*Public Service Act 1915 and Lunacy Act 1915.***REGULATIONS.—LUNACY DEPARTMENT.**

THE Inspector-General of the Insane, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Act No. 2713, and the Lunacy Act No. 2687, hereby repeals the Regulations heretofore made under such Acts, and makes the following Regulations to take effect from the 1st July, 1919:—

In these Regulations "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of the Insane appointed under the Lunacy Act No. 2687.

The Regulations are divided into the following Chapters, viz.:—

Chapter II.—General Division, Appointment to the.
Chapter III.—General Division, Classification of.

**CHAPTER II.—APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION IN THE
GENERAL DIVISION.**

(Act No. 2713, Section 71 (v), (vi), and (vii), and Act No. 2687, Section 13.)

Registration and Examination of Applicants.

1. Every applicant (except for the position of Messenger) must at the date of his application be between the ages of twenty-one and forty-one years, and must forward to the office of the Inspector-General of the Insane an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address, the date and place of birth, and the particular appointment or class of appointment which he desires to obtain. He must also send in a certificate of good moral character and industry, as well as a certificate of suitability for employment from either the Inspector-General of the Insane or the Medical Superintendent of one of the Hospitals.

Nurses should be approximately 5 ft. 3 in. in height, and Attendants 5 ft. 8 in., with correspondingly good physical development, and in their form of application they should state what their previous occupation or work has been.

Applicants for the positions of Messenger must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty: Messengers will not be retained after they have reached the age of twenty-one years.

2. Every applicant to be recorded for appointment to any office requiring the exercise of skill usually acquired in some mechanical trade or other occupation must satisfy the Inspector-General, by the production of certificates or otherwise, that he possesses the handicraft and experience necessary for the work of the office.

3. On the production of these certificates applicants may have their names entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment," and will be nominated as vacancies occur. Prior to nomination, however, it will be necessary for applicants to furnish a certificate of good physical health.

4. New appointments, all things being equal, will be made from among those persons whose names are entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment" according to priority of registration for vacant offices, combined with fitness in each case for the particular office to be filled, and the Educational Test Examination having been passed; but the Inspector-General may nominate any applicant who has special qualifications without regard to his position on the Register.

5. If any person decline to accept an appointment which is offered to him, his name will thereupon be removed from the Register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the Register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Inspector-General respecting his nomination to the Lunacy Department addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Inspector-General.

6. No name of any person shall remain on the Register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one years, or for a longer period than two years from date of registration, except in the case of applicants who, subsequent to registration, joined the Australian Expeditionary Forces.

7. Any person appointed under these Regulations will be on probation for twelve months, and the Attendants will be required prior to their probationary appointment to pass an examination which will prove the sufficiency of their education.

The subjects of examination shall be those specified hereunder:—

(a) Handwriting: to be tested by copying out at least 200 words from a passage of simple English.

(b) Spelling: to be tested by writing from dictation an extract from a newspaper—not less than 100 words.

(c) Arithmetic: first four rules, simple and money.

Applicants who have passed any examination for candidates for appointment in the Public Service of Victoria, or any like examination, will be exempted from this examination. Persons appointed to positions in the General Division other than those of Attendants will not be required to pass the Educational Examination, i.e., Hospital Trained Nurses, Nurses, Artisans, and Servants.

First Departmental Examination.

8. Attendants and Nurses appointed under these Regulations must qualify themselves for retention on the staff of the Lunacy Department and for subsequent increments to their salaries by attending the necessary courses of lectures in Elementary Anatomy and Physiology, First Aid to the Injured, and General Duties.

Failure of an Attendant or Nurse to pass the Departmental Examinations within the times specified will be considered to be evidence of incapacity to discharge the duties of his or her office; and the retention of Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing these examinations. No Attendant or Nurse will be retained on the staff of the Lunacy Department unless he or she has passed the First Departmental Examination.

9. The First Departmental Examination cannot be undertaken before the Attendant or Nurse has been in the service of the Lunacy Department for a period of one year. In the event of a failure to pass at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of a second opportunity to pass the examination being given.

