Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Monday, the 1st November, 1920. An application on the proper form must also, on or before such date, be made to the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Intermediate Examination as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application (both Public Service and University), may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Monday, the 22nd November, 1920, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as clerks. Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £72 rising to a maximum of £264 a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided their certificate of discharge is furnished with their application, they may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £156 a year.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION. . . REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF POLLING PLACE.

BY-LAW No. 936.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban System of Waterworks for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d.—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (2) Of any such tenement the valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. 8d.—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £300 and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £700.
- (3) Of lands on which there is no building—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1920, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1921, and shall be payable on the first day of October, 1920, at the office of the Commission, at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said district, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

#### BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.

##### BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 15, for regulating the traffic through and over the roads and streets of the borough, and for preserving order therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Oakleigh do order as follows:—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriageways, footways, or other public places of the borough, shall discontinue to do so upon requirement by any member of the police force, and every person who fails or refuses to move on when so required shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings for each and every offence.

2. No person shall feed any horse except by means and out of a nosebag containing the forage and attached to the head of the horse. No person shall remove the blinkers or bridle of any horses in a street, and every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled while it is standing upon any stand or upon or in any street in the borough. Every person offending against this clause of the By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings for each and every offence.

#### BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.

##### BY-LAW No. 18.

Made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915.  
A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, numbered 18, providing for the care protection and management of the reserves, parks, gardens and plantations in the Borough of Oakleigh under the control of the Council thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh do order as follows:—

1. "Reserve" shall mean any reserve, park, garden or plantation under the care or control of the Council.

2. No person in a state of intoxication or who is disorderly shall enter or remain in the reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

3. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers or any property in the reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in the reserve any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter or refuse of any kind.

4. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the reserve, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences or other structures, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

5. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

6. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

7. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained, nor shall any person preach or deliver any public address therein without the like consent.

8. No person, unless authorized by the Council in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the reserve any article, fruit, or merchandise.

9. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals.

10. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council in writing, shall bring into or use in the reserve any cart, truck, bicycle, motor cycle, motor car, wheelbarrow, or other vehicle of any description whatsoever.

11. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or harangue in the reserve.

12. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the reserve, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

13. No person shall play at or engage in any game, athletic sport or gymnastic exercises in the reserve.

14. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Council, carry, use or discharge any firearms in the reserve.

15. No person shall in any part of the reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any park-keeper or other servant of the Council.

16. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or on any structure or erection within the reserve.

17. No booth, tent or other structure shall be erected within the reserve without the consent in writing of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in the reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member or employee of the Council to leave the same.

19. Subject to these regulations and any resolution of the Council, all reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, and no person shall go, be, or remain therein at any other time.

20. Any person offending against this By-law shall, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
