THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District) make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.
2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal value.
3. Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand gallons (10,000).
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per thousand gallons (1,000).
5. Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
6. For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.
8. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
9. In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to make a special charge.
10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show-grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.
12. For all tenements in the said District situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, shall be one quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.
13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1921.
14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within its Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. *Minimum.*—Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Nine pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. *Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Nine pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. *On Valuation above Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Nine pounds sterling, or more than Nine pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

4. *Special Rates.*—For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. *Notice to Install Meter Within Seven Days.*—The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes that the water supply is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter, and if any person neglects to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 sterling. The Trust may, in the event of failure to comply with such notice, cut off the supply of water to such house or premises either by cutting off the pipes by or through which the supply is taken from the main or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as such notice is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trust or its officers, and neither such cutting off of pipes nor the cessation of such water supply as aforesaid shall relieve any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

6. *Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge.*—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence three-farthings per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

7. *Meters to be Tested and Approved.*—The Trust may cause a meter to be affixed in any case where it considers necessary, such meter to be provided by the consumer and fixed at his expense. No meter shall be fixed unless approved of by the Trust, nor unless it shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. *Syphons.*—Syphon pipes will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

9. *Public Institutions and Others.*—Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.

10. *Irrigation.*—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

11. *Where Meter Ceases Registering, &c., Average May be Charged.*—If the meter shall cease registering the Trust shall, during the time it is out of order or undergoing repairs, estimate and charge the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

12. *Unlicensed Person not to Interfere with Pipes or Services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. *Licences to Plumbers to be During Pleasure of the Trust.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such licence. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

14. *Notice of Work Proposed to be Given.*—Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. *Notice to Lay Services, &c., to be Given.*—No service-pipe shall be laid for the purpose of connecting with pipes of the Trust unless two (2) days' prior notice thereof be given to the Trust, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth of less than 12 inches below the surface of the ground in the streets. The day for connecting private services to the Trust's pipes shall be Thursday in each week.

16. *Special Size Service.*—No service of a larger pipe than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch with $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. tap will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

17. *Service-pipes to be Repaired by Owner or Occupier—Penalty for Refusal or Neglect to Repair Service.*—If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the occupier or owner of the tenement supplied by such service-pipes the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. *Waste of Water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds per day for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. *Special Provision for Steam Boilers.*—Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

20. *Overflow to Baths.*—Overflow pipes to baths or basins will not be permitted.

21. *Sale of Meter.*—The Trust will upon the application of an intending consumer supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery.

22. *Meter Reading.*—The meter reading shall be *prima-facie* evidence of the quantity of water consumed.

23. *Testing Meters—Owner or Occupier to give Notice of Removal from Premises.*—In the event of the owner or occupier being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice shall forward the sum of One pound which if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter

be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced or another meter will be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the owner or occupier shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. *Water Rate Outside Trust's Area.*—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

24. *Water Troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

25. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Nhill Waterworks Trust, and "he" shall also mean "she."

26. *Excess Payments.*—Where water meters are affixed the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Period of Rate.—That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1921, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1921, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

ORBOST WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.—No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rating By-law, viz:—

A By-law for determining the rate which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty-six pounds (£26) sterling.

2. A minimum rate of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty-six pounds (£26).

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the net annual value of such rateable property valued over Ten pounds (£10), provided that no such allotment shall pay less than One pound (£1) sterling.

4. For every water trough a charge of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum; maximum amount of water for each trough 30,000 gallons.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) sterling per annum for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred (200) gallons or under, a charge of Two shillings (2s.), to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling (1s.) for every thousand (1,000) gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be—If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

9. Such before-mentioned rates and charges shall be based on the municipal valuation of the shire of Orbost for the time being, and (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1921.

10. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

PYRAMID HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 16.

THE Commissioners of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 16, determining the rate payable for the Year 1921, for Water supplied within the boundaries of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of Three shillings (3s.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property situated within the Waterworks District of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1921.

2. The minimum rate on any tenement used as a domicile shall be Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.).

3. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains, lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the secretary of the Trust who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same; the fee for such permit shall be Fifty shillings (£5 10s.) for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch in diameter. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

5. A minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) and a maximum rate of Two pounds (£2) sterling shall be charged any person, as the Commissioners may determine, for using water for garden watering during the year in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such water is used.

6. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply, nor will allow any water to be taken under clauses 5 and 6, until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

7. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable on the first day of March, 1921.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

RIDDELL'S CREEK WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

A By-law of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust made under the powers conferred by the Water Acts for the purpose of levying, imposing, and receiving a rate.

A RATE of Two shillings in the pound (£1) sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Romsey, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1921, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1921.

The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings. The rate hereby made shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1921, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of July, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover all rates and charges due to the said Trust.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.—No. 26.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to, and in exercise of, the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(1) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

(3) For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land. Provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be charged.

