INSTRUCTIONS FOR WEARING BADGES ROUND THE NECK BY THE POSSESSORS OF THE INSIGNIA OF MORE THAN ONE ORDER WHICH IS SO WORN.

Only one Ribbon and Badge, i.e., the *senior one*, is worn round the neck inside and under the Collar of the Uniform Coat, so that the Badge hangs about an inch outside and below the front of the Collar. All other Badges are worn, one below the other, commencing about an inch below the senior badge, each suspended on about 3 inches of ribbon emerging from between the buttons of the Uniform Coat. A small eye is stitched inside the coat to which the ribbon is fastened by a hook.

In Evening Dress, one Badge only is worn round the neck, and as a rule the *senior badge* is thus worn, unless a junior one should appear to be more appropriate to the occasion. The ribbon, from which this badge is suspended, is worn under the white tie, the badge hanging about an inch below. All badges are worn also, in *Miniature*, on the lapel of the coat.

These instructions will not affect the existing regulations with regard to the wearing of Insignia, in *Miniature*, by Naval and Military Officers.

WEARING OF ORDERS, DECORATIONS, AND MEDALS IN MORNING DRESS.

All members of the various Orders of Knighthood, &c., and all persons who have been awarded Decorations and Medals, may, should they wish to do so, wear their Insignia, Decorations, and Medals with morning dress on official occasions and at public functions.

The Ribbons of the Orders, Decorations, and Medals may be worn on all occasions at the discretion of the holder.

The method of wearing the Insignia of Orders, also Decorations and Medals, on official occasions and at public functions with morning dress is as follows:—

Knights Grand Cross
Knights Grand Commanders
Dames Grand Cross
Knights Commanders
Dames Commanders

Should wear the *Star only* on the left breast of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress, as the case may be.

Members of the Order of Merit
Men who are Members of the Order of the Companions of Honour
Companions of the several Orders of Knighthood
Commanders of the Royal Victorian Order
Men who are Commanders of the Order of the British Empire

Should wear the ribbon to which the Badge is suspended under the tie, which should be a bow, the badge hanging about three-quarters of an inch below the bow.

Women who are Members of the Order of the Companions of Honour
Companions of the Distinguished Service Order
Officers of the Order of the British Empire
Members of the 4th and 5th Classes of the Royal Victorian Order
Members of the Order of the British Empire
Persons who have been decorated with—
The Victoria Cross
The Royal Red Cross
The Distinguished Service Cross
The Military Cross
The Distinguished Flying Cross
The Air Force Cross
Persons who have been awarded medals

Should wear the Badges, Decorations, and Medals on the left breast of the coat, or in a corresponding place of the dress, as the case may be.

The method of wearing the ribbons of Orders, Decorations, and Medals, which will be the same in all cases, both for men and women, is as follows:—

A piece of the ribbon $\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide, or the width of the medal ribbon, and half an inch in depth, mounted on a bar of metal in the form of a brooch, to be worn on the left breast of the coat, or in a corresponding place on the dress, as the case may be.

NOTE.—The above intimation only refers to Morning Dress, and does not alter the regulations with regard to wearing Orders, Decorations, and Medals with Uniform, or with Evening Dress.

BOROUGH OF DUNOLLY.

BY-LAW UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

ACTING under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Dunolly hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate within the Water Supply District of Dunolly as duly defined upon the occupiers or owners of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district.

By-law No. 56.

The following are the rates which the occupiers and owners of tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1920 by equal half-yearly instalments, in respect of water supplied by the Council within the aforesaid district:—

- For Government buildings, other than the railway buildings, and all church, charitable, and other properties not rated, and on any vacant allotments that are rated, requiring to be supplied with water, such may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council.
- Water troughs, with ball tap, connected with hotels and erected on the public highway, £1 per annum.
- Fixed steam-boilers, exceeding two horse-power (excepting for flour mills), £3 per annum; and portable steam-boilers, exceeding two horse-power, £2 10s. per annum.
- Steam-boilers, used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.
- Water from the stand-pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.
- Flour mills requiring water for milling purposes, a charge of 3d. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.
- Victorian railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.
- On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.
- The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance, namely, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1920, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.
- Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

