As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. Unless otherwise specified in the schedule the firewood tendered for must consist of either box, red or white gum, or peppermint, or proportions of each. Tenders for messmate will not be entertained. Tenderers to specify in their tenders the kind or kinds of these woods, and the proportions of each kind tendered for.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of firewood or charcoal by the Commonwealth Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be in accordance with those provided for by the Fuel and Fodder Board or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts, and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be therein determined; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and all other respects.

BY-LAW No. 157.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 157, for regulating and controlling the attaching or fixing of advertisements to, or painting of advertisements upon hoardings, buildings, or fences within the said city, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the 6 George V., number 2686, and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the By-law and orders as follows:—

Attaching, &c., of Advertisements.

1. No person who is not the owner or occupier of a hoarding, building or fence, and who is not a person employed by such owner or occupier, shall attach or fix any advertisement to or paint any advertisement upon the said hoarding, building, or fence without the written consent of the said owner or occupier first had and received.

Contravention of Provisions an Offence.

2. If any person acts in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Consent of Owner or Occupier to be Produced on Demand.

3. Every person not being the owner or occupier of a hoarding, building or fence, and not being a person employed by such owner or occupier, who shall attach or fix any advertisement to, or paint any advertisement upon the said hoarding, building or fence, shall upon the request or demand of any member of the Police Force, or officer of the Council, produce to him for inspection the written consent of the owner or occupier relating thereto, and, if he fails so to do, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, unless he has a reasonable excuse and does within seven days produce such written consent at some Police Station specified by the member of the Police Force requesting or demanding its production, or, in the case of a request or demand by an officer of the Council, at the Municipal Offices, Town Hall, Melbourne.

Person Advertising also Guilty of Offence.

4. (a) Every person whose name, trade name, firm name, trade mark, or design shall constitute the whole or part of or shall appear as part thereof, upon any advertisement attached, fixed, or painted by any person, known or unknown, acting in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law, unless such first-named person shall establish to the satisfaction of the Court that the said advertisement was so attached, fixed, or painted without the authority, express or implied, of such first-named person.

Not to Apply to Printers of Posters, &c.

(b) Provided that this section shall not apply to any person whose name appears as aforesaid merely in conformity with the provisions of the *Printers and Newspapers Act 1915*, or any statutory amendment or modification thereof for the time being in force.

Employer also Guilty of Offence.

5. (a) Any person who employs a person for the purpose of attaching or fixing advertisements to, or painting advertisements on a hoarding, building or fence, or any hoardings, buildings or fences, shall, if the person so employed acts in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof, also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Independent Contract no Defence.

- (b) It shall be no defence to a charge brought under this section that the person so acting by contravention of the provisions of this By-law was employed as an independent contractor by such employer.

Penalty.

6. Every person who is guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

7. In this By-law "persons" where the context permits includes person, firm, company, and corporation.

Application by By-law.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city.

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CITY OF MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 156.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 156, for regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road within the said city, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality of the city of Melbourne, or under the control and management of its Council thereof, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the 6 George V., number 2686, and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the By-law and orders as follows:—

Writing, &c., upon Footpaths, Streets, or Buildings Prohibited, except as provided.

No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement whatsoever—

- (a) Upon any building, fence, lamp, post, gate, or other property vested in the Council of the city of Melbourne, or under the control or management of the said Council, without the written consent of the said Council first had and received, or
- (b) Upon any footpath, street, or road.

Contravention of Provisions an Offence.

2. If any person acts in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Consent of Owner or Occupier to be Produced on Demand.

3. (a) Every person who shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any such letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement to any such building, fence, lamp, post, gate, or other property as aforesaid shall, upon the request or demand of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, produce to him for inspection the written consent of the Council relating thereto, and, if he fails so to do, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, unless he has a reasonable excuse, and does within seven days produce such written consent at some Police Station specified by the member of the Police Force requesting or demanding its production, or, in the case of a request or demand by an officer of the Council at the Municipal Office, Town Hall, Melbourne.

Not to Apply to Persons acting under Express Direction of Owner, &c.

- (b) Provided, however, that this section shall not apply to any such person who was acting under the express direction and control of the Council in writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing the said letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement.

Person Advertising also Guilty of an Offence.

