RATING BY-LAW, 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 28.

1. A rate of Ninepence in the One pound (£1) sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property within the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the shires of Shepparton and Tungamah, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1920, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1920.

2. Such rate is hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of June, 1920.

3. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rate.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust on the 31st day of May, 1920.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fourteen pounds (£14) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1920.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Fourteen pounds (£14) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1920 of the property so supplied.

6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall

not use any water for such purposes until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1920. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts, on the evening of Tuesday, the eleventh day of May, 1920.

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SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe, three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes at Twenty pounds (£20), or under; and

(b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement use, take or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. Every person upon whose premises a water trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water trough and ball tap at all times in a

state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the Water Acts, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.

14. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

15. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

16. The By-law made by the Trust on the fourteenth day of January, 1919, relating to water supply is hereby repealed.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 39 of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* (No. 2916), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to Part 6 of the Regulations made on the 4th June, 1918:—

26A. Conditional Purchase Leases for land in the Mallee country, disposed of under the provisions of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917*, shall be numbered R (one), and shall be in the same form as Schedule R, which was approved by the Governor in Council on the 16th September, 1919, with the addition in the heading of the word "Mallee"; and in the recital after the words "piece of land" the words "in the Mallee country"; and shall be subject to such other exceptions, reservations, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct.

And the Honorable H. S. W. Lawson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the city of Northcote doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686)* as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918 (No. 2981)*, direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

(a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and

(b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

(a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and

(b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and

(c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and

(d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and

(e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

(a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

(a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

(a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

(a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and

(b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
 (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
 (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
 (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of Northcote of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

The ballot-paper so marked by or for the voter must be dropped by you into the ballot-box.

You must not take this ballot-paper out of the polling booth.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts has (whether before or after the commencement of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*) by resolution declared a deviation to be a main road, the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a main road or be discontinued as provided in the resolution. And whereas the said Board has by resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a main road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution, and that such part of the said existing road as is described in the Third Schedule shall be discontinued. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.
Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring Road on Site taken for a Deviation of a Main Road fit for Use

WHEREAS the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Country Roads Act 1915* for the purpose of constructing such a road deviation, which road deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same. And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads Board incorporated under the said Act) thinks that the road aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway, such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 58 of the said Act doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said road deviation, the course of which is described in the First Schedule hereto, with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified, to be part of a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1915*. And the said Board doth also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of the existing road or the part thereof described in the Second Schedule hereto, and that such part of the said existing road as is described in the Third Schedule hereto shall be discontinued accordingly.

FIRST SCHEDULE.
Shire of Tambo.

All that piece of land in the parish of Buchan being a roadway 1 and 2 chains wide, the eastern boundary of which commences at a point on the eastern boundary of suburban Crown allotment 10, township and parish of Buchan, distant 690 links, more or less, from the north-eastern angle of the said allotment; thence north-westerly and north-easterly through that allotment, across the Buchan River and continuing north-easterly through suburban Crown allotment 8 of the said township, to a point on the north-eastern boundary thereof, distant 292.4 links, more or less, from the north-eastern angle of the allotment last-named.

Health Act 1919.

COMMISSION OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PREVENTION OF THE INFECTIOUS DISEASE, DIPHTHERIA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day of June, 1920.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following relating to the prevention of the spread of the infectious disease known as diphtheria (that is to say) :-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Diphtheria Regulations 1920," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided herein are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

- "Authorized" means authorized by a Council.
- "Contact" means, for the purposes of these regulations, any inmate of a house wherein a case of diphtheria has occurred.
- "Council" means Council of a Municipality.
- "Patient" means person suffering or convalescing from diphtheria.

4. On receipt of notification of a case of diphtheria the Council shall forthwith cause the house wherein the patient dwells to be visited by the Medical Officer of Health, or by an authorized person, and such Officer of Health or authorized person shall—

- (a) Ascertain whether the patient is effectually isolated.
- (b) Give the occupier such instructions as will enable him to prevent the conveyance of the disease from patient to others.
- (c) Take swabs, when necessary, from every contact, and send same to a competent bacteriologist for examination.
- (d) Make such inquiries and obtain such particulars as are necessary to enable the source of infection to be traced.

5. Every Council shall cause every patient and every carrier to be effectually isolated, and detained in isolation, and every Council is hereby authorized to use such guards and force as are necessary for these purposes, and no such patient or carrier shall be released from detention until swabs, taken at an interval of not less than 48 hours, are declared negative by a competent bacteriologist.