By virtue of the Water Acts, By-law for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1920, namely:—

- On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.).
 - On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound of such valuation.
 - On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings (17s.) shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One shilling (1s.) in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.
 - In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.
 - Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a Rate for the year 1920 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

- A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Melvor, but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound five shillings.
- A rate of Six shillings and threepence shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
- Tenements not facing a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.
- Tenements exceeding one quarter but not exceeding half a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.
- For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.
- Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

Rating By-law for 1920.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for the water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or land valued under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal valuation, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings or upwards according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, except in the case of the supply by meter to the Mooroopna Hospital, to which institution the charge shall be Eightpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. For every public water-trough supplied by the Trust the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1920, and the rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1920.

7. Such person or persons as the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served, under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out

curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

- *Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth, the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

and auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone and all copper tin iron antimony coal and all other metals minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin iron antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under the demised land together with liberty to His Majesty his heirs and successors and his and their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times hereafter during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine thereon or therein for gold silver copper tin iron antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to extract and remove therefrom any gold silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin iron antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives erect machinery and carry on any works and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining Provided always that the said land is and shall be subject to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a mining or mineral lease to enter thereon and to mine for gold silver copper tin iron antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those on which such person had at the time of the passing of the *Land Act 1915* the right to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands Provided that compensation shall be paid to the lessee or to the lessee's executors administrators or transferees by such person for surface damage to be done to such lands by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by law and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry And provided also that the said land may be resumed under section 168 of the *Land Act 1915* To have and to hold the said land unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns for the term of _____ years from the day of the date of these presents unless sooner determined as hereinafter provided (the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* having directed that no rent shall be payable for the first _____ years of the term) for the first _____ years rent free and thereafter yielding and paying for the same unto His Majesty the King his heirs or successors during the said term the rent of

per annum together with such further rent (if any) fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 296 of the *Land Act 1915* such rent to be always paid by equal half-yearly payments in advance on the first day of _____ and the first day of _____ in each year clear of all deductions the first of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of _____ that will be in the year 19 _____ and the last of the half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of _____ next preceding the expiration of the term of this lease And the lessee for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns doth hereby covenant with His Majesty his heirs and successors that he the lessee his executors administrators and assigns will observe perform and be bound by the several covenants conditions provisos agreements acts matters and things hereinafter contained (that is to say):—

NOTE.—The bearings and measurements are approximately given in this plan. The measurements are in links.

1. That he or they will during the said term pay unto His Majesty his heirs or successors the rent hereby reserved by equal half-yearly payments in advance on the days hereinafter appointed for the payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. That he or they will pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time payable by landlord or tenant in respect of the premises.

3. (1) That the lessee will not within the first six years of the term hereby granted—

(a) Unless he satisfy the Governor in Council that he is compelled by the sickness of himself or of his family or other adverse circumstances to leave his holding transfer or assign or part with the possession of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised or contract agree undertake or in any manner attempt so to do nor

(b) Mortgage or sublet the whole or any part of the land hereby demised nor

(c) Contract agree undertake or attempt to mortgage or sublet the whole or any part thereof nor

(d) Without the consent in writing of the Board of Land and Works take in stock for agistment thereon.

(2) That neither the lessee nor the lessee's executors administrators or assigns will at any time after the first six years of the term hereby granted sell transfer assign mortgage or sublet the whole or any part of the land hereby demised unless and until these presents have been indorsed under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to the effect that all the conditions and covenants of these presents during the first six years of the term hereof have been complied with.

(3) That these presents shall become absolutely void on any breach of the provisions of this covenant or (save as in the *Land Act 1915* or in the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* otherwise expressly provided) on the assignment or transfer whether by operation of law or otherwise of the whole or any portion of the land hereby demised.

4. That he or they will at once and to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works commence and continue to destroy and will within two years after the date of these presents have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works the animals and birds by the *Land Act 1915* included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare or have declared to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act or any Act thereby repealed upon such land and to keep the same free from such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the said Board during the first six years of the term hereby granted.

