PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to authorize and validate certain Expenditure by Councils of Municipalities in connexion with the Visit of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and Memorials in connexion with the Recent War.”

“An Act to repeal Section Thirteen of the *Public Service Act 1920*.”

“An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Connecting Line of Railway to the Morwell Brown Coal Workings.”

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Nine hundred and forty-one thousand three hundred and sixty-two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.”

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW NO. 24.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (e) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a

rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1921, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1921, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1921, at the office of the Water Commission at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. Such persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.—NO. 27.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Eighteen pounds (£18).
2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Eighteen pounds (£18).
3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).
4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged at a rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1921, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purpose beyond such amount aforesaid.
5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter (¼) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter (¼) of a mile and within half a mile (½) thereof, a quarter of the before-mentioned rates. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1921, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1921, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1921, and shall be due and payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on such rateable property. Such rate shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1921.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law :—

Rating By-law for 1921.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921, in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District :—

(1) For every house and tenement up to Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

(2) For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds and over annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling.

(3) For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

(4) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(5) The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

(6) For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision or wastes or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

(7) For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

(8) For every water trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made; but on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

(9) For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

(10) For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

(11) The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

(12) Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extensions, the Trust shall have the power to make special arrangement with them regarding the payment for water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

(13) The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1921, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance or as may be agreed upon.

(14) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1921 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust which District has for the purposes of the Water Acts been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust :—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be made on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

3. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).

4. For every livery, coach, and carrier's stables the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, each six feet is to be considered one stall.

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would equal the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of January, 1921.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.—No. 36.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law :—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District :—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be One pound five shillings.

2. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely a charge of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust). Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound five shillings.

3. For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District the charge shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust. Such minimum charge shall be computed at the charge of Two

shillings in the pound sterling according to the municipal valuation of the property so supplied; and for all water supplied in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound five shillings.

4. Such rates and charges other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1921, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1921.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which all householders, or occupiers, or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water for the said Trust for the year 1921:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds and not exceeding Thirty-two pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two pounds sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Thirty-two pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (d) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- (e) A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening or stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (f) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of Two pounds sterling per annum. Provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust District, a rate of One pound sterling per annum will be charged.
- (g) The charges for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes the quantity used in excess shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (h) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brick and plastering shall be made; or if there is no contract, then upon the value or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork or plastering. Persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention to do so.
- (i) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.
- (j) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

(2) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1921, and the 1st day of July, 1921.

(3) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

APPROVAL TO CONSTRUCT A TRAMWAY CURVE CONNECTING THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN TRAMWAY BOARD'S TRAMWAYS IN BURKE AND RIVERSDALE ROADS, CAMBERWELL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of December, 1920.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 37 (e) of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918* (No. 2995), doth hereby approve of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board constructing a curve connecting the Board's electric tramways in Burke and Riversdale roads, Camberwell, for the purpose of enabling cars to be transferred or pass from one line to another and for the more efficient operation of the tramway undertakings of the Board.

ROUTE.

That the route of the said curve shall be as follows:— Commencing at a point in Riversdale-road approximately ninety-five (95) feet west of the intersection of Riversdale-road and Burke-road; and thence in a north-easterly direction to a point approximately ninety-five (95) feet north of the intersection of Riversdale-road and Burke-road, Camberwell.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway curve shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 7 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Board. Provided always that all cars shall be stopped before entering the curve and that the conductor shall proceed to obtain a full view of the thoroughfare into which the car is about to enter, and shall signal the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that the road at the curve is clear.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars while travelling on the said curve shall not exceed four (4) miles an hour.

And the Honorable Frank Clarke, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to unite any number of municipalities, one of which is a shire, the municipal districts whereof form one continuous area, so as to form one shire, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of sub-divisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Act the number of councillors assigned to any municipality, and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition under the common seals of the Borough of Rutherglen and the Shire of Rutherglen respectively, has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been duly published, and no counter petition received: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council in compliance with the prayer of the petition aforesaid, doth by this present Order unite the respective areas comprising the borough of Rutherglen and the shire of Rutherglen so as to form one municipality under the name and title of the shire of Rutherglen, the boundaries of which shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth re-subdivide the shire of Rutherglen as now re-constituted into five separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which also shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a Council consisting of fifteen members shall be elected accordingly, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN (ADDED TO AND REDEFINED).

