Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919 (No. 3030).

## REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
twenty-fourth day of June, 1920.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919* (No. 3030) (hereinafter referred to as the "Act") to make regulations not inconsistent with the Act prescribing all matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to the same, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Tweed Costing Methods Regulations 1920."

2. All persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) hereinafter referred to as "traders" or individually as a "trader" selling or disposing wholesale of tweeds, twills, worsteds and serges (hereinafter referred to as "tweed") or of articles of clothing or wearing apparel made in whole or in part of tweed shall every six calendar months take stock of the said commodities or of all the stock of any kind in the department or departments of the trader in his warehouse or in his possession or under his control and shall ascertain the actual cost delivered into the warehouse of such stock including in the case of garments the actual manufacturing cost as arrived at in accordance with the requirements of paragraph 1 of the Proclamation under the Act made on the seventh day of May, 1920, and ready-made garments.

3. Every trader shall keep proper records of each such stock-cost of raw materials delivered into the warehouse including manufacturing cost as indicated in the last preceding paragraph.

4. Every trader shall prepare and keep a true record of the total amount of money of his sales of the commodities the subject of the Proclamation aforesaid or of such department or departments of his business in which commodities of the kind are dealt in during each such period of six calendar months.

5. Every trader shall prepare and keep a true record of the total actual cost of the commodities of all kinds in the case of garments of the commodities of all kinds in the Proclamation aforesaid or of his business purchased or the department or departments of his business purchased or manufactured or acquired by the trader during each such period of six calendar months.

6. Every trader shall for the period involved keep a true record of the expenses incurred in effecting sales under sub-paragraph (11) of paragraph 3 of the Proclamation aforesaid or ascertain an amount of money bearing the same relation to his total overhead expenses (which shall not include income

tax) as the money value of his sales of the commodities the subject of the sub-paragraph or of the department or departments of his business in which those commodities are dealt in bears to the money value of all his sales in his business.

7. The form in the Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as the one to be used by a trader in recording the matters therein required to be disclosed and recorded.

## Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919 (No. 3030).

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the *Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919* (No. 3030) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* may from time to time declare maximum rates of profit according to or upon any principle or condition prescribed. And whereas by the *Maximum Rates of Profit Regulations 1920* made under the said Act the principle or condition was prescribed permitting regard to be had as to whether the declaration is to be based on maximum gross or maximum net profits and whether such profits are to be the actual profits on the commodity or the profits on the average turnover of the trader in any given period. And whereas articles of clothing and wearing apparel are necessary commodities within the meaning of the said Act and whereas after considering the report of the Fair Profits Commission constituted under the Act aforesaid dated the 2nd day of June instant recommending that course, it is deemed desirable to declare a maximum rate of profit at which garments for males made to order or to measure from tweeds, twills, worsteds or serges may be sold or supplied by retail on the principle of an average gross rate of profit to the trader on a yearly or half-yearly (at the option of the trader) turnover computed on the actual manufacturing cost of the article to the retail trader. And whereas by section 39 of the said recited Act power is conferred on the Governor in Council upon receiving a report from the Fair Profits Commission on the subjects in sub-section (1) of the said section referred to by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* to require every producer, manufacturer, distributor and seller of any specified necessary commodity and every person preparing the same for market to adopt such methods as are prescribed for ascertaining the cost of producing, manufacturing, distributing or selling such commodity or preparing the same for market; to keep in the prescribed manner records in the prescribed form of such cost and to produce such records on demand for inspection by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman of the said Commission. And whereas the Fair Profits Commission in its report hereinbefore referred to and incidental to its recommendation therein being adopted that a Proclamation be passed declaring the maximum average gross rate of profit at which garments for males made to order or to measure from the materials hereinbefore specified might be sold or supplied has further recommended that a Proclamation be passed requiring the persons concerned to keep cost records of their business in relation to the garments of the kind referred to: Now therefore I, Sir William Hill Irvine, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof acting under the powers conferred by the said recited Act do by this present Proclamation—

1. Fix and declare (on, at the option of the trader, a yearly or half-yearly turnover) the maximum average gross rate of profit at which garments for males made to order or to measure from tweeds, twills, worsteds, or serges (either in whole or in part) may be sold or supplied retail to be forty-two and one-half per centum (42½%) on the actual manufacturing cost of the article to the retail trader.

2. Require all persons (corporate or unincorporate) selling or supplying garments for males made to order or to measure from tweeds, twills, worsteds or serges—

- (a) To adopt such methods as are prescribed for ascertaining the cost to such persons of producing, manufacturing, preparing, distributing or selling such garments.
- (b) To keep in the prescribed manner records in the prescribed form of such cost; and
- (c) To produce such records on demand for inspection by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman of the Fair Profits Commission.

