LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

Important Notice to Electors.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1919, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1921.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with a Sixpenny duty stamp necessary for payment for the right.

Regulations under Public Service Act.

Act No. 2713, Section 71, (VIII).

The Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby repeals Chapter VI. of the Regulations, made on the 15th November, 1915, and all amendments thereof, and makes the following Regulations, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council.

To take effect as from the 1st July, 1920.

CHAPTER VI.**CLASSIFICATION OF GENERAL DIVISION.**

1. When it is necessary to fill an office in the General Division it shall—unless it be found absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service—be filled by the transfer or promotion thereto of the officer who in the opinion of the Commissioner possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

2. In the case of appointments, transfers, or promotions to any office in the General Division, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule.

3. Where a minimum salary is not assigned to his office in the Schedule the officer shall be entitled to be paid the salary in the Schedule without addition thereto.

4. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate, within the minimum and maximum limits, to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Commissioner provided that an officer on his first appointment to the service shall be paid at the minimum rate of his office.

5. Increments of Twelve pounds each—at intervals of not less than twelve months—may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the Schedule.

6. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service, and the recommendation (after independent inquiry) of the Commissioner.

7. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office or grade in the General Division shall thereupon be junior to any officer already in such office or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule he shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion provided it be not greater than the maximum rate for such office or grade.

8. Where an officer has, previously to his transfer or promotion, been paid the same salary as in his new office, time served in such former office may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 9.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1920 which the occupiers or owners of lands tenements or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a main one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

BY-LAW No. 41.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, the amount of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Eight pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of more than Eight pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every water trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 50,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre but

not exceeding one acre, per annum 100,000 gallons; for every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre. In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Ninepence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply is to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July, 1921, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

Rating By-law for 1921.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the district, of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for the water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or land valued under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal valuation, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings or upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, except in the case of the supply by meter to the Mooroopna Hospital, to which institution the charge shall be Eightpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. For every public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st day of December, 1921, and the rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1921.

7. Such person or persons as the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 14.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid or where houses or tenements if not fronting such street are supplied with water by reticulation, and being of an annual valuation of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of One pound five shillings (25s.).

2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10) the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound on the annual value of such property.

5. Such beforementioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1921, and shall be payable on the 1st January, 1921.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust area, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of water supplied by special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust by special agreement may make a reduction to not less than Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. A charge of 7d. per 1,000 gallons will be made to the Wimmera Inland Freezing Co. Ltd. for pumping water.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the previous clauses, the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also applies to the Freezing Works.

11. On properties where the officers consider it necessary, a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off, according to the powers conferred by the Water Acts.

The foregoing By-law No. 14 was made by the Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts, this 16th day of September, 1920.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MORNINGTON AND PARISH OF MOOROODUC; THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MOOROODUC AND TOWN OF OSBORNE; AND THE PORTIONS OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF MOOROODUC, TOGETHER KNOWN AS "THE MORNINGTON FORESHORE RESERVES."

WE, George Flood, Leonard John Flannagan, John Gibson Barrett, Peter Kenneth McArthur, Robert Nunn, Peter Olson, and William Stanley, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Mornington and parish of Moorooduc; the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Moorooduc and town of Osborne; and the portions of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the parish of Moorooduc, together known as "The Mornington Foreshore Reserves" (hereinafter called the Reserves), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or leave the Reserves except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserves.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
4. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces on the Reserves as the Committee think necessary, and any person lighting or using fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserves save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.
5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Reserves.

6. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, destroy, or remove the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or any survey pegs or permanent marks therein.

7. No person shall put or cause to be put on to any part of the Reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, save as hereinafter provided.

8. Certain portions of the Reserves may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in the custody and care of those using the same provided that the owner or user for the time being shall tie up such horse in such a way as not to cause or permit any damage to any fences, trees, seats, or other improvements and the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Reserves, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

9. No person shall tether or cause to be tethered, on any part of the Reserves except as otherwise herein provided, any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals.

10. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserves, or in any public or private bathing-box, boat-shed, or other building upon the Reserves.

11. No person shall use the closets or urinals, or any portion of such closets or urinals, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portions of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for such purposes.

12. Certain portions of the Reserves may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the use of persons desirous of swimming or bathing horses in Port Phillip Bay under such conditions as the Committee may from time to time determine, and then only before 8 a.m. and after 3 p.m.

13. No person except workmen employed by the Committee of Management in the Reserves shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or marram grass.

14. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserves except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

15. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserves between Beleura and Balcombe's Creek.

16. No person shall erect any booth or other structure or offer for sale any article in the Reserves without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing.

17. No person shall throw any stone or other hard substance, nor play cricket or any other game with a hard ball, within the Reserves.

18. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserves or leave therein on the beach anything which would injure bathers.

19. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in any part of the Reserves extending from Beleura to Mount Martha.

20. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boat-shed in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

21. No person shall bathe from the Reserves unless decently attired from the neck to the knee, and no person shall enter or leave the Reserves in bathing costume only.

22. No person shall use or cause to be used any bathing-box or boat-shed for residential purposes.

23. The Committee of Management may, from time to time, notwithstanding any Regulation herein to the contrary, issue permits in writing to such persons and for such periods of time as they may deem fit for the purpose of enabling such persons to graze cattle, horses, or sheep on such portions of the Reserves and for such periods of time and under such conditions and the payment of such fees as the Committee may determine; such conditions, time, and fees to be set out in such permits, and the number of horses, cattle, or sheep permitted to be grazed named in such permits and the holder of such permits shall not be liable to the penalties incurred under these Regulations as regards wandering cattle so far as the locality fixed in his permit is concerned during the currency of such permit and the payment of the fees in connexion therewith.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or

member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

In the case of erections or hoardings erected or constructed prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, the Council or its officer authorized for the purpose, may serve upon the owner of the premises upon which any such erection or hoarding is erected or constructed a notice in writing requiring such owner to pull down and remove any such erection or hoarding, and if such owner shall not comply with such notice or requirement within seven days from the service thereof he shall be guilty of wilful default contrary to this By-law, and liable as hereinafter mentioned.

4. In the case of erections or hoardings hereafter erected or constructed (a) without the consent of the Council, or (b) otherwise than in conformity with such plan and specification, the Council or its officer authorized for the purpose may serve upon the owner of the premises upon which any such erection or hoarding is erected or constructed a notice in writing requiring such owner to pull down and remove any such erection or hoarding, and if such owner shall not comply with such notice the Council is hereby authorized to pull down and remove such erection or hoarding and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such erection or hoarding and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

5. No person shall, without the consent of the Council, attach or fix to or paint any advertisement on any hoarding or on any building or on any fence, rock, cliff or tree.

6. The Council may obliterate, abolish or remove any advertisement upon any hoarding, building, fence, rock, cliff or tree, if the same is unrightly or objectionable.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the borough of Hamilton.

8. Any person or corporation for wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
