PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring a Road on a Site taken for a Deviation of a Main Road fit for use.

COMMISSION OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

HEALTH ACT 1919.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO NOTIFIABLE INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of September, 1920.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, No. 3041, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the regulations following relating to notifiable infectious disease (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Notifiable Disease Regulations 1920, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Notifiable Infectious Disease” includes the diseases known as ancylostomiasis, bilharziasis, cholera, cerebro-spinal meningitis, diphtheria, leprosy, malaria, plague, poliomyelitis, polioencephalitis, puerperal fever, scarlet fever, small-pox, tuberculosis, typhus fever, typhoid fever, yellow fever, and any other infectious disease declared by proclamation to be a notifiable infectious disease.

3. All regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

4. Every medical practitioner who becomes aware that any person visited or professionally attended by him is suffering from a notifiable infectious disease, or who by *post-mortem* examination or otherwise becomes aware that any person has died of a notifiable infectious disease, shall immediately—

(a) furnish a written certificate to the Council containing the particulars hereunder prescribed—

1. Surname and Christian name of the patient.
2. Age, sex, and duration of illness.
3. Nature of the disease.
4. Full address of patient; and

(b) inform the head of the household or the occupier of the premises and any person nursing or in immediate attendance on the patient of the infectious nature of the disease and the precautions to be taken to prevent its conveyance to others.

5. The fees payable by the Department of Public Health to medical practitioners in respect of the notification of cases of infectious disease to the Council shall be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each case in private practice, and One shilling for each case in any hospital or public institution: provided that such fees shall not be payable unless notifications in the prescribed form are sent forthwith on diagnosis being made.

6. The Council on receipt of notification of any case of infectious disease shall forthwith cause the house wherein the patient dwells to be visited by the Medical Officer of Health or by any person authorized by the Council in that behalf, and such Medical Officer of Health or authorized person shall make such inquiries and obtain such particulars as are necessary to enable the Council to prevent the spread of infection, and to carry out any duty conferred or imposed on it by the Act or regulations thereunder relating to notifiable infectious diseases.

7. Every Council receiving information that any person suffering from a notifiable infectious disease removes, or is removed, from any house within its district to a house in another municipal district, shall forthwith inform the Council of that district of such removal, and supply all particulars within its knowledge relating to such person that will enable such latter Council to safeguard the public health.

8. The Council shall, in respect of every case of notifiable infectious disease reported to it, ascertain whether any inmate of the house wherein the case occurs attends any school, and, if so, the Council shall forthwith, on learning the fact, inform the head teacher or person in charge of the school of the occurrence of such case.

9. Every Council shall, in respect of notification of infectious disease received from medical practitioners, furnish weekly returns to the Commission of Public Health containing the particulars hereunder prescribed—

- (a) Name and address of patient.....
- (b) Age and sex
- (c) Nature of disease
- (d) Date of notification and date of receipt.....
- (e) Duration of illness.....
- (f) Occupation.....
- (g) Place of occupation or school attended
- (h) Milk supply.....
- (i) Name of notifier

10. The occupier of any house wherein a case of notifiable infectious disease occurs, and in which any child attending school resides, shall, on becoming aware of the existence of such case, forthwith inform the head teacher or person in charge of the school whereat the said child attends of the occurrence of such case.

11. The occupier of every house, or part of a house, and the person in charge of every school, orphanage, or similar institution, or other premises, wherein any person suffering from any notifiable infectious disease resides, shall forthwith, on becoming aware of the fact, report the occurrence to the Council, giving the age and sex of the patient and the nature of the disease: provided that if the case has already been reported to the Council it shall not be necessary for him to do so.

12. The occupier of any house wherefrom any person suffering from a notifiable infectious disease removes, or is removed, shall forthwith, after the removal of such person, inform the Council of the district in which such house is situate of the removal of such person, and supply the particulars following:—

- (a) Name, age, and sex of such person;
- (b) The nature of the disease; and
- (c) The address of the place to which such person removes or is removed.

13. Every registrar of deaths shall, on registering any death due to a notifiable infectious disease, forthwith report such death to the Council of the district in which the deceased person resided, and also to the Commission of Public Health, and supply the particulars hereunder prescribed—

- (a) Name of deceased.....
- (b) Place of residence.....
- (c) Cause of death.....
- (d) Duration of illness.....
- (e) Age and sex
- (f) Date and place of death
- (g) Date of registration
- (h) Medical attendant.....

14. The fee payable by the Public Health Department to a Registrar of Deaths for reporting a death due to a notifiable infectious disease to the Commission and to a Council shall be One shilling for each death reported in accordance with the provisions of the preceding clause.

15. Any Council or person that fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS AND TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF NEWSTEAD AND MOUNT ALEXANDER.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon petitions certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of each particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any hairdresser or tobacconist within the North Riding of the municipal district of the shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander to be kept open until half-past Nine o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week.

REGULATION OF TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF SALE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the borough of Sale, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any tobacconist within the municipal district of the borough of Sale to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until Eight o'clock.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE HARDWARE BOARD AND OF THE STOREMEN PACKERS AND SORTERS BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the township of Myrtleford, within the municipal district of the shire of Bright, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby vary the following Regulations made on the fifth day of October, 1915, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1912, as amended by the Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914), within the municipal district of the shire of Bright, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 3 of the Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

- (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday,
- (b) One o'clock on the afternoon of Friday,

so that such Regulations shall apply to the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Bright outside and excepting the township of Myrtleford.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BOOLARA.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the township of Boolara, within the municipal district of the shire of Morwell, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the sixth day of November, 1916, providing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the said township of Boolara, within the municipal district of the shire of Morwell, shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

PROTECTION OF NATIVE GAME ALONG THE
WIMMERA RIVER, NEAR JEPARIT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation dated 30th December, 1914, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 6th January, 1915, re protection of native game along the Wimmera River, near Jeparit, and direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1915*.

Parts of Victoria referred to:—

A BY-LAW of the City of South Melbourne, made under the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 202, for the purpose of—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections or hoardings;
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings;
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund, any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done, or to be done, by any of the officers under such By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council;
- (e) Prescribing the minimum area upon which any dwelling-house may thereafter be erected;
- (f) Providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land;
- (g) Providing, with respect to buildings thereafter erected, for—

- (i) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
- (ii) Means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings;
- (iii) The ventilation and lighting of buildings;
- (iv) The minimum size of any dwelling rooms.

- (h) Regulating or prohibiting the keeping or storage of anything, in the opinion of the Council, injurious to health or dangerous.
- (i) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials, within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council; and
- (j) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

This By-law to have application throughout the whole of the City of South Melbourne.