And I under all powers me enabling in that behalf with the advice aforesaid do hereby ordain and prescribe as follows:—

(1) That in the actual manufacturing cost of garments the subject of this Proclamation there may be included only the following items, namely:—

- (a) The actual cost delivered into the retail tailor's establishment both of the tweed, twill, worsted or serge of which the garment is made and also of the sundry materials (usually known as "trimmings") used in making the garment.
- (b) The actual cost of labour of employees actually employed in making, finishing and pressing the garment.
- (c) When the retail trader makes the garment completely in his own work-rooms a sum per garment for cutters, fitters, workroom managers and time

clerks, equal to the total sum actually paid for such services in the preceding yearly or half-yearly period divided by the total number of garments sold or supplied during that preceding period; and

- (d) When the retail trader is his own cutter, fitter, workroom manager, or time clerk, or performs the duties of any two or more of such callings, he may allow as part of his manufacturing cost a reasonable and average trade wage to himself, and deem it actually paid under sub-paragraph (c) next preceding.

(2) When the retail trader procures a manufacturer or some other trader to supply material, trimmings or labour, or any one or more of them, either in whole or in part, then manufacturing cost shall include only such of the items set out in paragraph 1 hereof as are in fact actually provided or paid by the retail trader and such payments as the trader in fact makes to the manufacturer or to other trader; and when the retail trader does not in fact cut out the garment or does not in fact manufacture it completely in his own workrooms he shall not be entitled to include in manufacturing cost any sum for services set out in sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph 1 hereof.

(3) When no data are available upon which to base an average, or when by reason of the adoption by this present Proclamation of the principle of declaring an average rate of profit as a controlling factor, it occurs in the case of certain articles or lines of articles that they are sold or supplied by the trader at a rate below the maximum average percentage on the actual manufacturing cost authorized to be charged under this Proclamation, then the trader may sell or supply other articles at a price individually higher than the average provided that he shall in no case sell or supply any garment for males made to order or to measure from tweeds, twills, worsteds or serges at a higher gross rate of profit thereon than fifty per centum (50%) on the actual manufacturing costs to him.

(4) That this Proclamation shall apply only in cases where the purchaser pays fully for his purchase within thirty (30) days after delivery thereof.

## Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in a report made the 27th day of April last past the Fair Profits Commission constituted under the *Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919* (No. 3030) and under other things recommended that a maximum average gross rate of profit be declared at which the group of commodities comprising tweeds, twills, serges and worsteds (hereinafter referred to as "tweeds") and garments made therefrom might be sold or supplied wholesale and further recommending that a Proclamation be passed requiring that every person dealing in tweeds or ready-made garments for males or females should be required to keep records of the costs of the commodities dealt in the matter in the said report indicated: And whereas by section 39 of the said Act referred to power is conferred upon the Governor in Council upon receiving a report of the kind aforesaid to require the persons concerned to adopt the methods and keep the records and to produce the same for inspection: And whereas the maximum average gross rate of profit at which has been declared by a Proclamation made on the seventh day of May last in accordance with the recommendation aforesaid: And whereas the further recommendation as to requiring the persons concerned to adopt the methods and keep the records and to produce the same has been approved: Now therefore I, Sir William Hill Irvine, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, acting under the powers conferred by the said recited Act, do by this present Proclamation

require all persons (corporate or unincorporate) selling or supplying tweed or garments made therefrom wholesale—

- (a) To adopt such methods as are prescribed for ascertaining the cost to such persons of the tweed or garment sold or supplied.
- (b) To keep in the prescribed manner records in the prescribed form of such cost.
- (c) To produce such records on demand for inspection by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman of the Fair Profits Commission.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919 (No. 3030)* to make regulations not inconsistent with the Act prescribing all matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to the same, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Made to Order Male Garments (tweed, &c.) Costing Regulations 1920."

2. Except as hereinafter provided every trader, tailor or other person (hereinafter referred to as a "tailor") selling or supplying garments for males made to order or measure from tweeds, twills, worsteds or serges shall make and keep a true record of the cost to such tailor of producing, manufacturing, distributing and selling all garments sold or supplied by him during the currency of his yearly or half-yearly (accordingly as under the relevant Proclamation he may have elected to adopt the one or the other of those terms) period.

3. Every tailor in the record required to be made and kept under the last preceding clause shall show separately the cost of the tweeds, twills, worsteds and serges used by him in making the garments for males to order or made to measure, the cost of the sundry materials (usually called "trimmings") used in making the garment and the cost of labour and also the stock on hand at cost at the beginning and at the end of the period, the total money value of purchases during the period at cost, and the total amount of sales during the period.

4. In the case of any tailor whose total sales of garments for males made from tweeds, twills, worsteds and serges have not for, as the case may be, the yearly or half-yearly period preceding the current yearly or half-yearly period amounted to Three thousand pounds for a year or Fifteen hundred pounds for a half-year need not make or keep for the purposes thereof the record required by these Regulations on condition that he supplies to the Fair Profits Commission on demand copies of his State Income Tax return for such years as the Commission may require.

And the Honorable H. S. W. Lawson, His Majesty's Solicitor-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
