. . Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAINTERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 25th October, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Hamilton, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol; the Shire of Moorabbin; and Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—(a) Painting, other than ship painting, or painting under the jurisdiction of any Wages Board heretofore appointed or hereafter to be appointed; (b) Paperhanging, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 25th October, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(8) Tools and Appliances.—That if any employee (except an apprentice or an improver, for whose use all necessary tools are supplied by the employer) is required to provide any tools or appliances other than those mentioned, viz.:—

A painter—Other than an ordinary dusting brush and all necessary stripping and stopping knives, hammer, hacking knife, serewdriver, and glazing knife;

A paperhanger—Other than a lay-brush, scissors, rule, plumb-bob, chalk-line, trimming knife, hammer, hacking knife, screwdriver, glazing knife, surface and joint rollers;

A signwriter—Other than a mahl-stick, rule, straight edge, chalk line, pencils and gilding cushion, mop, knife, and tip,

6d. per hour in addition to the ordinary rates fixed by this Determination shall be paid by the employer.
