Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE MANUFACTURING CHEMISTS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 8th October, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) a wholesale or a manufacturing chemist;
(b) manufacturing toilet preparations, perfumery, essences, essential oils, food preservatives, branding fluids, deodorants, disinfectants, fungicides, insecticides, vermin destroyers, weed destroyers,

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 8th October, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—All work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, Good Friday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day and Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the rate of double time, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above holidays, the special rates shall be payable only for the days so substituted.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF NIGHT WATCHMEN'S BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 11th October, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

(b) Section 217 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* provides that "any person employed as a watchman shall be granted one holiday in every week."

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the occupation of a night watchman," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 11th October, 1920, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any time worked in excess of 66 hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(4) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees, i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than 33 hours, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
