## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do hereby repeal the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of May, 1920, and publish in the Victoria Government Gazette of the ninth day of June, 1920, re Protection of Native Game at Warrapingo, and do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1915.

Part of Victoria referred to:—The property known as Warrapingo, near Beaufort, containing 925 acres, more or less, being allotments 8 and 3c and subdivisions A and B of

allotments 1 to 7, section 17, parish of Wongan, also the Salt Lake and surrounding reserves containing 61 acres, more or less, situated between the above-mentioned allotments 8 and 3c, parish of Wongan, county of Ripon.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF JEERALANG, KNOWN AS "BILLY'S CREEK PICNIC RESERVE."

**W**E, James Sargeant, David James White, Frank Wesley Coleman, David Hendry, John Daniel Howard, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the parish of Jeeralang known as "Billy's Creek Picnic Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and also for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees, in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
  5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  6. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  7. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  8. No person shall be publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
  9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
  10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
  11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good each loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
  12. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESPECTIVELY IN THE TOWNSHIP OF REDRUTH, KNOWN AS THE "WANNON PARK RESERVE."

**W**E, Edward James White, Alfred Peter Mackenzie, John Richard Moodie, Isaac Holt Short, James Garland, William Falkenberg, and Thomas Francis O'Neill, the duly reserved by Orders in Council of the first day of December, 1909, the twenty-fourth day of February, 1915, and the twentieth day of March, 1917, as sites for Public Purposes appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily and Public Recreation respectively in the township of Redruth, and known as the "Wannon Park Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, chattels or other property in and around the Reserve, or pollute any water in the Reserve or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, plants or trees.
4. No person shall interfere with or injure the trees, shrubs, flowers or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein or commit any nuisance therein or leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, rubbish, or any litter in the Reserve.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management save and except in fire places erected or set apart for such purpose.
6. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or flowers.
7. Public betting in any part of the Reserve (including all buildings and enclosures) shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the buildings or enclosures and the Reserve.
8. No person shall bring any dog into the Reserve unless held by a chain or cord.
9. No person shall bring or drive into the Reserve any sheep, cattle, horses, goats, or any live stock without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and any pigs, geese, or goats trespassing thereon shall be liable to be removed.
10. Any horses ridden or driven into the Reserve shall be securely fastened or tethered at the place set apart for that purpose, by the person riding or driving the same into the Reserve.
11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any fire-arm or other lethal weapon, and no person shall discharge any fire-arms or air-gun projectile therefrom in the Reserve.

12. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve:—

- (a) Being drunk, or using profane, indecent or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated in the parish of Worroo, county of Weeah, and is from five to seven miles south, south-west, and south-east of Boinka Railway Station.

Applications (with uncanceled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 25th September, 1920.

Two or more applications for allotments may be made at the same time by any one person without affixing more than one duty stamp of 5s.

Applicants will be hereafter notified as to the date and place of hearing of their applications by Local Land Board.

The land will be granted under selection purchase lease, and at the end of six years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, the lease will be indorsed under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to the effect that such conditions have been complied with, and at any time within the remaining period of 14 or 34 years (as the case may be) a Crown Grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will range from £11 to £12 per allotment.

The amount of loading (3s. per acre) is to be collected in instalments, therefore its cash value, about 1s. 11d. per acre only, will be the limit of expenditure for road and water improvements.

The half-yearly payment on each allotment as set out in Schedule hereunder, includes the amount of loading.

The lease will contain (*inter alia*) conditions to the effect as follows:—

That substantial and permanent improvements to the value of 5s. per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the lease, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.

The first half-year's rent and lease-fee must be paid prior to issue of lease.

That the lessee shall go into residence on the land within twelve months after the date of the lease, and shall reside for at least three years and nine months on, or within five miles of, the land during the first six years of the term of the lease, and shall also clear and cultivate at least one-fourth of his allotment within two years of obtaining a permit to occupy the land.

That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession or grant the use of the whole or any part of the allotment during the first six years of the term of the lease, and that after the first six years of the term of the lease the lessee shall not sell, transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of the allotment unless and until the lease has been indorsed under the seal of the Board to the effect that all the conditions and covenants of the lease during the first six years thereof have been complied with.

No person who already holds or has previously selected the area of Mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to apply.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,230 acres if in the third class. Any further area (limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in any other class.

That the lessee or grantee or owner shall preserve the timber on, or plant an area of, not less than 3 per cent. of the total extent of his holding. (N.B.—Along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern, would be preferable.)

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and windbreaks.
