in accordance with the following scale, but no fees shall be fixed by him for the Board's valuer. No member of the valuation sub-committee shall be entitled to fees.

The fees to be paid shall range from £1 1s. to £3 3s. for small properties, and from £1 1s. to £3 3s. per 1,000 acres for large properties, according to the class of property to be valued and the distance to be travelled by the valuers. If,

however, the property be a very large one, the rate per 1,000 acres should be considerably less than £3 3s. Upon the warrant of the Secretary, the Closer Settlement Board will make payment to the local valuers on application being made.

The local committees may be instructed from time to time by the Board as to the rates of fees to be paid.

36. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Board, allow any actual and reasonable expense necessarily incurred by a member of an advisory or valuation sub-committee when engaged in transacting the business of such committee or sub-committee.

37. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Board, allow any actual and reasonable expense necessarily incurred by any referee when engaged in inspecting and valuing a property under offer to the Board.

ANNUAL REPORT TO PARLIAMENT.

38. The annual report of the Minister to Parliament shall be accompanied by a Revenue Account and Balance-sheet showing transactions of the Board under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts.

- Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
