BOARD OF INQUIRY AS TO PENTRIDGE PENAL ESTABLISHMENT.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 10th day of August, 1920, appointed—

- (a) The circumstances under which several prisoners confined in the Pentridge Penal Establishment did, on or about the 3rd July last, become improperly possessed of certain contraband and other articles.
- (b) The measures which should be taken to prevent any further occurrence of the kind referred to, and to prevent the escape of prisoners from the Penal Establishment named.
- (c) The existing methods of searching premises and prisoners' cells adopted in the establishment referred to, and the sufficiency of the same.
- (d) The existing methods of supervision of prisoners in the establishment and of its staff, and the sufficiency of the same.
- (e) The methods adopted of checking material given out daily to prisoners to make up or work upon, and of safeguarding material which may be accessible to prisoners in the establishment from appropriation or improper interference by prisoners.
- (f) The methods adopted for preventing the improper introduction of material and articles into the Penal Establishment with coal supplies and other matters and things, and the sufficiency of such methods.
- (g) As to the desirability of effecting alterations, additions, or improvements (including repairs), structural and otherwise in the prison buildings and premises, and, if so, what.
- (h) And generally as to what changes in the existing regulations and methods of administration may be considered advisable to insure greater efficiency.

And, further, His Excellency, with the advice aforesaid, has directed that the said William Dickson, Esquire, shall be Chairman of such Board.

SHIRE OF TALBOT.

TALBOT WATER SUPPLY.—GENERAL BY-LAW.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred, by the *Water Acts 1915-1916*, do hereby make the following Regulations for the control and management of the waterworks within the Talbot Water Supply District and of all races and channels connected therewith (whether within such district or otherwise):—

1. The Council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by special arrangement. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless by special arrangement with the Council as to the amount to be charged for their use, or if required by the Council the water to be supplied by meter capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

2. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

3. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Council the person applying for same shall satisfy the Council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the sum of One pound as the fee for such licence. The Council shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Council without giving two days' notice to the Council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Council without the permission of the Council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine the property of the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, or who shall make such communication except under the supervision and according to the direction of some officer of the Council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council. Galvanized-iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service-pipe of a larger bore than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch (three-quarter) will be allowed unless by special consent of the Council.

9. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

10. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same

with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
13. Any person interfering in any way with any water-race or channel connected with the waterworks, the property of the Council, without authority, or diverting or taking any water therefrom without such authority, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. If any person supplied with water by the Council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such persons either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

15. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Council, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Goods Act 1918 (No. 2983) to make Regulations for, among other purposes, prescribing the character of the trade description, indicating the country or place in or at which goods specified for the purposes of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "Special Goods") were made or produced, and the manner in which the same is to be applied. 1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the "Goods Acts Regulations (character and manner of indicating country of origin of Special Goods) 1920," made on the 18th day of May last past (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations").

2. In the case of Special Goods imported or introduced into Australia, which under some law of the Commonwealth for the time being in force require to have applied to them a trade description, indicating the country or place in or at which such goods were made or produced, if such particulars have, in accordance with the requirements of any Commonwealth Act or Acts, and the relevant regulations thereunder, been so applied, the character of the inscription and the manner in which it is applied, in accordance with the requirements of the Commonwealth law, shall be accepted as satisfying the requirements of the Principal Regulations with respect to the character of the inscription referred to, and the manner of its application, notwithstanding anything in the Principal Regulations contained, and the character of the inscription and its manner of application conforming with Commonwealth law shall be accepted as sufficient for the purposes of the Goods Act 1918, and the Regulations thereunder, as if the Regulations had specified the Commonwealth character of inscription and manner of application as an alternative to the methods prescribed by the Principal Regulations themselves in respect of the goods in question.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated in the parish of Worooa, county of Weeah, and is from five to seven miles south, south-west, and south-east of Boinka Railway Station.

Applications (with uncancelled Victorian duty stamp of 5s. or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 25th September, 1920.

The land will be granted under selection purchase lease, and at the end of six years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, the lease will be indorsed under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to the effect that such conditions have been complied with, and at any time within the remaining period of 14 or 34 years (as the case may be) a Crown Grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will range from £11 to £12 per allotment.

The amount of loading (3s. per acre) is to be collected in instalments, therefore its cash value, about 1s. 11d. per acre only, will be the limit of expenditure for road and water improvements.

The half-yearly payment on each allotment as set out in Schedule hereunder, includes the amount of loading.

The lease will contain (*inter alia*) conditions to the effect as follows:—

That substantial and permanent improvements to the value of 5s. per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the lease, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.

The first half-year's rent and lease-fee must be paid prior to issue of lease.

That the lessee shall go into residence on the land within twelve months after the date of the lease, and shall reside for at least three years and nine months on, or within five miles of, the land during the first six years of the term of the lease, and shall also clear and cultivate at least one-fourth of his allotment within two years of obtaining a permit to occupy the land.

That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession or grant the use of the whole or any part of the allotment during the first six years of the term of the lease, and that after the first six years of the term of the lease the lessee shall not sell, transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of the allotment unless and until the lease has been indorsed under the seal of the Board to the effect that all the conditions and covenants of the lease during the first six years thereof have been complied with.

No person who already holds or has previously selected the area of Mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to apply.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,280 acres if in the third class. Any further area (limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,600 acres, if the land be in any other class.

That the lessee or grantee or owner shall preserve the timber on, or plant an area of, not less than 3 per cent. of the total extent of his holding. (N.B.—Along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern, would be preferable.)

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____" as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Fuel and Fodder Board, or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

(6) Chimneys, flues, fireplaces and heating apparatus. Part VIII.—(1) Ventilation and lighting. (2) Open spaces about buildings. Part IX.—(1) Means of escape and provisions for reducing risk of fire in buildings. (2) High buildings, factories and shops. Part X.—(1) Fire-resisting construction. (2) Steel