5. That the lessee will if not sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1915* within six years from the date of these presents enclose the land hereby demised with a fence of such kind as shall come within the meaning assigned to the word "fence" by the *Land Act 1915* and will keep the same in repair. Provided that if he or they prove to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works that owing to the physical conditions or the nature of the land hereby demised the enclosing thereof with a fence would be impracticable or if in the opinion of the said Board the enclosing of the whole or any part of such land with a fence is not required the Board of Land and Works may in writing accept as compliance with this covenant the expenditure by him or them on such land for substantial and permanent improvements of an amount equivalent in the opinion of the said Board to the cost of fencing.

6. That the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will on the land hereby demised in respect of each acre or fractional part of an acre thereof make substantial and permanent improvements certified in writing under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to be equivalent to the value of in each of the first years of the term hereby granted.

7. That he or they at all times during the term hereby granted will *bonâ fide* comply with all and will not violate any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1915*.

8. That the lessee during the first six years of the term hereby granted will keep in good condition and repair all buildings fences and other permanent improvements for the time being situate on the land hereby demised reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire or tempest alone excepted.

9. That the lessee will observe perform fulfil and be bound by the stipulations conditions covenants and provisos contained in the schedule hereto.

10. That in order to protect the interest (if any) of the Closer Settlement Board therein the lessee his executors administrators and assigns will insure and keep insured against fire all buildings on the land hereby demised by a policy made out in favour of the said Closer Settlement Board for such insurable amount as may be prescribed by regulations of the Governor in Council and as the said Closer Settlement Board may approve.

11. It is a condition of these presents that the Board of Land and Works or any person appointed by it in that behalf may at any time enter upon the land hereby demised to ascertain if the covenants and conditions hereof are being performed and observed by the lessee.

12. It is a further express condition of these presents that the same shall be absolutely void if it at any time be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that the lessee became such lessee in fraud of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* or that the lessee held or continued to hold this lease in violation of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1915*. And further that the same shall be voidable at the will of the Governor with the advice aforesaid in the event of any rent being in arrear whether the same has been demanded or not or in the event of any breach of or non-compliance with any of the covenants or conditions of these presents by the lessee or if there has been any violation of any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1915* applicable hereto. Provided always that the production of a copy of the *Government Gazette* containing a notice purporting to be signed by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Act 1915* either declaring or notifying that it has been shown to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that the lessee became such lessee in fraud of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* or that

be held or continued to hold this lease in violation of or non-compliance with some provision of the *Land Act 1915* or that the Governor in Council has exercised his will and avoided these presents for some breach or breaches of or non-compliance with any of the covenants or conditions hereof by the lessee or the violation of some provision of the *Land Act 1915* applicable hereto and in any of such cases that these presents are consequently void and of no effect shall be conclusive evidence of such voiding and of the existence and sufficiency of the facts justifying the same and the regularity of the procedure incidental to such voiding.

13. That ancillary and without prejudice to the provisions of the *Land Act 1915* it is hereby agreed that immediately upon these presents so becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiff or bailiffs of Crown lands or other agent or agents officer or officers authorized in that behalf by the Board of Land and Works without any demand whatever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee and all persons claiming from under or through the lessee for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case His Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law and that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whomsoever the defendant or defendants to such action may plead leave and licence thereto and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the lessee and all persons claiming from under or through him to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceeding.

14. The lands hereby demised shall during the currency of these presents be deemed lands of the Crown within the meaning of section 296 of the *Land Act 1915* and upon the making of any Order in Council under the provisions in the said section contained the enhanced rent therefor fixed by such Order in Council shall be payable in respect of such lands as though such rent had been so fixed prior to the making of these presents.

