Health Act 1915.

SHIRE OF STAWELL.

BY-LAW No. 9, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1915.

A By-law of the shire of Stawell, made under the provisions of sections 314, 315, 316, 317, and 321 of the *Health Act* 1915, and numbered 9, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet pans, dung, soil, and other manures named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Stawell make the following By-law:—

1. All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Marnoo and in the Water Reserve, being allotment 138A, parish of Marnoo, all in the county of Kara Kara (technical description of boundaries at foot hereof).

4. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the above area from the operation of this By-law.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

6. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Shire Council.

7. At least once a week or so much more frequently as the Shire Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart; and the Council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

8. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Shire Council shall be left in place of the one removed.

9. Every closet within the aforesaid area shall consist of a suitable privy building constructed with proper openings and flues to provide the ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of any earth or deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Shire Council, or be trenched or ploughed into the land in such locality as may be provided by the Shire Council.

11. The occupier of any land in the shire of Stawell on which there shall be erected any stable, cow yard, or cattle shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the Shire Council at the expense of such occupier.

12. No occupier or person shall use such a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

13. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil; and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan, placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

14. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other persons save those authorized by the Shire Council for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove any night-soil, except in cases of exemption.

15. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Shire Council over all premises, which may be inspected by the Shire Council or its officers from time to time, or any person duly authorized by the Council.

16. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach

shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

Technical Description of Boundaries mentioned in Clause 3.

Commencing at a point 11 chains 95 links north from south-east angle of allotment 101A, parish of Marnoo; thence west 8 chains through said allotment to the west angle thereof; thence south-east to the south angle of said allotment; thence across a 1-chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 124; thence west across the 3-chain road and along the north boundary of allotment 120 to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly along the Wallaloo Creek to the north-east angle of allotment 133b; thence south-east to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence across a 1-chain road to allotment 138c; thence north-east along allotment 138c to the north-west angle of allotment 138b; thence along the north boundary of said allotment to the north-east angle thereof; thence north-west along the 3-chain road to the south-east angle of allotment 120; thence across the 3-chain road to the south-west angle of allotment 125; thence east to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence north to the point of commencement.

A By-law under the Health Act 1919 for fixing the fees for registration and renewal and transfer of registration of premises.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the City of Footscray, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens thereof, hereby orders and enacts that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation—

1. The fees for the granting or annual renewal of registration of premises shall be as follows:—

Nature of Premises and Fees.

- Offensive trades premises—Five pounds.
- Boarding-houses—Ten shillings.
- Common lodging-houses—Ten shillings.
- Eating-houses—Ten shillings.
- Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar lines, lemonade, cordial, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

2. The fee for any transfer of registration shall be Two shillings and sixpence.

SHIRE OF PRESTON.

BY-LAW No. 22.

A By-law of the shire of Preston, made under Parts 7 and 31 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 22, for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance-fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon the Council's Reserves, and also for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon or in such Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the shire of Preston order as follows:—

1. The By-law of the shire of Preston made and passed on the 22nd day of March, 1909, and confirmed on the 3rd day of May, 1909, entitled By-law No. 2, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law the word "Reserves" shall mean—

All that piece of land situate at corner of High and Gower streets, Preston, and known as Shire Hall Reserve.

All that piece of land situate in Edwardes-street, known as Edwardes' Park.

All that piece of land situate between Cramer and Bruce streets, known as Cramer-street Park.

All that piece of land situate in High-street, known as High-street Park.

All that piece of land situate in Wood-street, known as Wood-street Park.

"Council" shall mean the Council of the municipality of the shire of Preston.

3. The Reserves shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such days as the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches shows sports fêtes or holiday amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve of every person.

4. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates stick bills thereon or cut or in any way damage the buildings fences gates or seats or roll or throw stones or other missiles or commit any nuisance in the Reserves or leave therein

any bottles papers cast-off clothing or any litter or write or draw upon any buildings fences or seats.

6. No person shall light any fire in the Reserves without the permission in writing of the Council.

7. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or laid out for plantations of trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall engage in the Reserves in any game or sports on a Sunday except as provided in any By-law of the Council.

9. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation shall engage in or play upon occupy or use the said Reserves or any of them or any part thereof without the permission in writing of the Council.

10. No person shall engage in cricket football lacrosse baseball tennis or any other like game in the Reserves or any of them without the permission in writing of the Council unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

11. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves shall ride or drive any horse or any carriage cart or other vehicle through the Reserves without the permission of the Council and no person shall ride any bicycle in the Reserves except on any track set apart for cycling.

12. No person shall enter the Reserves or any of them on any day set apart for cricket or football matches shows sports fêtes regattas or holiday amusements except on production of a ticket issued by the Council or any club association or person authorized by the Council to issue such ticket for admission—or by any club association or person renting the Reserves or any of them or any part thereof for the time being—duly authorizing the admission of such person; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon; nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building erection enclosure or cultivated plot within the Reserves and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

13. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserves or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council or by the club association or person renting the ground for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserves notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these By-laws.

