PROCLAMATION

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Nine hundred and fifty-five thousand one hundred and fourteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and nineteen and One thousand nine hundred and twenty.”

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law of the Shire of Winchelsea made under the *Health Act 1919*, for regulating the position, construction, cleansing, emptying, and management of earth closets, privies, and cess-pools in the townships of Winchelsea, Birregurra, and Lorne.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* and of any other power thereunto enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth order as follows, that is to say:—

1. By-laws numbered nine, eleven, and thirteen of the said shire relating to the pan services of the townships of Birregurra, Winchelsea, and Lorne respectively shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the townships of Winchelsea, Birregurra, and Lorne, the boundaries of the said townships being defined respectively as follows:—

Winchelsea.—Commencing at the south-east corner of suburban allotment 24A, township of Winchelsea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard, county of Grant; thence northerly to the north-east corner of suburban allotment 45A of the same parish; thence south-westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment and part of the northern boundary of suburban allotment 46A, township of Winchelsea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard, county of Grant; thence westerly to the north-west corner of suburban allotment 29, parish of Mirnee, county of Grenville; thence south-easterly to the north-east corner of allotment 53 of the same parish; thence south-westerly to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 52, parish of Mirnee; thence south-easterly by the Cressy-road to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 69A, parish of Mirnee; thence southerly to the Colac-road; thence by the Colac-road to the north-east corner of Crown allotment R, section VII., parish of Mirnee; thence southerly to the south-west corner of the Public Garden Park and Recreation Ground; thence easterly to the commencing point.

Birregurra.—Commencing at the Barwon River at the south boundary of the parish of Birregurra; thence west by that boundary to the road forming the east boundary of allotment K, section 28, in the last-named parish; thence north by that road to the road from Colac to Birregurra; thence south-easterly by that road forming the east boundary of allotment A, section 22; thence north by that road to the south-west corner of allotment 1, section 22; thence east by the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence south by the western boundary of allotment A, section 20, to the Barwon River; and thence south-west by the said river to the commencing point.

Lorne.—Commencing at Bass Straits at a point S. 63 deg. 56 min. E. distant 314 links from the south-east corner of Crown allotment 4, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence north-westerly by a road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 6, section XX.B, township of Lorne, parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence south-westerly by a road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 2, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence by the western boundary of the said allotment 11 and by the western boundary of Crown allotment 1, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth, to the Erskine River; thence north-westerly by the said Erskine River to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 3, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence southerly by the western boundary and easterly by the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence south-westerly by a line being the western boundary of Crown allotments 38, 39, 40, 41, 36, 37, 42, 44, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, and 53, township of Lorne, parish of Lorne,

county of Polwarth, to the Cherry Tree Creek; thence by the said creek to its junction with Fisher's Creek; and thence by Bass Straits to the commencing point.

3. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pans and emptying and cleansing the same. The floor of every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

4. Every person who shall construct a privy in connexion with any building shall construct such privy outside such building at a distance of 20 feet at least from any dwelling-house or kitchen, or place where food is cooked or prepared, or from any public building or any building in which any person may be or be intended to be employed in any manufacture, trade, or business.

5. No person shall construct any privy within a distance of one chain from any well, spring, or stream of water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man or otherwise, in such a position as to render any such water liable to pollution.

6. Every hotel, boarding-house, common lodging-house, factory, or workroom shall be provided with proper closet accommodation in the proportion of one closet at least for every eight persons or fraction of eight persons accommodated or capable of being accommodated therein, or (in the case of a factory or work-room) who are employed therein, and where different sexes are accommodated or employed all such privy accommodation and approaches thereto shall be separate for the sexes.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the Council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid and removed in the day-time to such place as the Council may have appointed, and a pan cleansed by super-heated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the Council shall be left in its place. No one except the person authorized by the Council shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. Any occupier or other person who commits a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach is committed or continued.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

DISTRICT EXTENDED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That the Dandenong Waterworks District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the Schedule hereto, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1920, the said Dandenong Waterworks District shall be deemed to be so extended.

SCHEDULE.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring a Road on a Site taken for a Deviation of a Main Road fit for use.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 9th day of August, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest price or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business of a maker of paper bags," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 9th day of August, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(7) The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, No. 2650, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which this Board has not fixed piece-work prices but has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

(8) All materials except paste brushes used in the manufacture of paper bags, including string, paste, and wrappers, must be provided by the employer free of charge in order that piece-work prices or rates payable may be nett.