15. It is a condition of these presents that if the lessee during the first six years of the term hereby granted fences the land hereby demised and makes on such land within the times limited in that behalf the improvements of the nature and value and in the manner expressed in the covenants and conditions hereinbefore contained and proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works (to be certified under its seal) by such evidence as the said Board may require that he has complied with the said covenants and conditions and with all other covenants and conditions of these presents the lessee or the lessee's representatives at any time after the expiration of the first six years of the term hereby granted and upon the payment of the last sum due on account of the rent reserved and upon the payment of the difference between the amount of the rent actually paid and the sum of

or such other sum (if any) not being less than one-eighth part greater than the sum of as may be fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 296 of the *Land Act 1915* for each acre or fractional part of an acre in the land hereby demised shall be entitled to a grant in fee of such land and every such grant shall be subject to such covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct.

16. When the lessee is unable at the end of any half-year to pay his rent the Board of Land and Works may if the lessee has complied with the covenants and conditions of this lease suspend the payment of such amount of rent as will not exceed sixty per centum of the value of the improvements effected on the land hereby demised over and above any encumbrance thereon and allow the lessee to pay the arrears of rent and interest thereon (if any) in one amount or spread over a definite time and may extend this lease for a corresponding time.

17. In the case of the insolvency or death of the lessee during the first six years of the term hereby granted it shall be lawful for the assignee or trustee in insolvency within twelve months from the date of the insolvency or for the executors or administrators of the lessee at any time to assign such lease to any person who is qualified to become a lessee of the allotment hereby demised and such person shall thereupon be with respect to this lease in the same position as though he or she had been the original lessee.

18. It is an express condition of these presents that the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works may at any time during the term hereby granted enter upon the whole or any portion of the land hereby demised for the purpose of resuming the whole or any part of the same from time to time required for reserves for public purposes roads railways canals or for mining purposes. Any moneys which may have been paid by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns to His Majesty his heirs or successors in respect of the lands so

resumed or expended by him or them thereupon shall be repaid to him or them together with such other moneys as compensation for such resumption as to the Governor in Council seems fit and the lessee his executors administrators and assigns shall be entitled to a reduction *pro rata* of all future rent herein reserved in respect of land so resumed after the first six years of the term hereby granted. This condition shall be construed as independent of and concurrent with the powers conferred by the 168th section of the *Land Act 1915* and of the powers conferred by the next following clause.

19. The lessee covenants and agrees in the event of the whole or any portion of the land hereby leased being at any time or times during the first six years of the term hereby granted required by the Board of Land and Works or the Victorian Railways Commissioners or by any other person or persons or corporation for the time being by any law in force in Victoria authorized to make construct manage or maintain any State railway or railways for the construction maintenance or management of any railway or railways or railway stations or for obtaining earth stone timber gravel or sand or any other material or thing or for railway water supply purposes or other works matters or conveniences in connexion with any railway or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed maintained or managed or by the Governor for the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highways to be hereafter set out by the authority of the Governor the lessee or the executors administrators or assigns of the lessee will within one month upon receiving notice in writing from the Board of Land and Works the Victorian Railways Commissioners or other person or persons or corporation aforesaid or from a responsible Minister of the Crown authorized by Order in Council in that behalf that the land is so required relinquish possession of the land so required and all claim thereto provided that the lessee or the executors administrators or assigns of the lessee (as the case may be) shall for a period of one month after receipt by the lessee or by them of such notice be entitled to remove all buildings erections or fences upon the land so required but such right shall be forfeited if the same be not exercised and such buildings erections or fences removed within the time hereinbefore limited and that neither the lessee nor the lessee's executors administrators or assigns shall have or will make any claim for compensation whatsoever for the said buildings erections or fences or for any improvements or for any moneys expended upon the said land or for the cost which he or they may incur in such removal nor will the lessee or the lessee's executors administrators or assigns have or make any claim for compensation for any loss of frontage to or access from any road or roads in consequence of the construction of any such railway railway station or other works matters or conveniences. And the said Board of Land and Works Railways Commissioners or other person or persons or corporation aforesaid shall not be liable to construct any crossings or other accommodation works under or over or upon any railway that may be made through or adjacent to such land or any part thereof nor will the lessee or the lessee's executors administrators or assigns have or make any claim for compensation for any right or interest which the lessee or the lessee's executors administrators or assigns may possess in such land beyond a proportionate reduction in rent which shall in all cases be fixed by an officer appointed by the Governor in Council nor in respect of the severance from the other lands occupied by the lessee or by the lessee's executors administrators or assigns under these presents. And it is expressly agreed between the parties hereto that this agreement is to be construed as a release by the lessee the lessee's executors administrators and assigns to His Majesty his heirs and successors from all or any payment to them or any of them and from all claims thereto which might otherwise have been made in respect of resumption of any portion of the land hereby demised for any railway or railway station or railway water supply purposes or other works matters or conveniences or for the purposes of the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races watercourses or drains or for public roads or highways under the before contained conditions for resumption by or on behalf of His Majesty's his heirs and successors.