4. (a) Every person whose name, trade name, firm name, trade mark, or design shall constitute the whole or part of, or shall appear as part thereof, upon any figure, device, poster, or advertisement written, painted, printed, stencilled, placed, or affixed by any person, known or unknown, acting in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law, unless such first-named person shall establish to the satisfaction of the Court that the said figure, device, poster, or advertisement was so written, painted, printed, stencilled, placed, or affixed without the authority, express or implied, of such first-named person.

Not to Apply to Printers of Posters, &c.

- (b) Provided that this section shall not apply to any person whose name appears as aforesaid merely in conformity with the provisions of the *Printers and Newspapers Act 1915*, or any statutory amendment or modification thereof for the time being in force.

Employer also Guilty of Offence.

5. (a) Any person who employs a person for the purpose of writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing letters, figures, devices, posters, signs, or advertisements shall, if the person so employed acts in contravention of any of the provisions of section 1 hereof, also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Independent Contract no Defence.

- (b) It shall be no defence to a charge brought under this section that the person so acting in contravention of the provisions of this By-law was employed as an independent contractor by such employer.

Penalty.

6. Every person who is guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

7. In this By-law "persons" where the context permits includes person, firm, company, and corporation.

Application by By-law.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city.

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SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the shire of Moorabbin, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and numbered 42, with reference to street traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Shire" means municipal district of the shire of Moorabbin.
 - "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin.
 - "Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat and swine species respectively.
 - "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car.
 - "Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.
 - "Horse" includes mule and donkey.
 - "Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power and includes a motor cycle but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.
 - "Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.
 - "Public place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare may be formed on private property. Nothing herein contained shall be held to divest the owners of such property of their rights or property therein and their power to resume the sole use and occupation thereof.
 - "Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire other than a footway.
 - "Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC GENERALLY.

2. The driver of a vehicle or motor car upon any street and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any street shall except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

- (1) Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.
- (2) When meeting a vehicle, motor car, tramcar, horse or pedestrian keep on the left or near side of the street.
- (3) When passing of any vehicle, motor car, horse or pedestrian going in the same direction go on the right or off side of such vehicle, motor car, horse or pedestrian.
- (4) When passing by a tramcar going in the same direction pass the same on the left or near side thereof.
- (5) Before stopping or turning round in any street, or turning from one street into another give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or a motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car or by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.
- (6) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left hand side of the street which he is entering as shown in the subjoined diagram.
- (7) Not leave the same unattended except for a few minutes only and except it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic.
- (8) Cause the same to be drawn as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side of the street and parallel thereto and brought to a standstill on the approach of and during the passing of any fire engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to the scene of any fire.

3. The driver of a vehicle or a motor car upon any street shall—

- (1) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side.

- (2) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any other person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle or motor car.

4. Every driver of a motor car or bicycle upon any street shall within reasonable distance and before passing any other vehicle or motor car horse or pedestrian give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell or other instrument.

5. No person shall between sunset and sunrise drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street or permit any vehicle or motor car to be upon any street unless good and service able lamps suitable to such vehicle or motor car are securely fixed one at each side of the front of such vehicle or motor car and are lighted and are so placed that the lights therefrom are distinctly visible to persons in front of such vehicle or motor car as white lights and to persons at the rear of such vehicle or motor car as red lights. Provided that in any case where a red tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear. Provided also that in case of a bicycle or motor bicycle one front white light and one red tail light shall be sufficient.

6. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street or permit any vehicle or motor car to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle or motor car is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle or motor car and no person while driving any vehicle or motor car upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

7. No person shall ride any horse or drive any vehicle or motor car along any street in such manner or in such order that more than two horses vehicles or motor cars are travelling side by side in the same direction. The foregoing provisions of this section shall not apply to horses vehicles or motor cars which form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

8. No person shall ride any horse or other animal or drive or impel any vehicle or motor car upon any footway. Provided however that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC.

9. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his right hand side of the footway and shall when meeting or overtaking any person pass on the left-hand side of such person.

10. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon.

STREET PROCESSIONS.

11. No procession of persons or of vehicles or motor cars or of any combination of persons vehicles or motor cars shall except for military or funeral purposes parade or pass through any street unless with the previous consent in writing of the Shire President or the Shire Secretary and by the route specified in such consent and unless and until the recipient of such consent has given at least twenty-four hours' notice with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of the police through whose district the procession will travel.

LAWFUL DIRECTIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH.