(4) For all the lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down; and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

(5) For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling; and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

(6) All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—15,000 gallons for the first 20s. of the assessed water rate, and for each additional 20s. of assessed rate or portion thereof at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons; all excess water shall be charged for at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons; but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

(7) Water supplied to the Government Departments; religious denominations, public parks, bowling-grounds and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

(8) The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1921. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

(9) Such persons or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(10) No person without previously having affixed a water meter to his service pipes, shall use for other than domestic purposes, water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

(11) No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the Secretary of the Trust for the time being, that such meter is in proper order.

(12) Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

(13) Every meter shall be fixed truly level with connections above ground, approved by the Trust's supervising officer, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within three feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought iron bands must be fixed on each side of the meter, or lead connections used. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

(14) The Trust will, on application, supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery or on time payment on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash deposit, and the balance bearing interest of eight per centum per annum by annual payments of Ten shillings.

WARBURTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Warburton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1921.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of £25 or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under £25 sterling, the minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.).

4th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

5th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of under Ten pounds sterling (£10), the minimum sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.).

6th. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum.

7th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which; at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

8th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, or plastering.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW, 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1921.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Twelve pounds or under, municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twelve pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and eightpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said District situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth the above-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first of July, 1921. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 2686), direct that the provisions of Division 13 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedule, shall apply to the election of Councillors for the said Municipality, with the alteration of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedule, the same being alteration deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

WHEREAS by the *Education Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to Regulation XXI.—Scholarships—of the Regulations under the aforesaid Act:—

REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

22A. In addition to the fifty-five senior technical scholarships under clause 22 above, four senior technical scholarships, or any less number shall be awarded annually to candidates who have been in regular attendance for at least three years at a senior technical school in Victoria and who have completed an approved course of study in some branch of engineering, or science, or architecture, and who are qualified for admission to courses for degrees in engineering or in science, or for the Diploma of Architecture at the University of Melbourne. One such scholarship shall be awarded to the student who is awarded the "Simon Fraser the Younger" scholarship. Not more than one of these four scholarships shall be awarded in any one year to candidates for a course in science or in architecture.

22A. The four senior technical scholarships under clause 22A above shall be of the value of £40 per annum, and will be tenable for two or three years at the University of Melbourne under the following conditions, namely:—

- That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the term immediately following the award of the senior technical scholarship, enter as a student at the University of Melbourne, and that he shall, during the whole term of tenure, be enrolled as attending lectures in as many subjects as may be allotted by the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering or Science;
- That the continuance of the scholarship shall be recommended annually by the Professorial Board of the University of Melbourne,

and that the following clause be substituted in lieu of clause 24:—

24. Senior technical scholarships under clauses 22 and 22A above, other than the senior technical scholarship awarded to the holder of the "Simon Fraser the Younger" scholarship, will be awarded on application to the Director, which must be made on a prescribed form before the first day of November in each year. Applications for senior technical scholarships, other than the senior technical scholarship awarded to the holder of the "Simon Fraser the Younger" scholarship, will be dealt with by a Board consisting of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Art, and a member of the teaching staff of the University of Melbourne nominated by the Minister. In all cases the decision of this Board shall be final. Where, in the opinion of the Board, such a course is considered necessary, a competitive examination may be held. The details of this competitive examination will be determined by the Board.

It shall be lawful for the shop of any grocer within a radius of one mile of the Portsea Post Office within the municipal district of the shire of Flinders to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until Nine o'clock.

REGULATION OF CHEMISTS' SHOPS WITHIN PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF FLINDERS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Flinders, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any chemist within the radius of half-a-mile of the Sorrento Post Office within the municipal district of the shire of Flinders to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until Eight o'clock.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF FLINDERS.

- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday.
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday.
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE NICKEL WARE BOARD.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR AGRICULTURAL SHOW YARDS IN THE TOWN OF WHITTLESEA.

WE, Robert Ernest Dawson, Patrick William John Murphy, George Sutherland, William Holman James, and John Mason, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 10th October, 1905, as a site for Agricultural Show Yards in the town of Whittlesea, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. Except on the occasion of the annual show of the Whittlesea Agricultural Society, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management, or of some person duly authorized by them, enter upon any part of the Reserve or any building, shed, or premises therein.
3. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management, or of some person duly authorized by them, enter or remain within any building, shed, tent, or other premises in the Reserve, or in or upon any part thereof, after 7.30 p.m.
4. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows shall be as follows:—
 - (a) For the admission of each person not under the age of twelve (12) years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One Shilling and sixpence.
 - (b) For the admission of each person to the grand stand or special enclosure in the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
 - (c) For the admission of each horse, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
 - (d) For the admission of each vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One Shilling and Sixpence.
5. No person except the judge or judges, stewards, and officials appointed by the Committee of the Whittlesea Agricultural Society to act in the particular class then exhibiting, exhibitors and authorized attendants (and such persons as may be authorized by the Committee of Management) shall enter the judge's box, the show ring, the judging ring, or any other place where exhibits are being judged in the Reserve.
6. No person shall enter the committee room, stewards' room, or offices of the Whittlesea Agricultural Society, or the approaches thereto respectively, in the Reserve except the committee, stewards, and officials of the said Society and those authorized by such committee or stewards.
7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fence, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or light fires therein, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Enclosure and Reserve.

12. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