20. In case possession of any part or parts of the land hereby demised be resumed or taken under any of the provisions hereinbefore contained or be surrendered the terms agreements covenants and conditions herein contained with reference to the whole shall continue in force and apply to such part or parts as may be left in the possession of the lessee or the lessee's executors administrators or assigns.

21. Except as herein otherwise expressly provided the word "lessee" shall include the lessee's executors administrators transferees and assigns or any person or persons in whom this lease may under the provisions of the *Land Act 1915* become vested and in these presents the term "Governor" shall mean the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the State of Victoria unless such meaning shall be inconsistent with the context.

In witness whereof His Excellency Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, hath on behalf of His Majesty the King caused this Indenture to be sealed with the seal of the said State and the lessee has hereunto set his hand and seal.

REGULATION RESCINDED, REGULATION
SUBSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by the *Education Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XXXIV., Higher Elementary Schools, of the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, and doth order that the Regulation following XXXIV(A), Higher Elementary Schools, be substituted therefor:—

REGULATION XXXIV(A), HIGHER ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.

Clause I.—Higher elementary schools providing a course of instruction up to the standard of the school intermediate examination may be established by the Minister.

Clause II.—Before proclaiming a higher elementary school the following conditions must be complied with:—

- (a) At least 50 pupils shall furnish a written undertaking to complete the full course provided at the school, and of these not less than 20 must hold the merit certificate or an approved equivalent qualification;
- (b) An area of land which in the opinion of the Minister is sufficient and suitable as a site for a higher elementary school must be provided and the title vested in the Minister. This area should be about 8 acres.
- (c) A local contribution of a sum of money approved by the Minister must be guaranteed.

Clause III.—The qualification for admission of pupils to the higher elementary courses shall be the qualifying certificate or approved equivalent.

Clause IV.—Instruction in higher elementary schools will be free and shall cover a period of four years from the standard of the qualifying certificate up to the standard of the school intermediate examination. This course of study is intended for pupils of from 12 to 15 years of age.

Clause V.—No pupils shall be enrolled after the expiry of the first quarter of the school year unless with the special sanction of the Director. Pupils may, however, be transferred from one higher elementary school to another, or from a high school to a higher elementary school, under the same conditions as regards transfer notes as are provided in the case of pupils in elementary schools.

Clause VI.—During the first and second years the course of study shall be as set out in clause 9(A) below. During the third and fourth years one or more of the courses set out in clause 9(B) below shall be taken or other courses specially approved by the Director. The details of subjects of the course of study shall be as from time to time prescribed by the Director and announced in the *Education Gazette* and *Teachers' Aid*.

Clause VII.—Unless otherwise approved by the Director, there may be provided in higher elementary schools during the first two years—

- (A) An industrial course leading to technical and trade pursuits.
- (B) A common course for pupils intending to remain at school for four years.

Unless otherwise approved by the Director, the subjects forming the courses of study shall be:—

(A.)

INDUSTRIAL COURSE.

First and Second Years.

- (1) English language and literature.
- (2) History and civics.
- (3) Geography.
- (4) Mathematics.
- (5) Elementary science.
- (6) Drawing and modelling.
- (7) Manual work.
- (8) Physical training.
- (9) Class singing.

An extended course of instruction in the above-named subjects will be provided for pupils taking a third year of the industrial course.

(B.)

COMMON COURSE.

First and Second Years.

