(2) He shall seal up the several parcels and indorse the same with a description of the contents thereof respectively, and the name of the district and the date of the polling, and sign his name to such indorsement, and shall forthwith forward the parcels to the registrar of licensing courts, to be by him safely kept for six months.

(3) The said registrar shall forthwith give or send to the returning officer a receipt under his hand for the said packets and parcels.
