No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for Tha Public Service Examination only.

Sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as clerks. Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £72 rising to a maximum of £264 a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided their certificate of discharge is furnished with their application, they may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £156 a year.

BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under section 197 of the Local Government, Act 1915, and numbered 15, for regulating the traffic through and over the roads and streets of the borough, and for preserving order therein.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Oakleigh do order as follows:

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriageways, footways, or other public places of the borough, shall discontinue to do so upon requirement by any member of the police force, and every person who fails or refuses to move on when so required shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings for each and every offence.

2. No person shall feed any horse except by means and out of a nosebag containing the forage and attached to the head of the horse. No person shall remove the blinkers or bridle of any horses in a street, and every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled while it is standing upon any stand or upon or in any street in the borough. Every person offending against this clause of the By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings for each and every offence.

BY-LAW NO. 10.

Made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, numbered 16, providing for the care protection and management of the reserves, parks, gardens and plantations in the Borough of Oakleigh under the control of the Council thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh do order as follows:—

1. "Reserve" shall mean any reserve, park, garden or plantation under the care or control of the Council.

2. No person in a state of intoxication or who is disorderly shall enter or remain in the reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

3. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage or destroy the scats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers or any property in the reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in the reserve any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter or refuse of any kind.

4. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the reserve, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences or other structures, or otherwise deface the same or wrife thereon.

5. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations

enter any plots therein which may be enclosed by provided or for other purposes.

7. No assemblies for fêtes, pienies or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained, nor shall any person preach or deliver any public address therein without the like consent.

8. No person, unless authorized by the Council in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the reserve any article, fruit, or merchandise.

9. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals.

10. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council in writing, shall bring into or use in the reserve any cart, truck, bicycle, motor cycle, motor car, wheelbarrow, or other vehicle of any description whatsoever.

11. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or harangue in the reserve.

12. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the reserve, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books,

ing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

13. No person shall play at or engage in any game, athletic sport or gymnastic exercises in the reserve.

14. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Council, carry, use or discharge any firearms in the reserve.

15. No person shall in any part of the reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any park-keeper or other servant of the Council.

16. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or on any structure or erection within the reserve.

17. No booth, tent or other structure shall be erected within the reserve without the consent in writing of the Council.

11. No poots, tent or other structure shall be erected within the reserve without the consent in writing of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in the reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member or employee of the Council to leave the same.

19. Subject to these regulations and any resolution of the Council, all reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, and no person shall go, be, or remain therein at any other time.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and, taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