Second Departmental Examination.

10. The Second Departmental Examination—in general nursing and duties—cannot be undertaken until after the end of the second year of service in the Lunacy Department, but the Attendants and Nurses must present themselves for this Examination before the end of the fourth year of service, dating from the time of appointment on probation. In the event of a failure to pass this second examination at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of other opportunities to pass the examination being given. In the event of a second failure to pass, however, the services of the unsuccessful candidate may be dispensed with.

11. The first increment will only be recommended to the Attendant or Nurse conditional on the First Departmental Examination having been passed, and if he or she is approved of by the Medical Superintendent and the Inspector-General, and on the production of a certificate of good conduct and diligence from the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital for the Insane where he or she is employed. The second increment will not be recommended until the Second Departmental Examination has been passed.

Third Departmental Examination.

12. The Third Departmental Examination in mental disorders, nursing and duties, together with elementary anatomy and physiology of brain and nervous system, can only be undertaken after the third year of service and one year after the passing of the Second Examination. On the passing of this examination a certificate will be given to the successful examinee setting forth that he or she is a Trained Mental Attendant or Nurse. In the event of failure other opportunities will be given to pass on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent. This Examination will qualify Attendants and Nurses for promotion to the Second Grade. Attendants and Nurses who passed the Second Nursing Examination provided by the previous Regulations will be eligible for promotion to the Second Grade without passing the Third Nursing Examination provided by these Regulations. Before being eligible for promotion to the position of Head Attendant or Hospital Attendant and Chief Nurse or Hospital Nurse they must pass the Third Examination.

13. In determining the claims of officers to promotion, consideration will be given in respect of merit to the following qualifications:—

- (a) Possession of the Departmental Nursing Certificate.
- (b) Ability and knowledge required to fulfil the duties of the superior office, and the possession of the necessary tact and judgment.
- (c) Industrious habits and careful performance of work.
- (d) Good conduct, regular attendance, and prompt and cheerful service on urgent occasions.
- (e) Mental vigour and sound bodily health.
- (f) Performance of valuable services of a special nature.

14. For promotion to the First Grade selection will be made from among those Attendants and Nurses who have passed into the Second Grade, and who have, by reason of their special fitness for the work, as well as by their good conduct and industry, proved themselves capable of taking charge of a large and important ward.

15. Except in a case in which the Inspector-General shall certify that some particular office in the Lunacy Department should be filled by a Hospital Trained Nurse, the person to fill the position of Hospital Attendant or Hospital Nurse may be selected from among the Attendants and Nurses who have demonstrated their capacity for the special work required of them.

16. Officers appointed to any position in the Lunacy Department shall not, until they shall have served for a period of 5 years on the staff of the Department, be transferred to any other Department or Branch unless such transfer is determined to be in the interests of the Public Service.

Board of Examiners.

17. All Departmental Examinations will be conducted by a Board of Examiners, which will consist of the Inspector-General or a Deputy appointed by the Inspector-General, and one or two Medical Superintendents or Deputy Superintendents as may be considered necessary appointed by the Inspector-General.

18. The subjects for the Departmental Examinations shall be those set forth in the syllabus of lectures adopted from time to time and issued to each Hospital for the Insane, the text-book being as prescribed from time to time.

19. The employees at the Idiot Asylum and the Reception House so far as is practicable will be subject to the same rules as the employees in the Hospitals for the Insane.

20. In accordance with the exigencies of the Department, and in order to facilitate the better training of Attendants and Nurses, the Inspector-General may transfer an Attendant or Nurse from one Hospital to another, or from the female side to the male side of the same Hospital where the nursing of male patients is undertaken by female Nurses.