Factories and Shops Acts.

REGULATIONS REGARDING THE MANUFACTURE OF WHITE LEAD, RED LEAD, AND LITHARGE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of August, 1920.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process or labour used in factories is dangerous, make such regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process or labour: And whereas the Honorable Matthew Baird, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has certified that the manufacture of white lead, red lead, or litharge is dangerous generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf, doth make the following Regulations regarding employment in the manufacture of white lead, red lead, or litharge (that is to say):—

THE MANUFACTURE OF WHITE LEAD, RED LEAD, OR LITHARGE.
Duties of Employer.

1. No male under eighteen years and no female of any age shall be employed at any work exposing him or her to the dust of white lead, red lead, or litharge.
2. For every employee employed at any work exposing him to the dust of white lead, red lead, or litharge, overalls of an approved pattern and material shall be provided, maintained, and at least once a week thoroughly cleaned.
3. For every employee engaged in packing or handling dry white lead, dry red lead, or litharge or drawing stoves, a respirator of approved pattern and material shall be provided. Every respirator shall be cleaned daily, and, when not in use, shall be kept in a suitable place set apart for the purpose.
4. The floors of the workroom shall be cleaned daily after being thoroughly damped.
5. The dressing room, bath, lavatory, and sanitary conveniences shall be thoroughly cleaned daily.

6. Before each meal, in addition to the regular meal times, and before the end of the day's work, at least ten minutes shall be allowed to each worker for washing.

7. An adequate supply of hot and cold water, soap, turpentine or oil, nail brushes, and clean towels shall be provided and maintained in the bathroom.

8. There shall be kept available for the use of employees either:—

- (a) a medicinal compound prescribed by a duly qualified medical practitioner as being suitable for counteracting the pathological effects of lead absorption or for aiding elimination of lead from the human system, or
- (b) a medicinal compound of the following ingredients:—Sulphate of magnesium (Epsom salts), 2 ounces; water, 1 gallon; lemon syrup, sufficient to flavour.

Duties of Employees.

9. No person shall smoke nor chew tobacco nor take snuff while employed in a lead process.

10. No person shall partake of nor prepare food or drink while employed in a lead process.

11. No person shall perform any work involving exposure to lead dust unless he has on an overall suit and head covering, and no person shall work at drawing stoves, or packing, or handling dry white lead, red lead, or litharge, unless he is also wearing a respirator.

12. No person, on leaving a workroom, shall enter the luncheon room nor partake of food until he has taken off his overalls, head covering and respirator and placed them in the place provided for the purpose, nor until he has also thoroughly washed face and hands in the lavatory.

To follow Chapter 1, Clause 6, Class F, of the Regulations under the Factories and Shops Acts made on the third day of February, 1920.

CLASS G.

Buildings for the manufacture of white lead, red lead, or litharge:—

All floors shall be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain into impervious drains.

Efficient control of dust and fumes shall be provided by exhaust draught, &c.

A luncheon room shall be provided for the use of employees, so constructed and placed as to be free from dust or fumes generated in the manufacturing process, and having no direct communication with a workroom.

Two dressing rooms shall be provided. In the first shall be removed and stored all private clothing put off by the workmen during working hours. In the second shall be put on, removed and stored all overalls and other clothing worn only while at work.

Such dressing rooms shall be so constructed and placed as to be free from any dust or fumes generated in the manufacturing process.

A bathroom with bath and lavatory accommodation shall be provided. The lavatory accommodation may consist of lavatory basins or washing troughs as follows:—

One lavatory basin to every five persons or fraction of five persons employed, or washing troughs of sufficient length to allow two feet at least to every five persons or fraction of five persons employed.

If practicable, the bathroom shall be situated between the dressing rooms.

A closed cupboard shall be provided wherein to keep respirators when not in use, also apparatus for washing and sterilizing them.

And the Honorable Matthew Baird, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Differentiating Principles (situs or place of origin of a commodity) Regulations 1920."

2. In the case of any Proclamation to be made under the provisions of the *Necessary Commodities Control Act 1919* fixing prices or declaring maximum rates of profit at which necessary commodities within the meaning of the said Act may be sold or supplied or which may be charged or received in respect of the same the principles or conditions may be had regard to whether generally or in any particular case a different price or rate of profit should not be fixed or declared and if so what.

(a) When the commodity or some part thereof is made or produced in Victoria from that when the same or some part thereof is made or produced elsewhere.

(b) When the exact situs of the commodity is considered in relation to the sale or supply, that is, whether in manufacturer's store, or on rail, or in wholesale traders store or in retail traders store.

And the Honorable Harry Sutherland Wightman Lawson, His Majesty's Solicitor-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

(a) All fixtures and all vehicles, means of locomotion, tools, utensils, articles, equipment, apparatus, and accessories used for in or in connexion with any building of any kind or for in or in connexion with transport or means of transport whether by land or sea or for in or in connexion with any occupation, trade, or business or for in or in connexion with domestic purposes.

(b) Any article or product which enters into or is used in the composition or preparation of any of the foregoing articles or things.