6. In the case of any carrier still remaining positive after the expiration of one month after isolation, the Medical Officer of Health may release such carrier, subject to such carrier undertaking to faithfully carry out his instructions: provided that if such carrier fails or neglects to carry out such instructions the Medical Officer of Health shall take such action as is necessary to again isolate such carrier.

7. The Council shall cause all contacts under school age, and all those attending school, to be isolated until the Medical Officer of Health is satisfied that they are not a danger to the public health; all other contacts shall be kept under surveillance by the Medical Officer of Health for such period of time as he considers necessary.

8. The occupier of any house wherein a case of diphtheria occurs, and in which any child attending school resides, shall, on becoming aware of the existence of such case, forthwith inform the head teacher, or person in charge of the school, whereat the said child attends, of the occurrence of such case.

9. Every Council shall in respect of every case of diphtheria reported to the Council ascertain whether any inmate of the house wherein the case occurs, attends any school, and, if so, the Council shall inform the head teacher, or person in charge of such school, of the occurrence of such case.

10. The head teacher, or person in charge of every school, on learning that any scholar is absent owing to being infected with diphtheria, or to the existence of diphtheria at the house whereat such scholar resides, shall forthwith inform the Council of the district wherein the pupil resides of the circumstances.

11. Where a case of diphtheria occurs at any dairy or place where milk is kept for sale, the Medical Officer of Health shall, by order, in writing, prohibit the sale of milk for such time as he considers necessary to safeguard the public health.

12. Every dairyman or seller of milk on whose premises a case of diphtheria occurs shall—

- (a) immediately discontinue the sale of milk until authorized by the Medical Officer of Health to resume;
- (b) forthwith inform the Council of the occurrence of such case; and
- (c) condemned by the Medical Officer of Health, or any authorized person, give names and addresses of customers supplied, and also particulars as to sources of supply.

13. Where any Council has reasonable grounds for believing that milk, produced in another municipal district, is a factor in spreading infection, such Council shall inform the Council of the district wherein such milk is produced of the circumstances; and such latter Council shall forthwith cause inquiries to be made, and take such action as is necessary to safeguard the public health.

14. No patient nor any carrier shall enter or remain in any public place, or any public conveyance, or handle food intended for consumption by others.

15. The Council shall cause every house where a case of diphtheria has occurred to be disinfected, in whole or in part, when and as the Medical Officer of Health directs.

16. Every Council, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, shall supply, free of charge, antitoxic serum in every necessitous case.

17. Every carrier and every contact shall submit to and carry out such instructions as the Medical Officer of Health specifies, and for such period of time as he directs.

18. Every person shall truly answer any question asked by the Medical Officer of Health, or authorized person, in respect of any matter relating to any of the provisions of these regulations.

19. Every Council and its officers are hereby authorized and required to superintend and see to the execution of these regulations, and at its own cost to do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as are necessary for such purposes.

20. Any Council or person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is liable to a penalty of not more than £20, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than £5.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 310(3); these are hereby declared to be emergency regulations.

And the Honorable Matthew Baird, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RESCISSON OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIPS OF LONGWARRY AND YARRAGON, AND THE IONA RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF BERWICK.

REGULATION No. 25.

A Regulation of the city of Port Melbourne, numbered 25, made under section 3 of Part VII. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the city of Port Melbourne, by virtue of a By-law, of the said city, numbered 72, prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to deposit combustible materials specified in the Regulation.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Port Melbourne order as follows:—

1. No timber, squared or in logs, fitches, sawn timber, bark, sawdust, or wooden boxes or cases shall be stacked or placed or otherwise left lying in greater quantities than one ton by weight or measurement (or than ten tons if cross cut into lengths not exceeding two feet), closer than twenty feet to any building, house, or shed not in the same occupation or possession, or closer than ten feet to any privately-owned land not in the same occupation or possession, unless such timber, squared or in logs, or fitches, sawn timber, bark, sawdust, wooden boxes or cases is separated from abutting properties by substantial walls of brickwork, concrete, or other fireproof material approved by the city surveyor, which shall be built to a height of at least twelve feet, and two feet higher than that to which it shall be lawful to stack the timber within the enclosure—and no timber shall be stacked within six inches of the walls.

2. Plans of all walls proposed for erection under this Regulation shall be submitted for approval to the city surveyor, and no such wall shall be built until such approval has been given by him.

3. This Regulation shall apply to that portion of the municipal district of Port Melbourne which lies on the west side of the Port Melbourne railway line.

The resolution for passing the above Regulation was agreed to by the Council of the City of Port Melbourne on the 4th day of May, 1920, and confirmed on the 1st day of June, 1920.