Commencing at the junction of the Ovens and Murray Rivers; thence south-easterly by the former river to the south boundary of the parish of Brimin; thence easterly by that boundary to the west boundary of allotment 6, parish of Boorhaman; thence south by a road, east by allotments 6, 6a, and C to the boundary of the last-named parish; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 40, east by a road to a point in line with the centre of the road between allotments K and L, section 11, parish of Chiltern West; thence southerly by a line and the said road to the south boundary of the parish of Chiltern West; thence easterly by that boundary to the point where it meets the west boundary of allotment 4, section Z, parish of Chiltern West; thence northerly by the said west boundary and road along west boundary of allotment 7 of section Z to the north-eastern railway, and south-westerly by that railway to a point opposite the south-west angle of allotment 6a, section 16; thence northerly along west boundary of that allotment to its north-west angle; thence easterly by road along north boundary of that allotment to south-west angle of allotment 2, section C, and northerly by west boundary of that allotment and by a direct line due north to the Black Dog Creek; thence south-easterly and north-easterly along that creek to the south-west angle of allotment 102; thence northerly by road along west boundaries of allotments 102, 79, 78, 77, 76, 75, 74, 73, 72, 71, 70, and 69 to the north-west angle of last-named allotment; thence easterly by road along north boundaries of allotments 69, 72a, 63a, 65a, through township of Durham and along south boundaries of allotment 157a and Water Reserve to the centre of the road forming the eastern boundary of Water Reserve, allotments 157a, 157, 158a, 154, and 150; thence northerly by that road to the north-east angle of last-named allotment; thence west by road along north boundary of allotment 150 to the south-east angle of allotment 175a; thence north-easterly by road along the east boundaries of allotments 175a, 175, 175a, and 175c to the road at the south-east angle of allotment 179b on the west boundary of the parish of Chiltern; thence northerly and easterly by the west and north boundaries of the parish of Chiltern to the Indigo Creek; and thence northerly by that creek and westerly by the Murray River aforesaid to the commencing point.

BROWNS PLAINS RIDING (UNALTERED).

Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth order as follows:—

There shall be added to the list of explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1, made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality, and character of which are hereby defined:—

CLASS 3—NITRO-COMPOUND.

Division 1.

A.2 Monobel.—Consisting of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of ammonium, woodmeal and chloride of potassium or chloride of sodium; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine and chloride of potassium or chloride of sodium do not exceed 11.5 per cent. and 25 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive, with or without not more than 2 per cent. of carbonate of magnesium. Provided also that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

Ligdyn 26 per cent.—Consisting of nitro-glycerine uniformly mixed with and absorbed by woodmeal and mixed with nitrate of sodium and glauber salt; provided that the nitro-glycerine does not exceed 26 per cent. of the finished explosive.

CLASS 6—AMMUNITION.

Division 2.

Fuse Lighters—Dragon Brand.—Each consisting of a waterproof paper cylinder, not exceeding one-third of an inch in diameter, charged with chlorate of potassium and nitrate of barium in equal parts, mixed with shellac and gum, so compressed as to give a uniform burning rate of approximately 20 seconds to the inch and not containing its own means of ignition.

BY-LAW No. 4 UNDER HEALTH ACT 1919.

A By-law of the Borough of Ararat made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 4, for regulating and controlling the registrations of—

- 2. Offensive trades.
- 3. Boarding houses.
- 4. Common lodging houses.

- 6. Premises on which is manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream.

- 1. This By-law shall come into force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the borough of Ararat.
- 3. No person shall carry on a business, trade, or calling hereunder unless same is registered within the Council, and such registration will be at the rate of—

- 1. Cattle sale yards—One pound.
- 2. Offensive trades—One pound.
- 3. Boarding houses—Five shillings.
- 4. Common lodging houses—Five shillings.
- 5. Premises (whether a Licensed Victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificial aerated water—Five shillings.
- 6. Premises on which is manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream—Two shillings and sixpence.
- 7. For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence per annum, commencing from the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December in such year.
- 4. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