- (1) English language and literature.
- (2) (Optional) A second language—(a) Latin, (b) French, or (c) German.
- (3) Mathematics.
- (4) History and civics.
- (5) Geography (including simple field work).
- (6) Elementary science.
- (7) Drawing.
- (8) Manual work—(a) woodwork, or (b) metalwork, or (c) modelling, or (d) agriculture, or (for girls) (e) needlework, and (f) cookery.
- (9) Physical training and hygiene, swimming (where practicable), organized games.
- (10) Class singing.

At the beginning of the third year, the course of study for the first two years as set in (A) and (B) above will be developed into special courses, each extending over two years, and leading to the teaching profession, to employment in the Public Service, to domestic arts, to commercial, agricultural, and higher technical pursuits. These courses may include one or more of the following or other approved courses:—

- (C) Preparatory professional (secondary) course.
- (D) Commercial course.
- (E) Domestic arts course.
- (F) Agricultural course.

Course (G)—Preparatory Professional (Secondary) Course.

- (1) English language and literature.
- (2) A second language (French, German, or Latin).
- (3) Mathematics—(a) arithmetic, (b) algebra, (c) geometry, (d) trigonometry (fourth year only).
- (4) Elementary science—Two of the following subjects to be taken—(a) physics, (b) chemistry, (c) physiology, (d) botany, (e) geography and geology, (f) nature study (for teacher students only).
- (5) History and civics.
- (6) Drawing.
- (7) Manual work—needlework, woodwork, modelling, agriculture.
- (8) Physical training and first-aid.
- (9) Class singing.

Course (D)—Commercial Course.

- (1) English language and literature.
- (2) Commercial correspondence, *précis* and handwriting.
- (3) Mathematics, including arithmetic, algebra, and geometry.
- (4) Commercial history.
- (5) Commercial geography.
- (6) Shorthand, or French, or German.
- (7) Elementary bookkeeping.
- (8) Typewriting (fourth year only).
- (9) Office routine and business methods (fourth year only).
- (10) Physical training and first-aid.

Course (E)—Domestic Arts.

- (1) English language and literature.
 - (2) History and civics.
 - (3) Household management and household accounts.
 - (4) Elementary experimental science applied to household work.
 - (5) Physiology.
 - (6) Sanitation and applied hygiene.
 - (7) Cookery and laundry work.
 - (8) Drawing, design, and art work.
 - (9) Needlework, dressmaking, and millinery.
 - (10) Physical training.
 - (11) Class singing.
- (A second language may be provided as an optional subject).

Course (F)—Agricultural Course.

- (1) English language and literature.
- (2) Practical mathematics for farm students.
- (3) History and civics.
- (4) Geography and physiography.
- (5) Drawing.
- (6) Manual work—(a) farm carpentry, (b) forge work, where practicable.
- (7) Science, including a treatment of elementary physics, elementary chemistry, nature-study (plants and animals) in its relation to agricultural pursuits.
- (8) Agriculture—(a) principles, (b) practical work on the school farm.
- (9) Physical training and first-aid.

Clause VIII.—In any higher elementary school the Minister may appoint to the staff of such school such additional teachers in excess of the staff allotted to the school under Regulation V., as the Director may certify are required to perform efficiently the work in such higher elementary school. The additional staff will be in accordance with the following schedule:—

50 to 75	3 assistants
75 to 100	4 assistants
100 to 125	5 assistants
and so on.			

Clause IX.—In all higher elementary schools the staff assigned for higher elementary work and for the work of the elementary section of the school shall be under the one head teacher, and the staff shall be common to the whole institution and used in any part of the school as may be required by the head teacher.

Clause X.—Head teachers in higher elementary schools are required to keep such records, furnish such reports, and adopt such general organization and procedure as may from time to time be directed.

And the Honorable W. Hutchinson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATION AMENDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of February, 1920.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the Education Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulation made on the third day of February, 1920, by adding thereto the following Regulation:—

REGULATION XXXIV(B), CENTRAL SCHOOLS AND HIGHER ELEMENTARY CLASSES.

Clause I.—Where, in the opinion of the Minister, it is desirable to provide for pupils of the upper grades in elementary schools a different form of instruction from that prescribed in Regulation I., central schools or higher elementary classes may be established.