12. Every person in the shire shall—

- (1) In respect of all or any of the following matters, that is to say—

- (a) Approaching or departing from any footway or street,
- (b) The manner of taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods in any footway or street, or
- (c) The regulation of traffic in any footway or street,

at all times to obey and conform to any notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Shire President or in his absence or in the case of sudden emergency under the hand of the Shire Secretary and shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.

- (2) Upon any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council in order to enforce the due observance of any law, by-law, regulation, or lawful notice, holding up his hand or giving an order or direction, stop for so long or proceed in such manner and direction as such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council deems necessary to allow free space between any persons, procession or vehicles, or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.

- (3) If any horse or vehicle or motor car in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council to remove such horse, vehicle, or motor car, remove the same either from the vicinity or

to some such adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as is indicated by the member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.

- (4) On the request of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council produce to him for inspection any order, leave, licence, or other written authority relating to the traffic in the shire and held by such person.

Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any direction order or request given or made as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

PREVENTION OF NUISANCES AND ACCIDENTS.

13. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footway or on any street crossing habitually used by pedestrians.

14. No person shall put, throw, or allow to fall and remain upon any footway the skin or peel or stem of any fruit or the leaves or any part of any vegetable.

15. No person shall wear or carry in any street or footway any pin or other article or any implement in such a manner as is likely to inflict injury by coming in contact with any other person.

16. No person shall feed any horse in a street except by means and out of a nosebag containing the forage and attached to the head of the horse.

No person shall remove the blinkers or bridle of any horse in a street. And every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled while it is standing upon any stand in the shire or standing in a street.

17. No person shall when driving any vehicle or motor car in any street use any brake the application of which to such vehicle or motor car produces a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto. The employer of the driver of any vehicle or motor car on which a brake is used contrary to this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

18. No person shall drive upon any street any vehicle or motor car, which is loaded or partly loaded with steel or iron rails or other material of any sort or description unless such rails or other material are or is so packed or stowed either by being separated by sacks or bags or by some appropriate means as to prevent such rails or other material from producing a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto. The employer of any person acting in contravention of the foregoing provisions of this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

19. No person shall without the permission in writing of the Shire Secretary carry in a street upon any vehicle motor car or otherwise any load or structure exceeding ten feet in height or fifty square feet in area.

20. No person shall upon a vehicle or motor car having less than four wheels carry in any street any material, article, or thing exceeding twenty-five feet in length.

21. No person shall upon any vehicle or motor car carry in any street any material, article, or thing which, whether forming the whole or part only of the load, projects more than two feet outside the line of the wheels or sides of the vehicle or motor car.

22. No person shall in a street so carry anything upon any vehicle or motor car that any part of the thing carried touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.

23. No person shall in any street at one and the same time act as driver or have the sole charge of more than one vehicle drawn by animal power or of more than two vehicles or motor cars fastened together and no person under fifteen years of age shall in any street act as the driver or have the sole charge of any vehicle or motor car driven within the shire for business or trade purposes.

24. No person shall at any time between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Six o'clock p.m. of any day cause interruption or annoyance to passengers upon any street or footway by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or footway whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

25. No person who is the owner of or has the care or management of any lift or tackle shall permit such lift or tackle to project over any footway or lane in the shire and no person shall swing or hoist goods across or over any footway or lane in the shire by means of any lift or tackle which so projects or shall otherwise use such lift or tackle.

26. No person shall place on any street or footway to the obstruction or annoyance of any member of the public or carry on any vehicle or otherwise any placard board or other thing by way of advertisement unless he has obtained from the Shire Secretary a permit so to do.

27. No person upon any street or footway shall to the obstruction or annoyance of any other person thereon give out or distribute to bystanders or passers-by any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers, and no person shall litter any street or footway by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

28. No person shall drive any locomotive steam engine over upon, or along any street at any time unless he has obtained a permit from the Shire Secretary so to do.

29. No person upon any street or footway shall, to the obstruction or annoyance of any other person thereon, make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue.

30. No person upon any street or footway shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue after being required to desist by any member of the Police Force or by any officer of the Council or by any inmate of any house within fifty yards of such person.

31. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods in any street or footway in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use thereof.

32. No person selling or offering for sale any goods in any street or footway shall without special permission in writing from the Shire Secretary occupy any fixed stand or shall loiter in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway and every such person shall move on upon being so required by any officer of the Council or any member of the Police Force.

33. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections, by act or omission, shall be an offence against this By-law.

34. Every person who is guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Moorabbin.
