#### DETERMINATION OF THE JEWELLERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 19th March, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Schastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturing jeweller," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 19th March, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(3)</sup> OVERTIME.--Any employee who works in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

<sup>(4)</sup> Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day: but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