Clause II.—Candidates for enrolment in such schools or classes must be qualified for admission to Grade VII. of the elementary school.

Clause III.—The course of study prescribed in such schools shall cover a period of two years, and may include one or more of the following courses:—

- (a) A preparatory secondary course.
- (b) A preparatory trade course.
- (c) A preparatory commercial course.
- (d) A preparatory domestic arts course.

Clause IV.—In town centres where there are not fewer than 100 qualified pupils desirous of admission an elementary school conveniently situated in respect of other elementary schools may be proclaimed as a central school for providing one but not more than two of the courses set out in Clause III. above.

Clause V.—Higher elementary classes may be established in suitable country centres for instruction in any one or more of the courses mentioned in Clause III. above as approved by the Director provided that such classes shall not be established unless there are at least 20 pupils qualified for admission to each course, and unless also the conditions prescribed from time to time for the establishment of such schools shall be complied with.

Clause VI.—In central schools and higher elementary classes the Minister may appoint to the staff of such schools such additional teachers in excess of Regulation V. as the Director may certify are required to perform efficiently the work in such schools and classes. Any member of the total staff of the school may be required to teach in any part of the whole school as directed by the head teacher. The additional staffing provided will be on the basis of one assistant for each 25 children in attendance at the classes.

The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for racing, cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusement, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding one shilling, may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the Committee of Management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person, except the labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

To the Court of Disputed Returns—

The petition of John Kean, of 95 Peel-street north, Ballarat East, in the State of Victoria, secretary, respectfully sheweth—

1. That your petitioner is a person who was duly qualified to vote at the election on the thirteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, for the Electoral Division of Ballarat for the House of Representatives for the Commonwealth of Australia.
2. That at such election David Charles McGrath and Edwin Thomas John Kerby were candidates.
3. That on the 5th day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, the said Edwin Thomas John Kerby was declared by the Divisional Returning Officer duly elected for the said Electoral Division.
4. That the said Divisional Returning Officer so declared that the said David Charles McGrath received 13,568 votes and the said Edwin Thomas John Kerby received 13,569 votes, and that there were 202 informal ballot papers.
5. That several persons who were qualified to vote at such election were not permitted to vote thereat.
6. That several persons who were not qualified to vote at such election were permitted to vote thereat.
7. That ballot-papers were improperly rejected by the Returning and Presiding Officers.
8. That ballot-papers which were informal were improperly admitted and counted by such Returning and Presiding Officers.
9. That persons who improperly influenced voters were allowed by Presiding Officers in the Polling Booth.
10. That several persons who were entitled to vote as absent voters were not permitted so to vote, and therefore did not vote at such election.
11. That several absent voters' ballot-papers were wrongly and improperly rejected in the scrutiny at such election.
12. That several ballot-papers were wrongly and improperly admitted in such scrutiny as absent voters' ballot-papers.
13. That several persons who were entitled to vote as absent voters applied for ballot-papers but were wrongly and improperly issued ballot-papers for the election for the House of Representatives for some Electoral Division other than the Electoral Division of Ballarat, and consequently were prevented from voting for the Electoral Division of Ballarat at the election of the House of Representatives.
14. That several persons who sought to vote at such election at polling places outside the Electoral Division of Ballarat were unable so to vote owing to no absent voters' ballot-papers being available at such polling place, and therefore did not vote at such election.
15. That several postal ballot-papers were wrongly and improperly admitted as votes in the scrutiny at such election.
16. That several postal ballot-papers were wrongly and improperly rejected in such scrutiny.
17. That several postal ballot-papers, having been duly posted, were not received by the Divisional Returning Officer, and were therefore not counted as votes at such election.
18. That several postal ballot-papers entrusted by voters to authorized witnesses for the purpose of postage or delivery to the Divisional Returning Officer were not so posted or delivered, and were therefore not counted as votes at such election.
19. That several persons who were qualified to vote under section 121 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act were not permitted so to vote, and therefore did not vote at such election.

28. That your petitioner disputes the validity of the return of the said Edwin Thomas John Kerby, or, alternatively, disputes the validity of such election on the facts set out in this petition.
