IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance, and exercise of, the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth, hereby, make the By-law, following:—

1. The following Irrigation Charge is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands in the Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply District to which lands water rights (the extent of which is set out, in the revised Register, of Lands, adopted by the Commission on the 26th day of July, 1920), have, under the provisions of the Water Acts, been apportioned by the Commission within the said district, which district is, by notice given in the Government-Gazetic of 1st September, 1920, declared to be supplied with water, for irrigation under the provisions of the said Acts:—

For the supply of water for the irrigation of lands to which

For the supply of water for the irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned as aforesaid, an Irrigation, Charge of Five, Shillings, for, each and every acre-foot of water, apportioned to such lands as water rights.

2. Such charge is made, and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of September, 1920, and ending with the 30th day of April, 1921, and shall be payable on the 12th day of November, 1920, at the office of the Commission, at Swan Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said Irrigation Charge.

2. If any person acts in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Every person not being the owner or occupier of a hoarding, building or fence, and not being a person employed by such owner or occupier, who shall attach or fix any advertisement to, or paint any advertisement upon the said hoarding, building or fence, shall upon the request or demand of any member of the Police Force, or officer of the Council, produce to him for inspection the written consent of the owner or occupier relating thereto, and, if he fails so to do, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, unless he has a reasonable excuse and does within seven days produce such written consent at some Police Station specified by the member of the Police Force requesting or demanding its production, or, in the case of a request or demand by an officer of the Council, at the Municipal Offices, Town Hall, Melbourne.

A By-law of the shire of Moorabbin, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the Local Government Act 1915, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, and numbered 42, with reference to street traffic.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 and of section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Moorabbin order as follows:-

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or

Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

Horse" includes mule and donkey.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power and includes a motor cycle but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

"Public place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare may be formed on private property. Nothing herein contained shall be held to divest the owners of such property of their rights or property therein and their power to resume the sole use and occupation thereof.

Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire other than a footway.