21. All probationers and persons appointed on the staff of the Lunacy Department will be required to sign the agreement hereunder at the time of entry on duty.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

I hereby acknowledge to have received and read a copy of rules and instructions appended hereto and marked A and B which are now in force for the guidance of in the Lunacy Department. I fully understand that during my connexion with this Department and in consideration of being employed, I am obliged to obey and carry out these rules and instructions, and all other rules, instructions and orders which may be in force during my employment within the Hospital for the Insane in which I must be careful of the property of the Government of Victoria and must promote so far as I am able the interests and objects of any such Hospital, avoid gossiping about its inmates or affairs, and endeavour generally by my own conduct and demeanour to sustain the reputation of the establishment. I further understand that I am liable to be called upon to perform any duty assigned to me, although not of a nature I usually perform, should I be required to do so by the Medical Superintendent or his representatives; that it is my duty if anything improper is done in my presence or to my knowledge in the Hospital wherein I may be employed, to report it to the Medical Superintendent; and I understand and agree that I am liable to be punished or have my services dispensed with or be dismissed for any transgression of any instruction, order or rule of the Hospital, or of any instruction, order or rule applying to; and further I understand the principles laid down in the Rules and Regulations for promotion by merit, good behaviour and suitability (and, for the Attendants and Nurses, that the possession of the Departmental Nursing certificates), are the only means by which I may expect promotion, and that any attempt to gain promotion by

other influences than these will be taken as an acknowledgment on my part of my unfitness for such promotion; further that one month's notice at least is required before an application to be allowed to leave the service of the Lunacy Department will be considered.

CHAPTER III.—CLASSIFICATION OF THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 2713, Section 71 (viii), and Act No. 2687, Section 13.)

1. In the case of appointments, promotions or transfers to any office in the General Division in the Lunacy Department, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay."

2. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the said Schedule every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.

3. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate, every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate within the minimum and maximum limits to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General of the Insane, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Department shall be paid at not more than the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any class or grade shall thereupon be deemed to be junior to any officer already in such class or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto he shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion. Officers who are transferred to the Attendants' or Nurses' staff from the Artisans' and Servants' staff, and who are in receipt of salaries at or above the maximum of the Third Grade, may be transferred to the Second Grade on the recommendation of the Inspector-General without regard to their seniority. They will, however, be required to pass the Educational and Departmental Examinations prior to being so transferred.

5. In the case of Attendants and Nurses, promotion from Grade to Grade may be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, and shall be regulated in accordance with the special regulations for Attendants and Nurses.

6. Increments may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the following Schedule, and at the rates set forth in the Schedule.

7. Where an officer previously to his transfer from one office to another has been paid the same salary as in his new office, time served in such former office may be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

8. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department and of the Inspector-General that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service.

9. If any officer is in receipt of pay greater than the maximum rate, he shall continue to receive such pay until he can be employed upon work equivalent to his salary.

10. Failure on the part of Attendants and Nurses to pass the Nursing Examinations will be taken as inefficient service, and, should the examinations not be passed, increments will not be granted.

11. If any officer be absent from duty on account of illness, no deduction shall be made from the salary of such officer on account of allowances if the officer is under medical treatment at his own home or at a general hospital. In the case of the single men and the members of the female staff, it shall be at the discretion of the Medical Superintendent as to whether the officers shall remain at the Hospital for the Insane for treatment or be allowed to leave the institution. When an officer on sick leave on full pay is drawing his allowances the full charge for these allowances as provided by these Regulations will be made. When the officer is on half pay only, half the charge will be made. No charge is to be made should an officer be allowed leave without pay.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 69.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any position specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in such public notice.

2. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be not less than the minimum, nor more than the maximum, age specified in the public notice for the particular grade.

3. The height of every candidate shall not be less than the minimum height prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

4. The wage of every successful candidate on appointment and thereafter shall, subject to the conditions specified in the public notice, be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation or Wages Board Determination relating to the particular trade or avocation in operation for the time being.

5. Every successful candidate for employment in the grade of Apprentice or Lad Labourer, who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary or wage, be granted an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses if so entitled by the Regulation in operation for the time being and the conditions specified in the public notice.

6. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the public notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

7. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age; but every such candidate who is selected will be required to take immediate steps to obtain an official Birth Certificate from the State or country in which he was born.

8. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and, if he has left such service, the cause of his leaving.

9. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for cause, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

10. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

11. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 17 to 28 inclusive of this Regulation.

12. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

13. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

14. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

15. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

16. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

17. Every such candidate, and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

18. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

19. Every such candidate shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass the educational examination prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

20. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, as well as certificates, indentures, or other satisfactory evidence that he possesses the requisite qualifications prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade, and shall furnish the names of any persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years; and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct from the Head of the particular Branch in which he is or may have been employed.

21. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

22. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby certify that on the* 19, we examined† for the position of _____ in the _____ Branch, and allotted him _____ marks, and accordingly certify that he is† for such employment.

} Examiners.

23. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c., shall be determined by a ballot conducted in the manner prescribed in Clause 25.

24. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the method prescribed in Clause 25 to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz.:—

25. Two ballot-boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

26. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade for which he is a candidate during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

27. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

28. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

29. Every Apprentice shall, immediately after appointment, attend, at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, or such other institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, the classes of instruction appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which, subject to the provisions of Clause 34, shall extend over a period of three years.

30. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution at his own expense, but the Commissioners will pay the fees of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution.

31. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

32. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the three-years' period of tuition at the Working Men's College, School of Mines, or other such Institution may be adjudged first and second in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in the public notice, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

33. The Apprentice who, at the end of the third year of tuition, is adjudged first in order of merit amongst all Apprentices eligible under the conditions specified in the public notice, shall be nominated as a student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners),

and afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, or other such Institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the fees of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid an annual salary in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

34. Any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, and shall attend such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners, and shall pay the fees imposed in respect of such classes, and any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is adjudged guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, or to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, will render himself liable to the immediate termination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

35. The term of tuition at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution at the expense of the Department shall in every instance be limited to three years, and any apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay the fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution.

36. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Work-shops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the five years exceed sixty-five working days in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the five years exceeding sixty-five working days in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the five years for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

Rate and Charge for Water Supplied.—Wedderburn Water Supply District.

THE Council of the Shire of Korong, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which occupiers and owners of land and tenements within the township of Wedderburn shall pay for the year ending the 30th September, 1920:—

- On every house and tenement whether occupied or not a rate of One shilling in the pound on the municipal annual valuation for the year ending the 30th September, 1919, with a minimum of One pound.
- Occupied or unoccupied allotments where no water is supplied, the sum of Five shillings per allotment, or five per cent. of the municipal annual valuation, whichever sum is greater.
- For water supplied by measure the sum of One shilling per thousand gallons in addition to the rates in (a) and (b) above.
- For water supplied to hotels and other tenements having stables the sum of Five shillings per stall per annum in addition to the rates and charges in (a), (b), and (c) hereof.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the 1st day of March, 1920, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

Rate and Charge for Water Supplied.—Korong Vale Water Supply District.

THE Council of the shire of Korong, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which owners or occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year ending the 30th September, 1920.

- On every house and tenement whether occupied or not a rate of One shilling in the pound on the municipal annual valuation for the year ending the 30th September, 1919, with a minimum of One pound.

- (b) Occupied or unoccupied allotments where no water is supplied the sum of Five shillings per allotment or five per cent. of the municipal annual valuation whichever sum is greater.

- (c) For water supplied by measure the sum of Two shillings per thousand gallons, with an allowance free equal in amount to the rate paid on each house, allotment or tenement, reckoned at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons. The said free allowance to apply only to the year in which the rate is made.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the first day of March, 1920, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, in the Waterworks District of Sunbury, which has been proclaimed an Urban District under the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1920 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, and also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being on all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty-five shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied, and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be forty thousand gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of two hundred gallons or under the sum of One shilling, and for each load in excess of two hundred gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of April, 1920, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land surveying, for the period of , viz., from to , or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of years (of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act* 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

REGULATIONS.

TOWN OF LARA.

Reserve for Cricket, &c.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of a Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Lara.

WE, the President and Members of the Council of the Shire of Corio, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 24th August, 1880, as a site for cricket and other purposes of public recreation in the town of Lara, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 191 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches; fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
